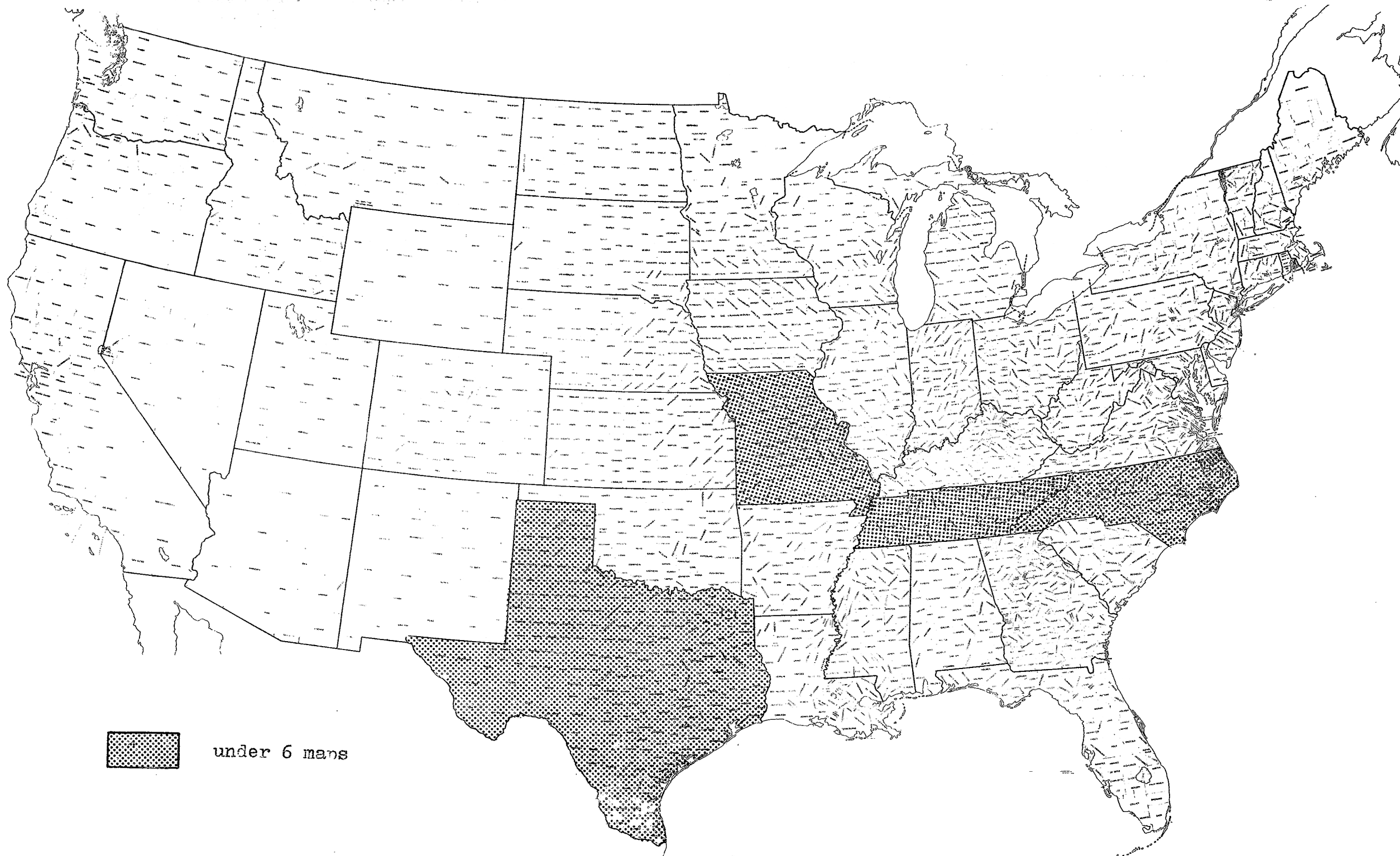

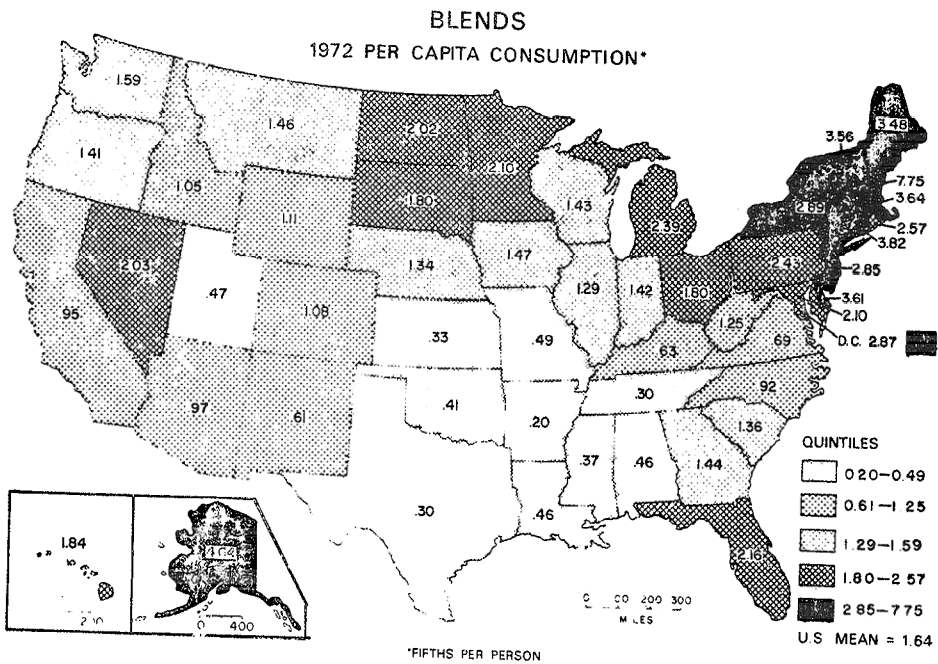

We provide a more detailed coverage of Tennessee moonshine and Missouri tavern culture. It is apparent that the corn liquor centers considerably augment legal bourbon consumption, particularly in Alabama and Georgia.

