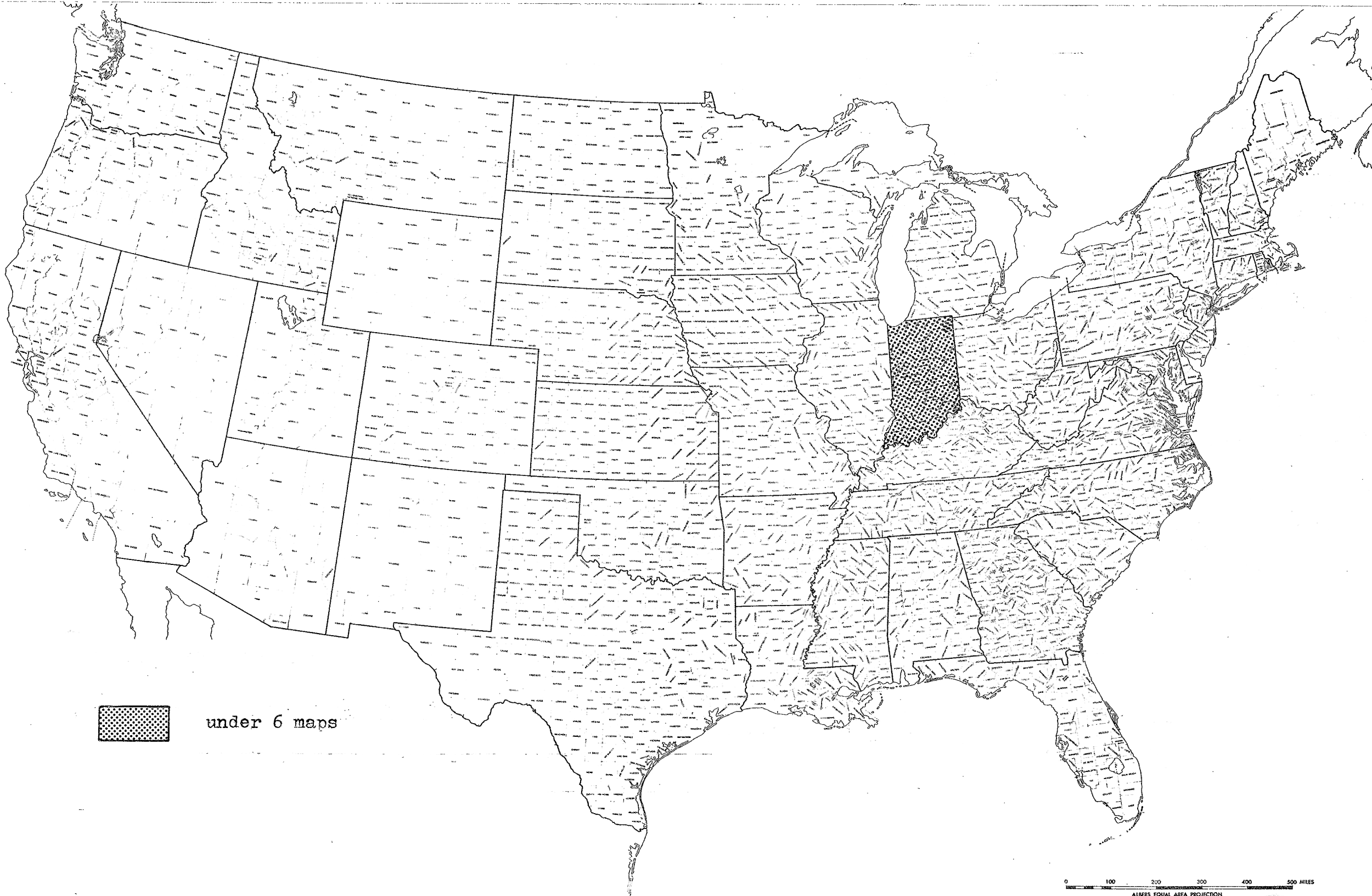

Attention is also focused on our more localized games; lacrosse, hockey, soccer and broomball. And there are maps on individual sports like golf, tennis, swimming and wrestling.