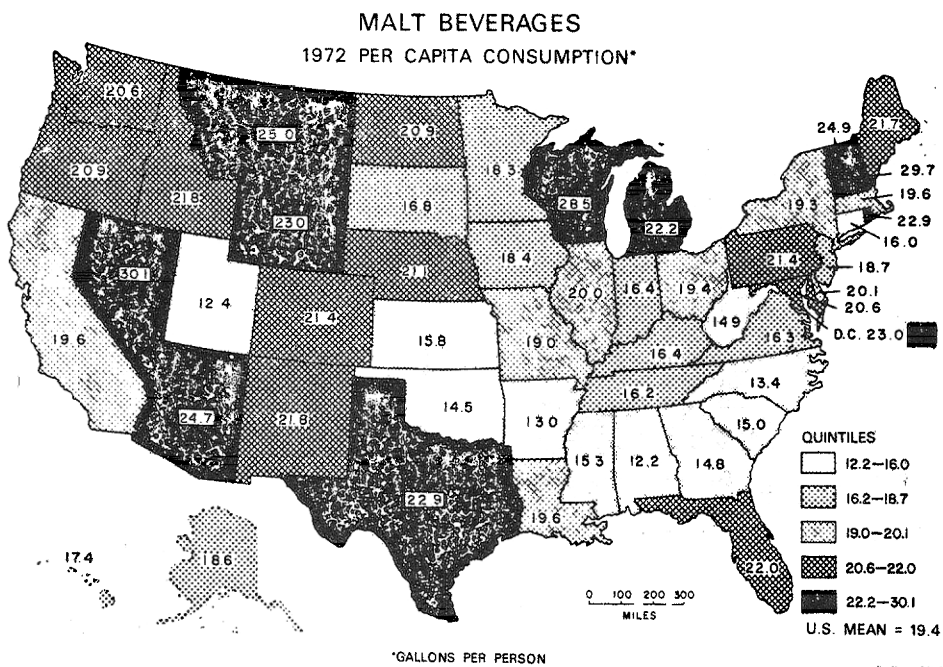
Maps on hunger and geophagy round out our meager foodways menu.

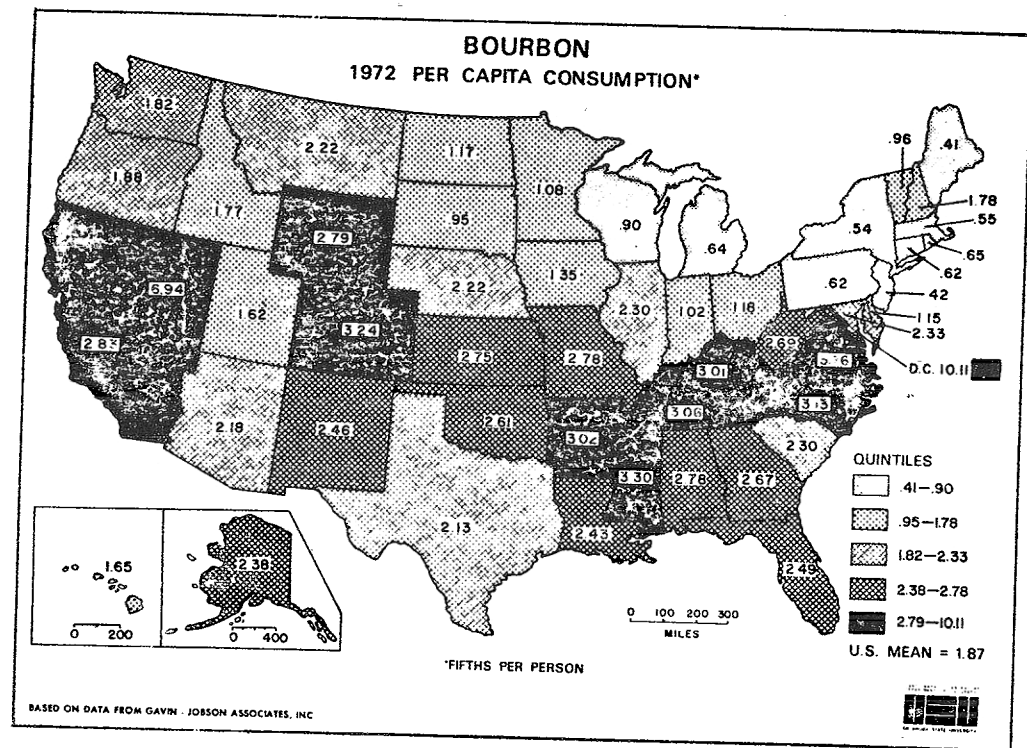

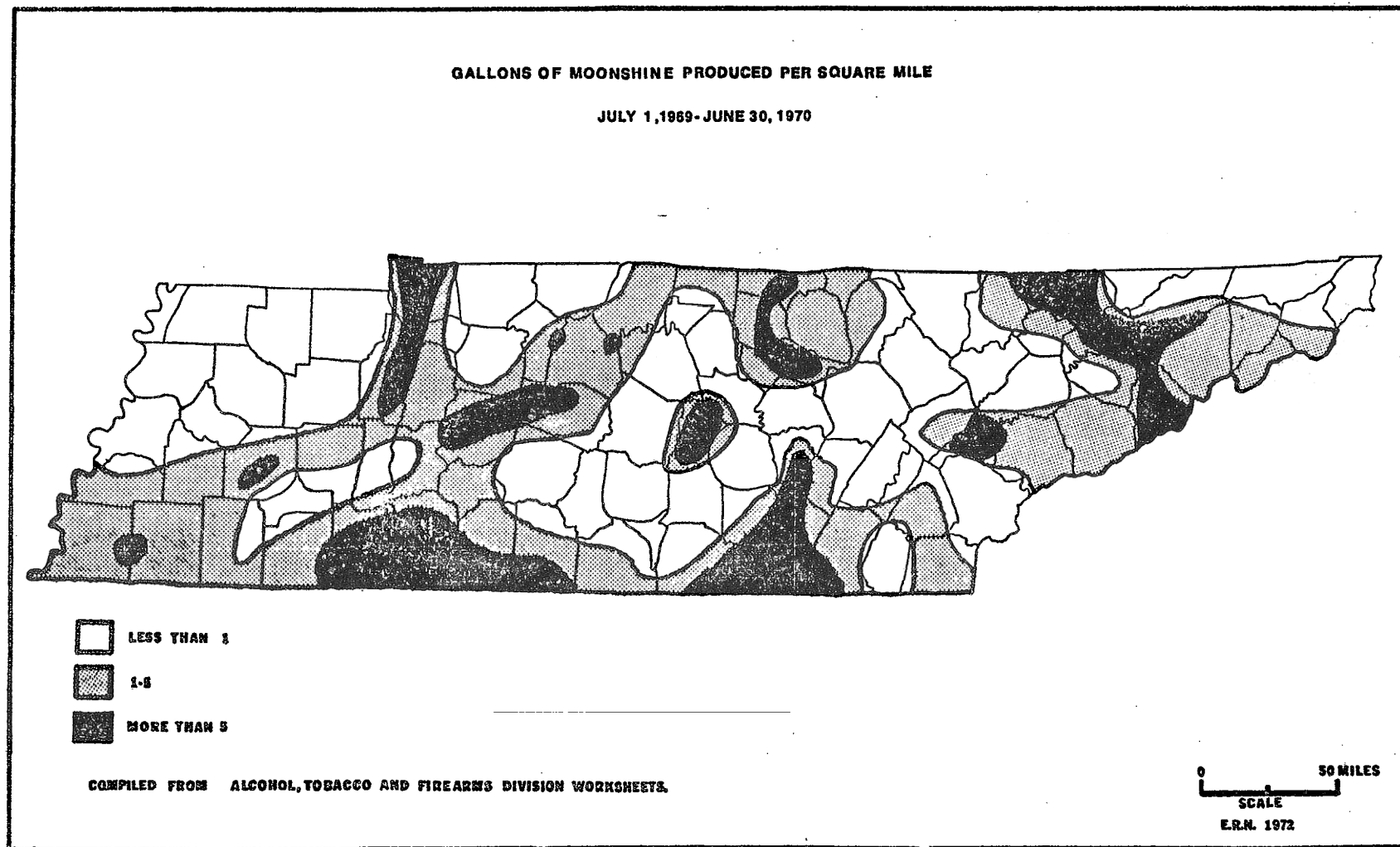


Figure 28. Gallons of moonshine produced per square mile, July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970.

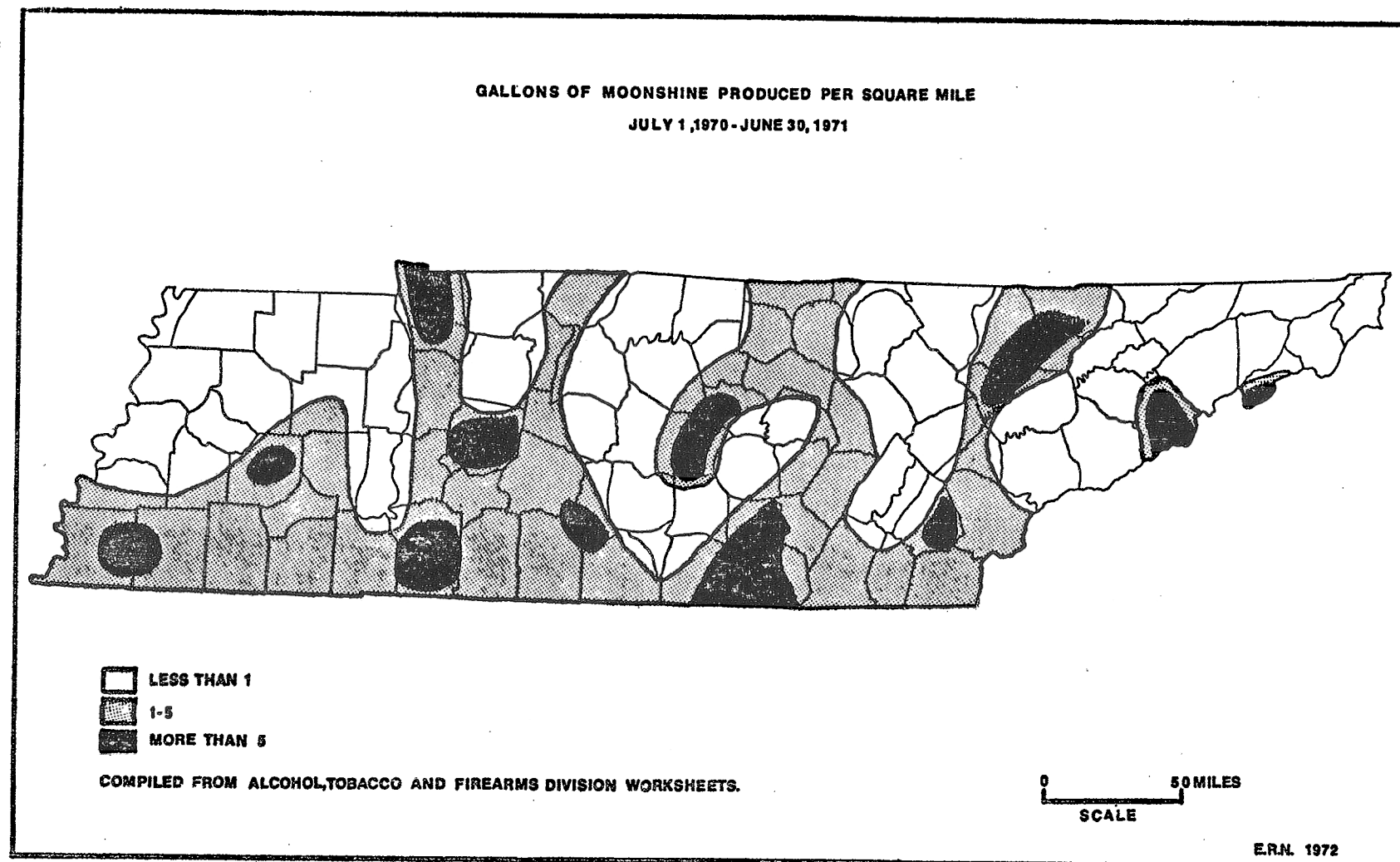


Figure 29. Gallons of moonshine produced per square mile, July 1, 1970 to June 30, 1971.