Geographical organization and interaction are introduced. The diffusion process is also addressed as we trace professional baseball from 1871 forward.

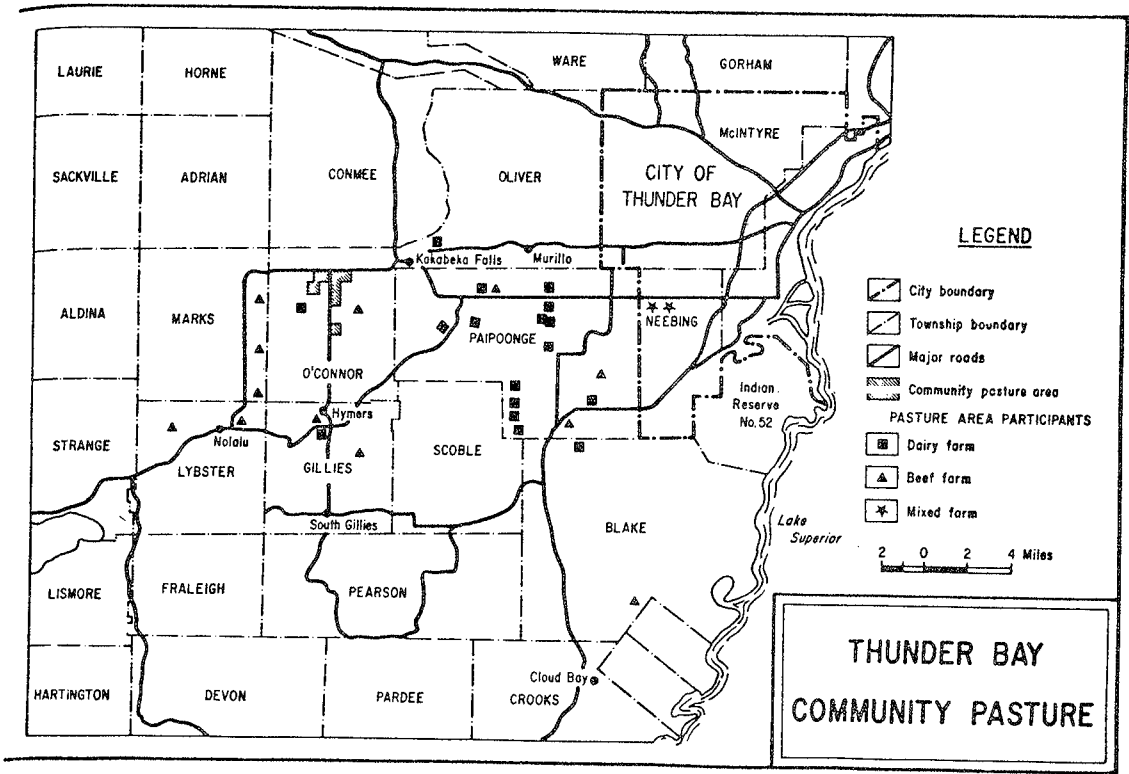