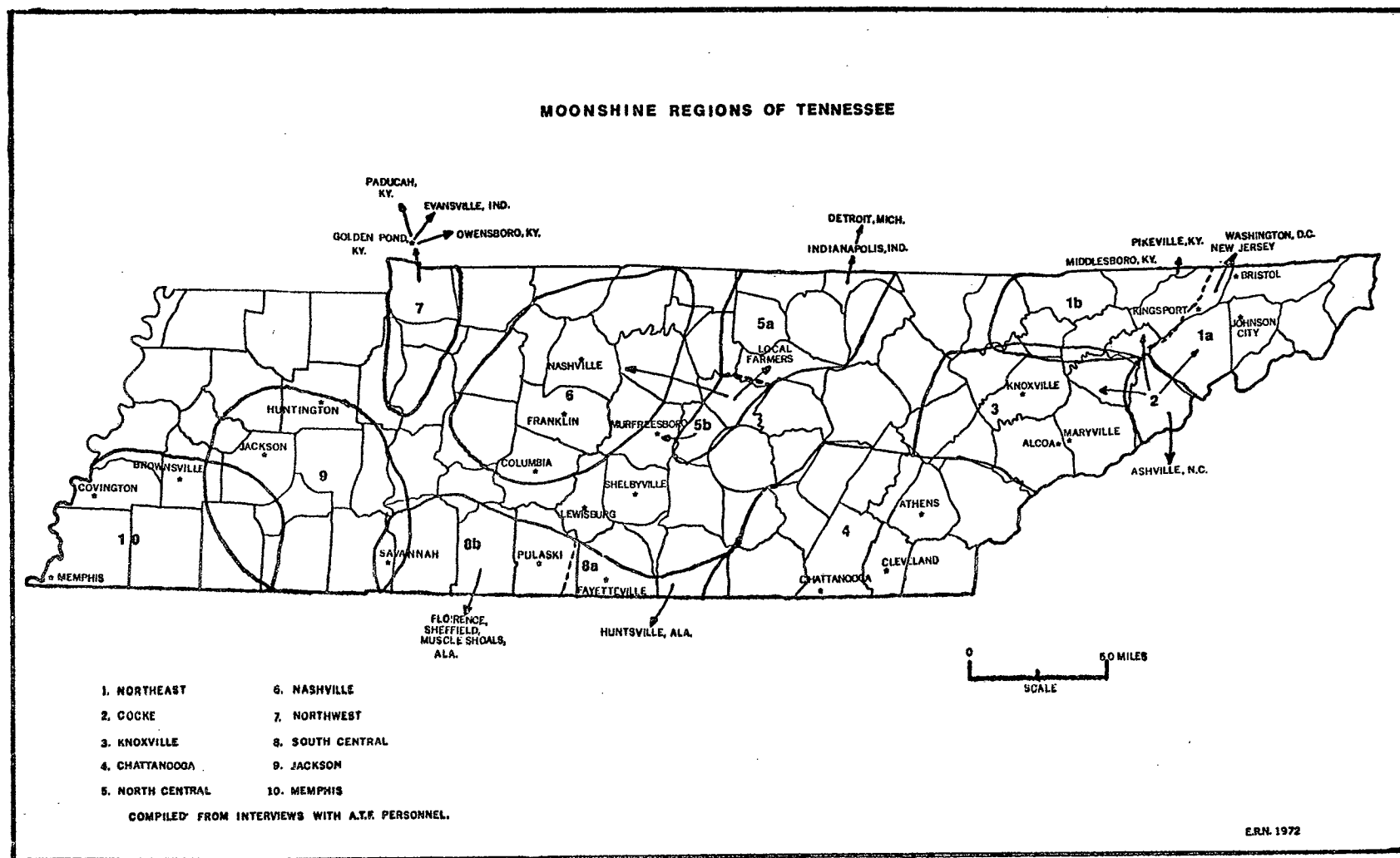


Figure 27. Moonshine regions of Tennessee.

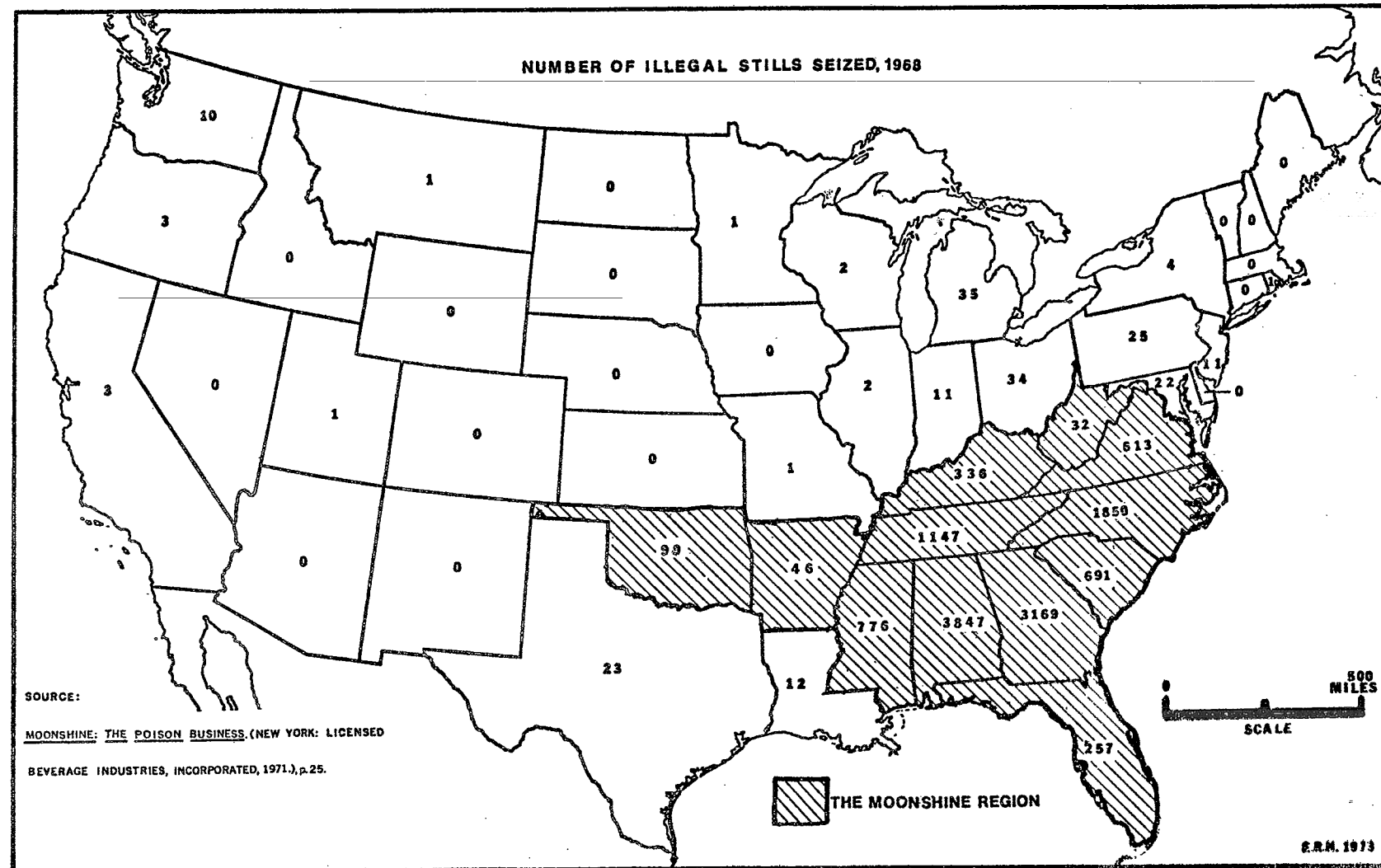


Figure 1. Number of illegal stills seized, 1968.

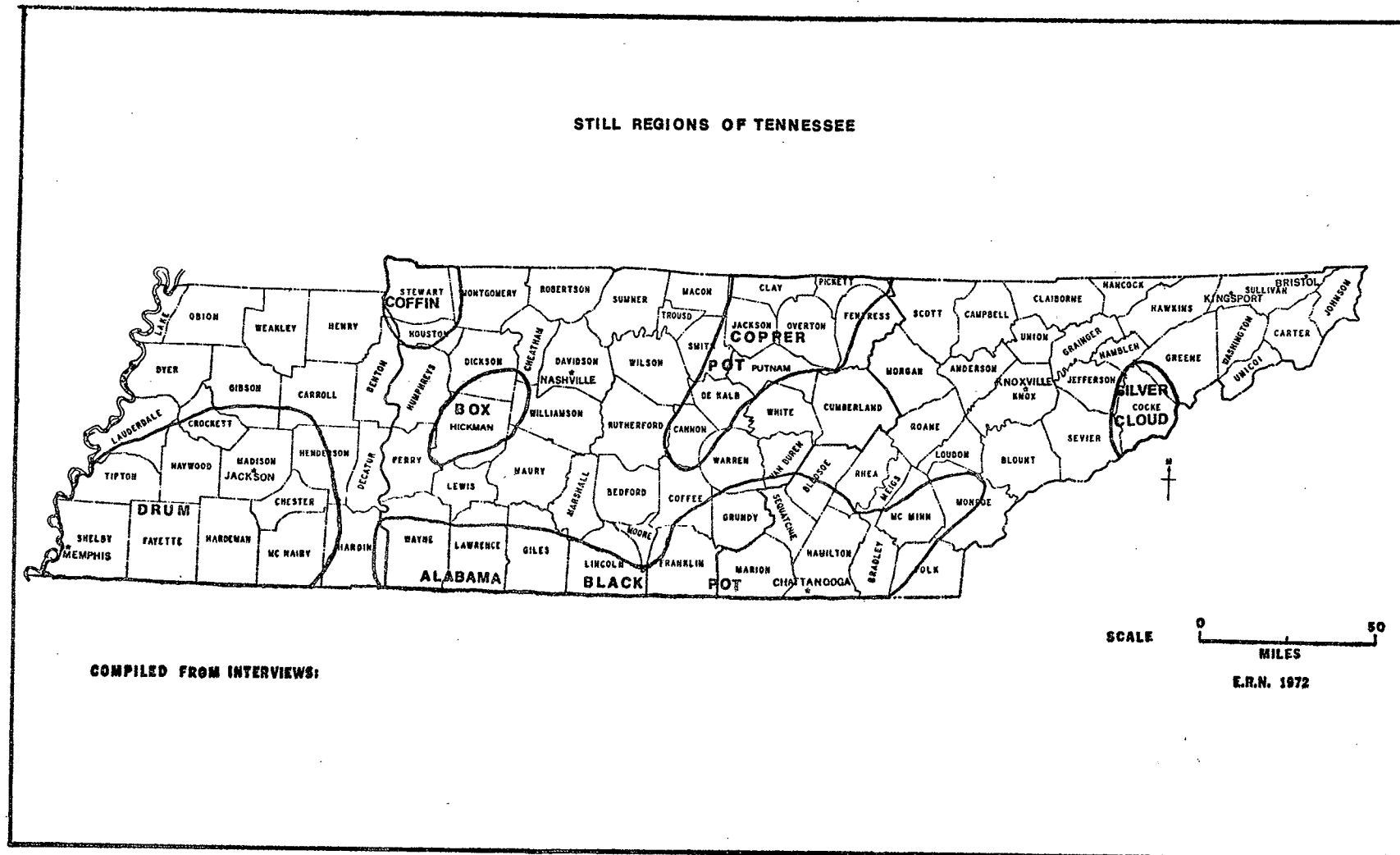


Figure 11. Still regions of Tennessee.