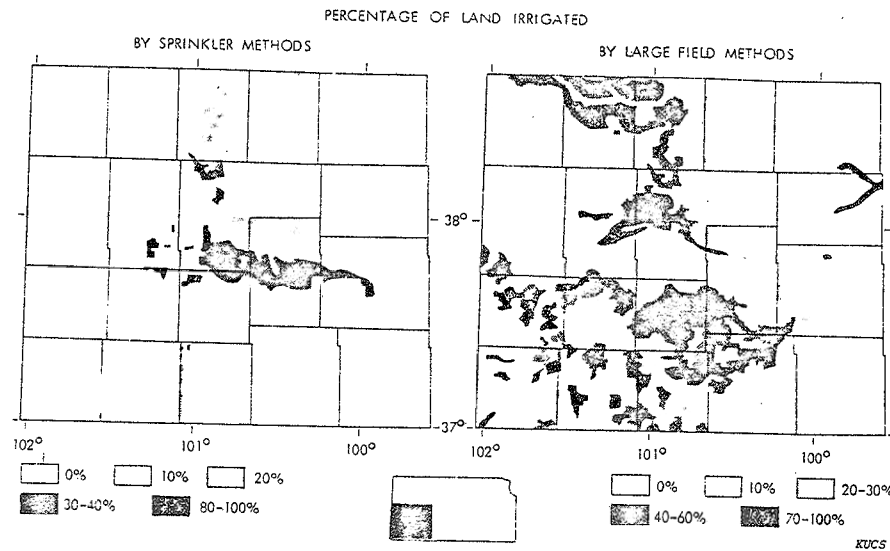

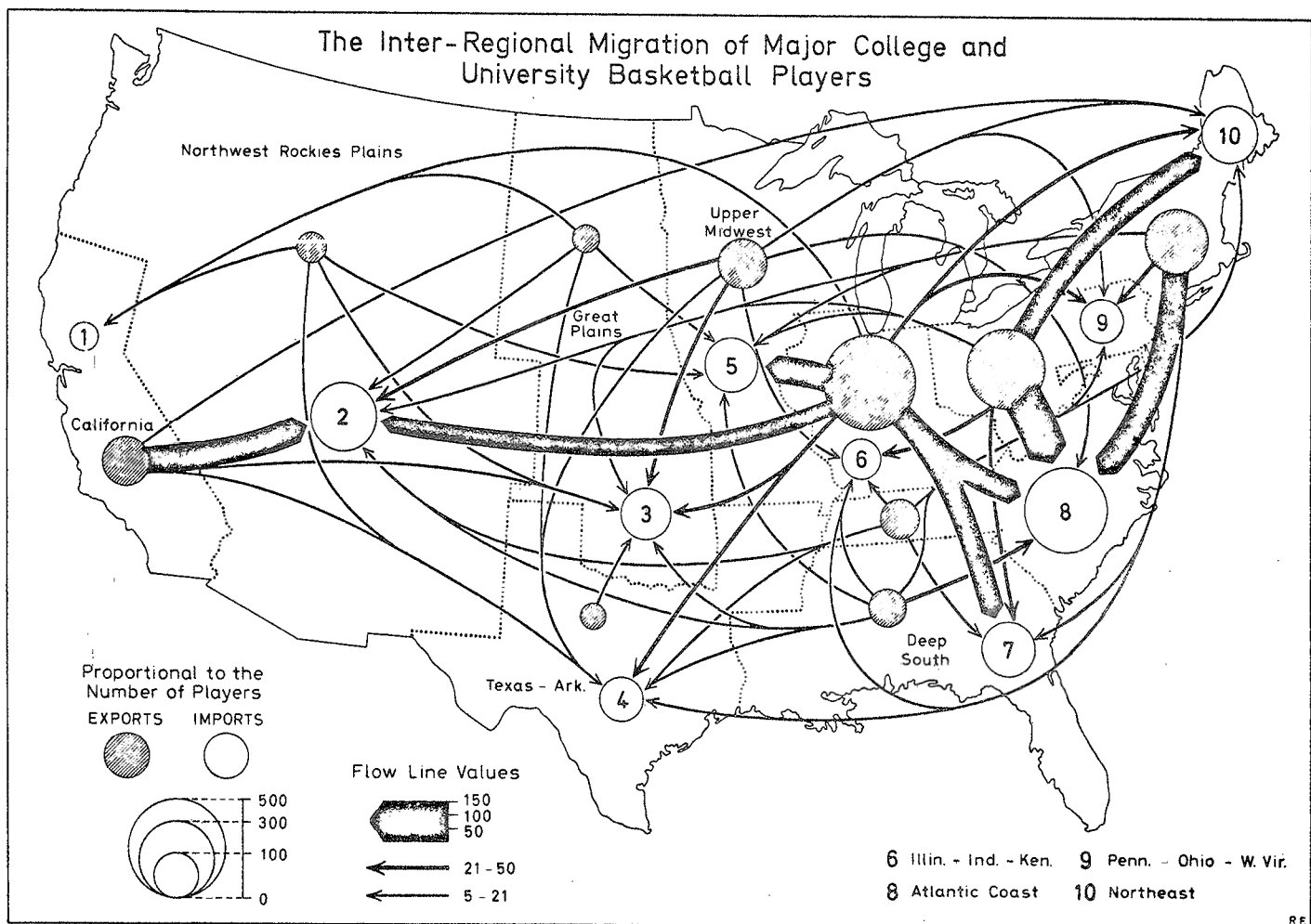

COLLEGE HEAD FOOTBALL COACHES