TYPICAL MOONSHINE DISTILLERY SITE

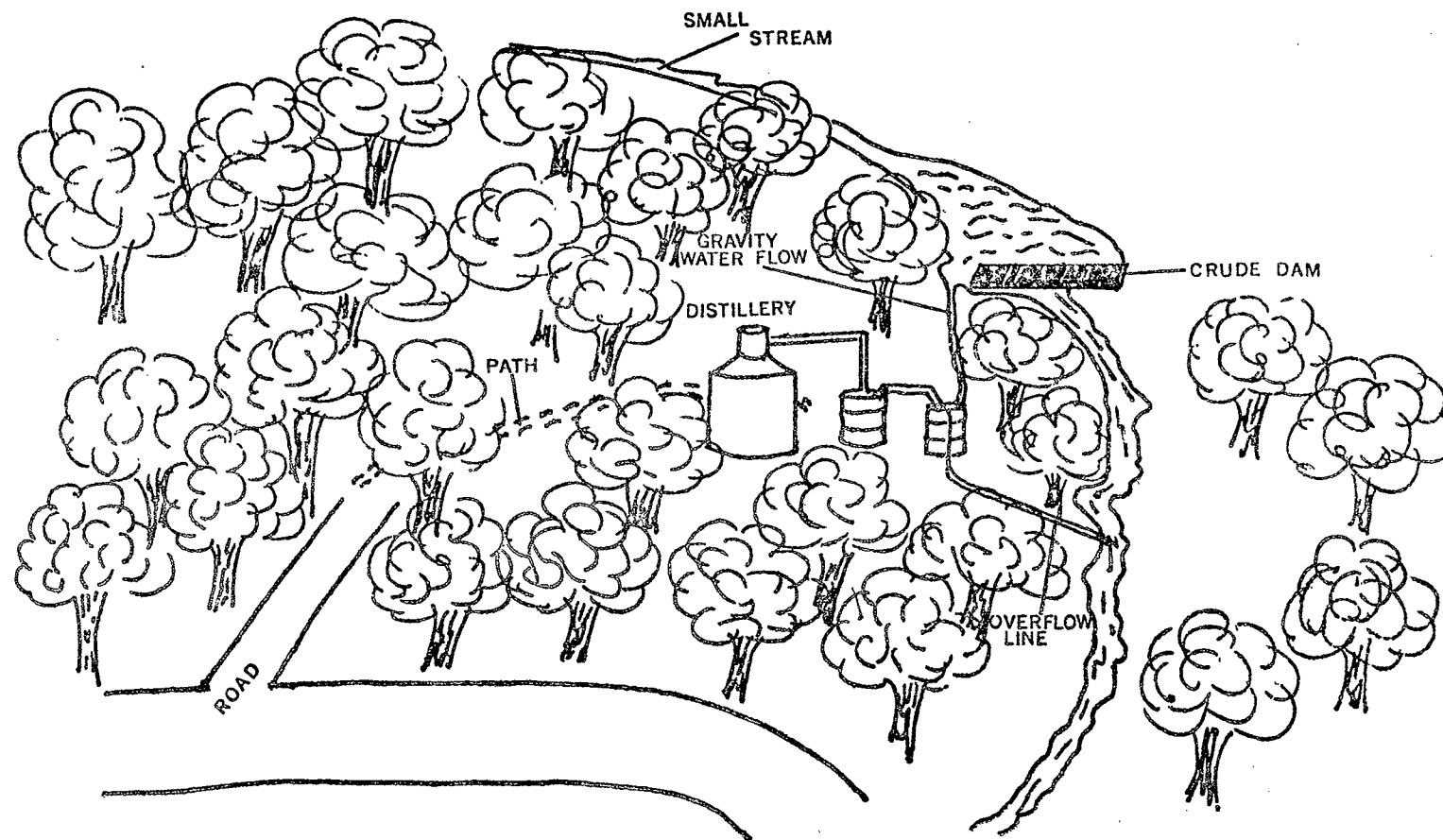


Figure 4. Typical moonshine distillery site.

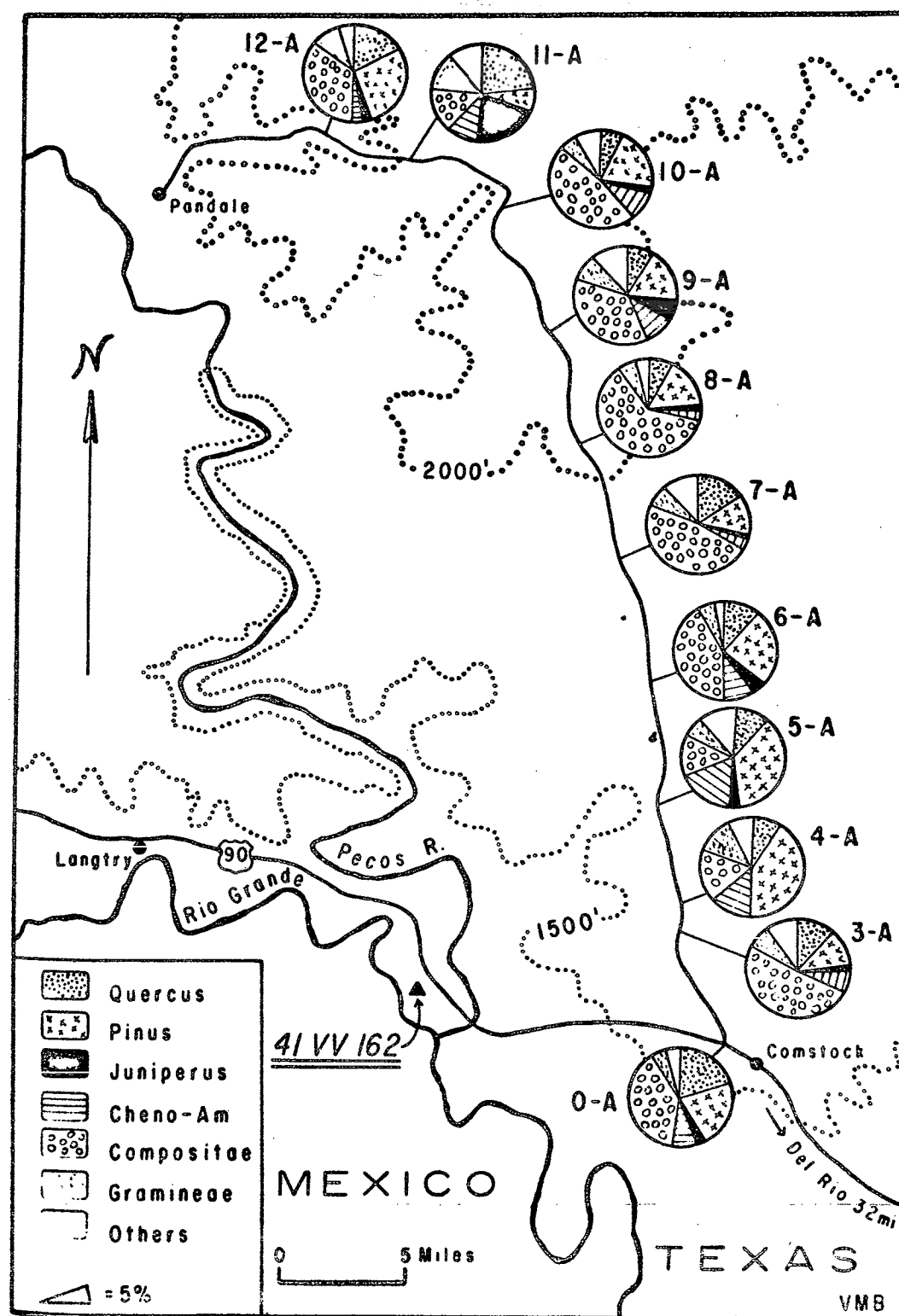


Fig. 1. Site location and diagram of modern pollen rain in the vicinity of site 41 VV 162.

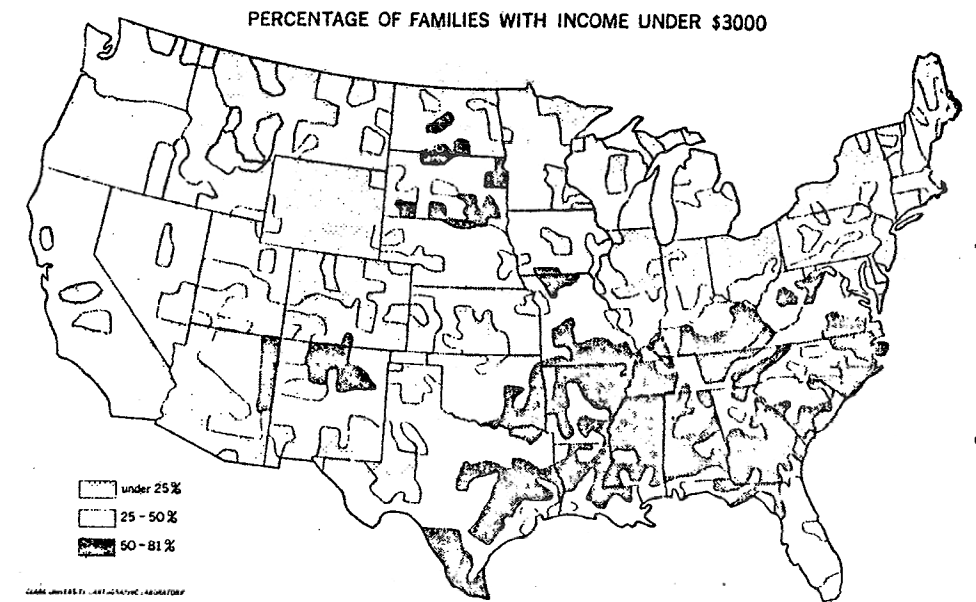


Figure 1. Percentage of families with incomes below approximate poverty income, 1960. Source: Bureau of the Census, Families with Incomes under \$3,000 in 1959 (map).

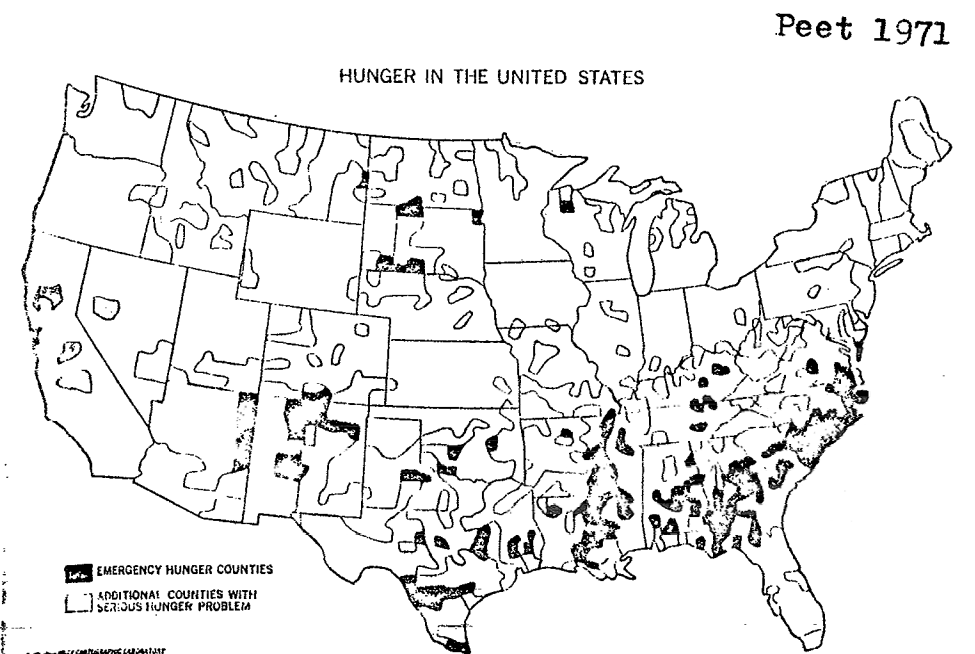
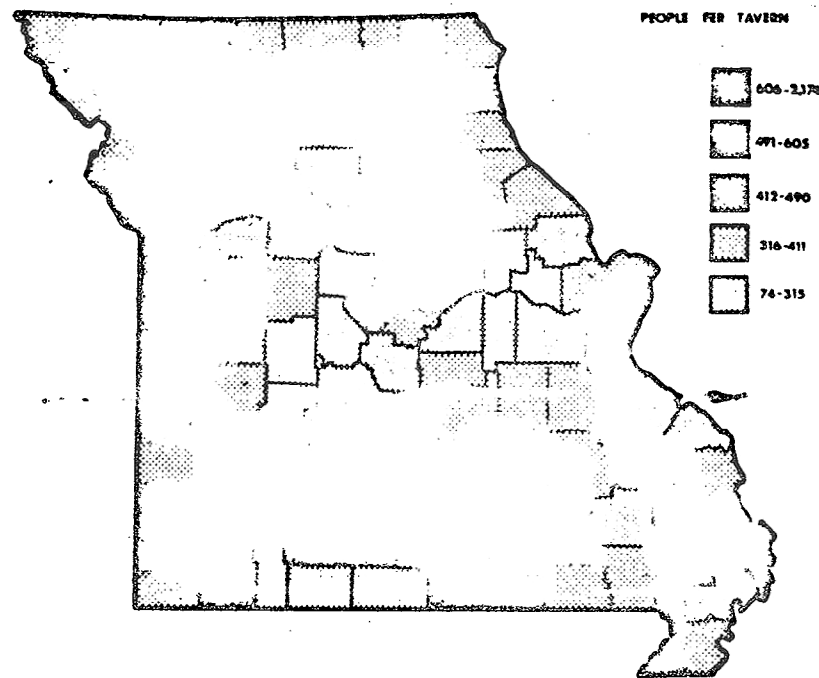


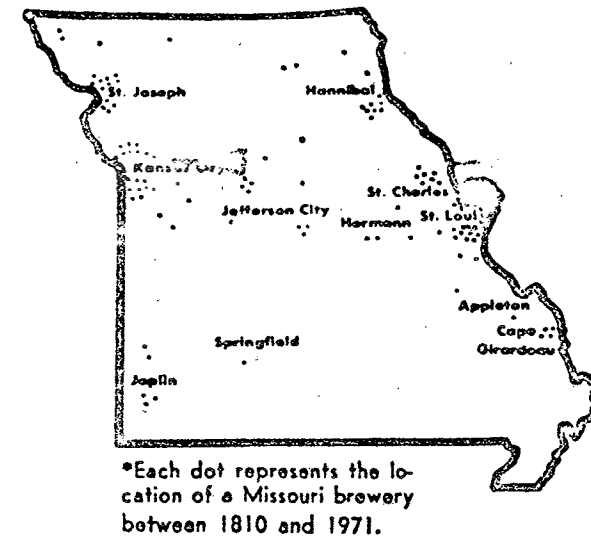
Figure 2. Areas with emergency or serious hunger problems in the 1960's. Source: Citizens' Board of Inquiry into Hunger and Malnutrition in the United States, *Hunger*, 1971, map p. 94

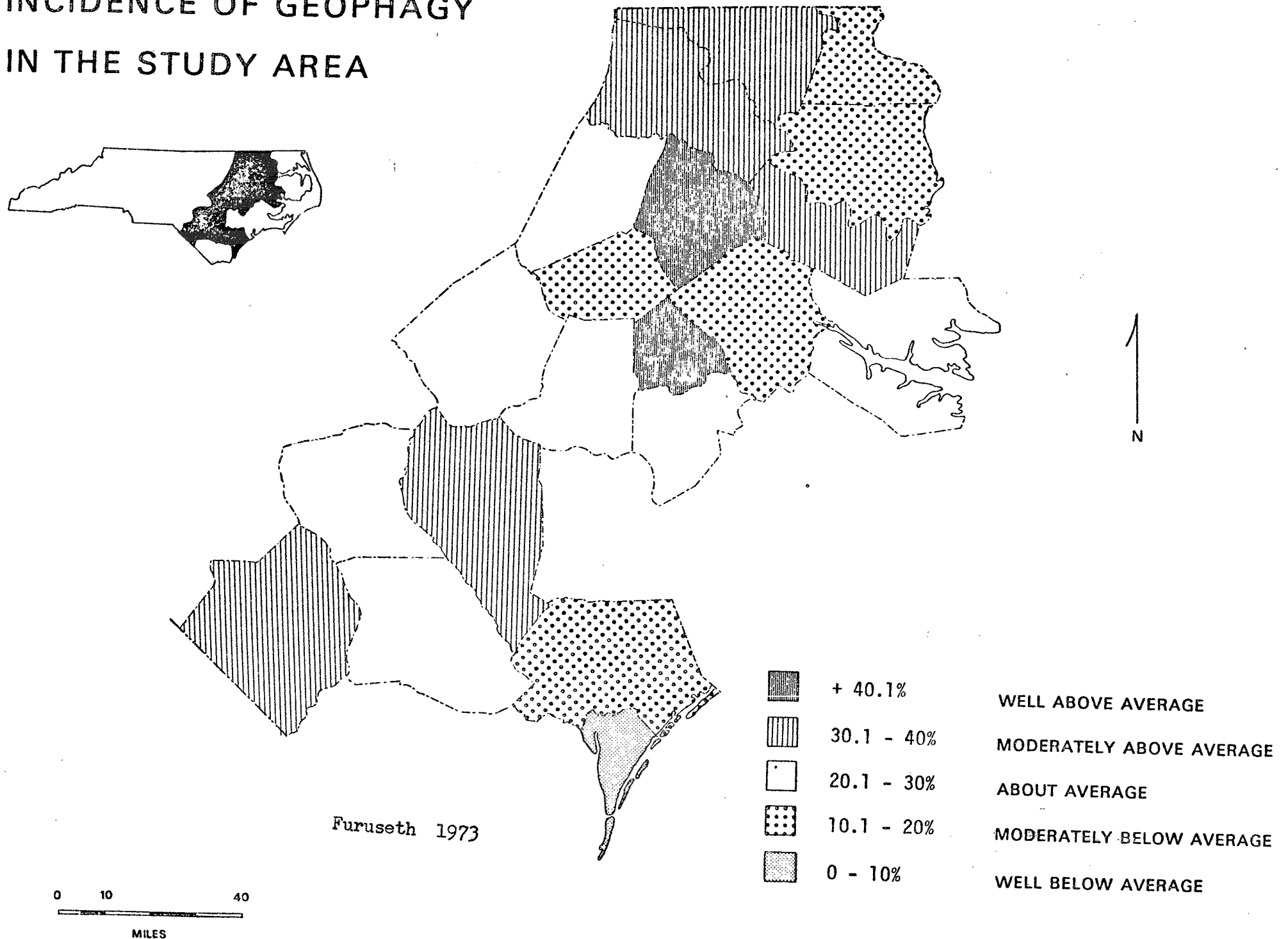