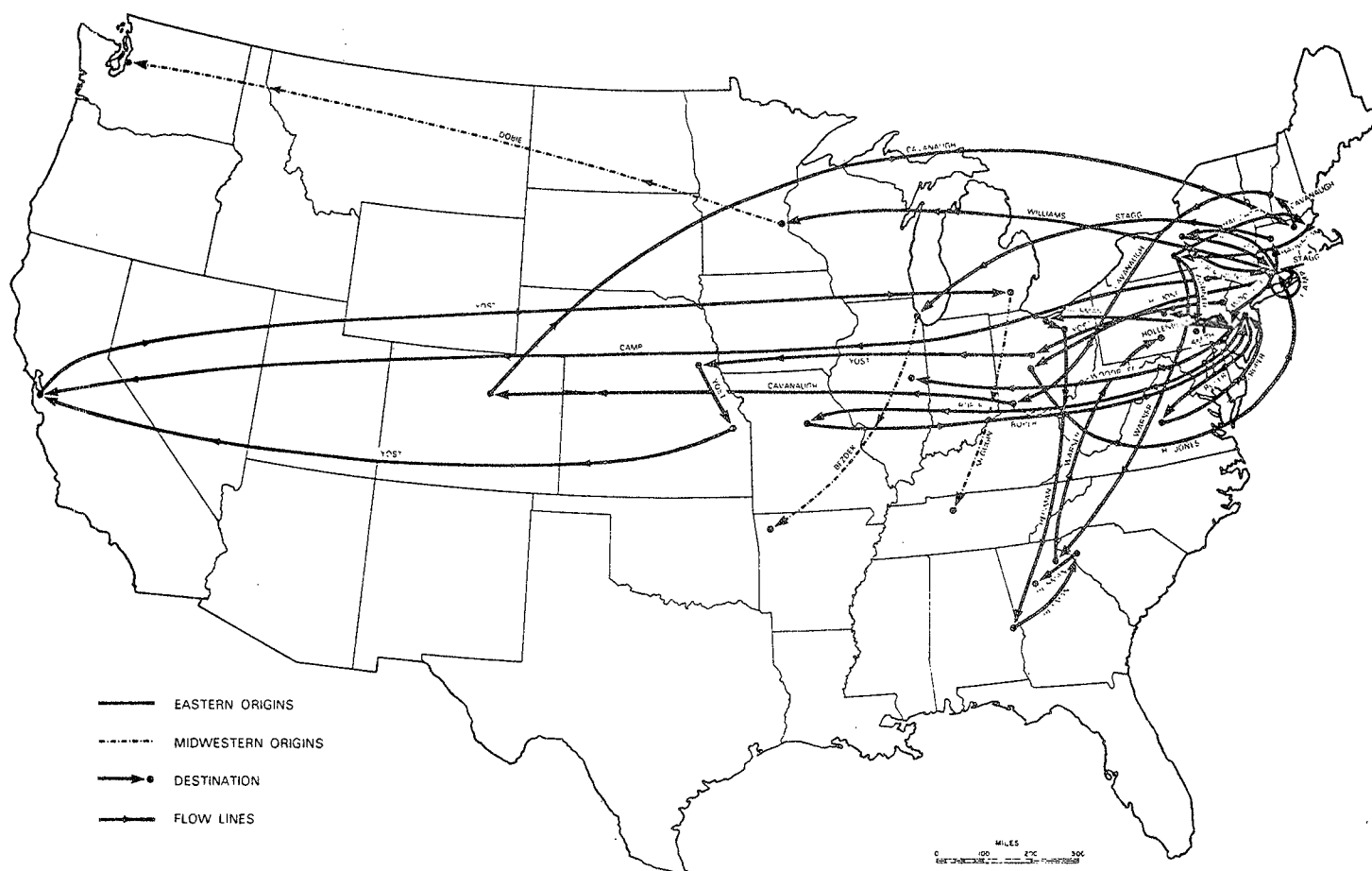

COLLEGE HEAD FOOTBALL COACHES

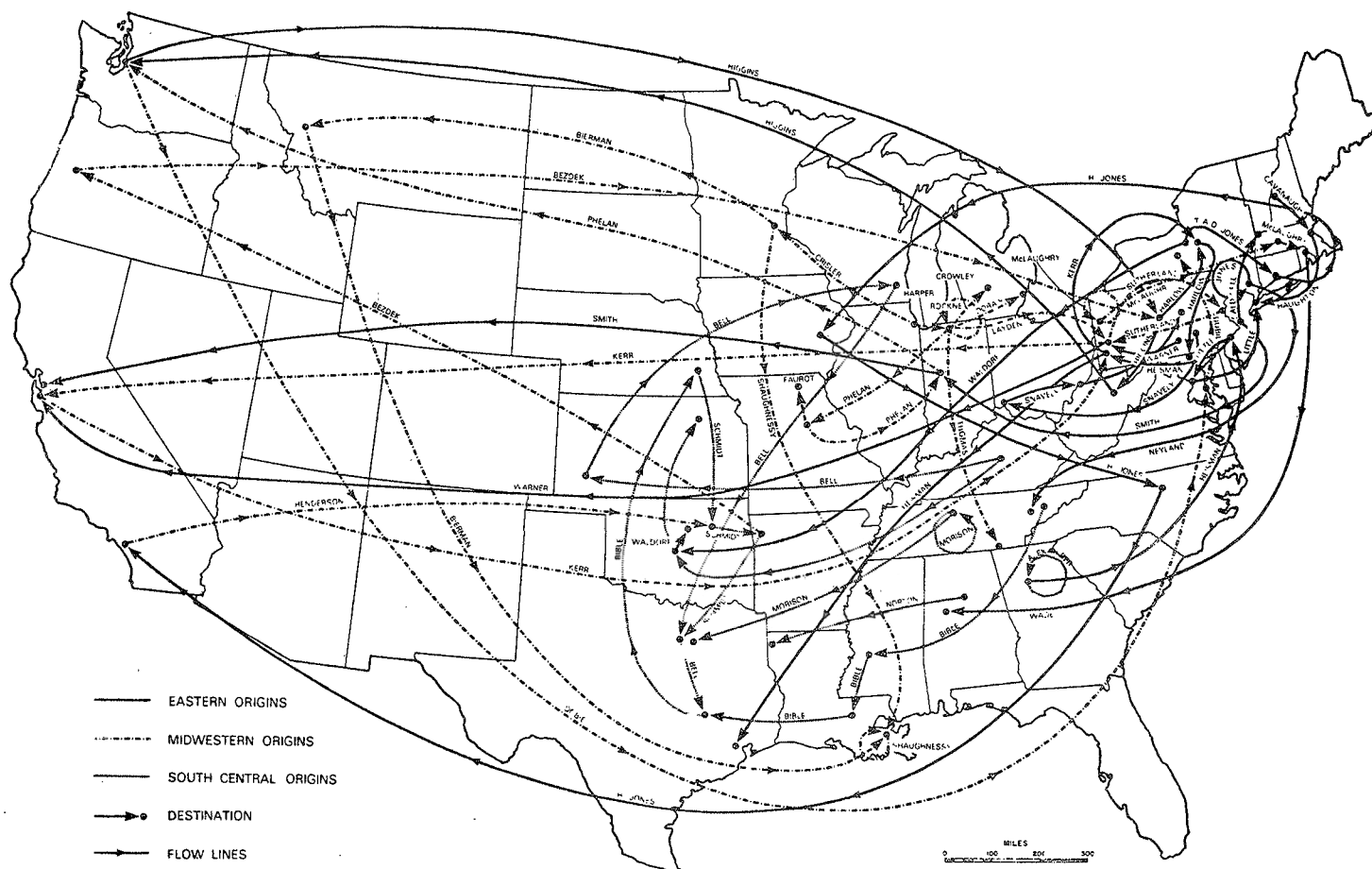
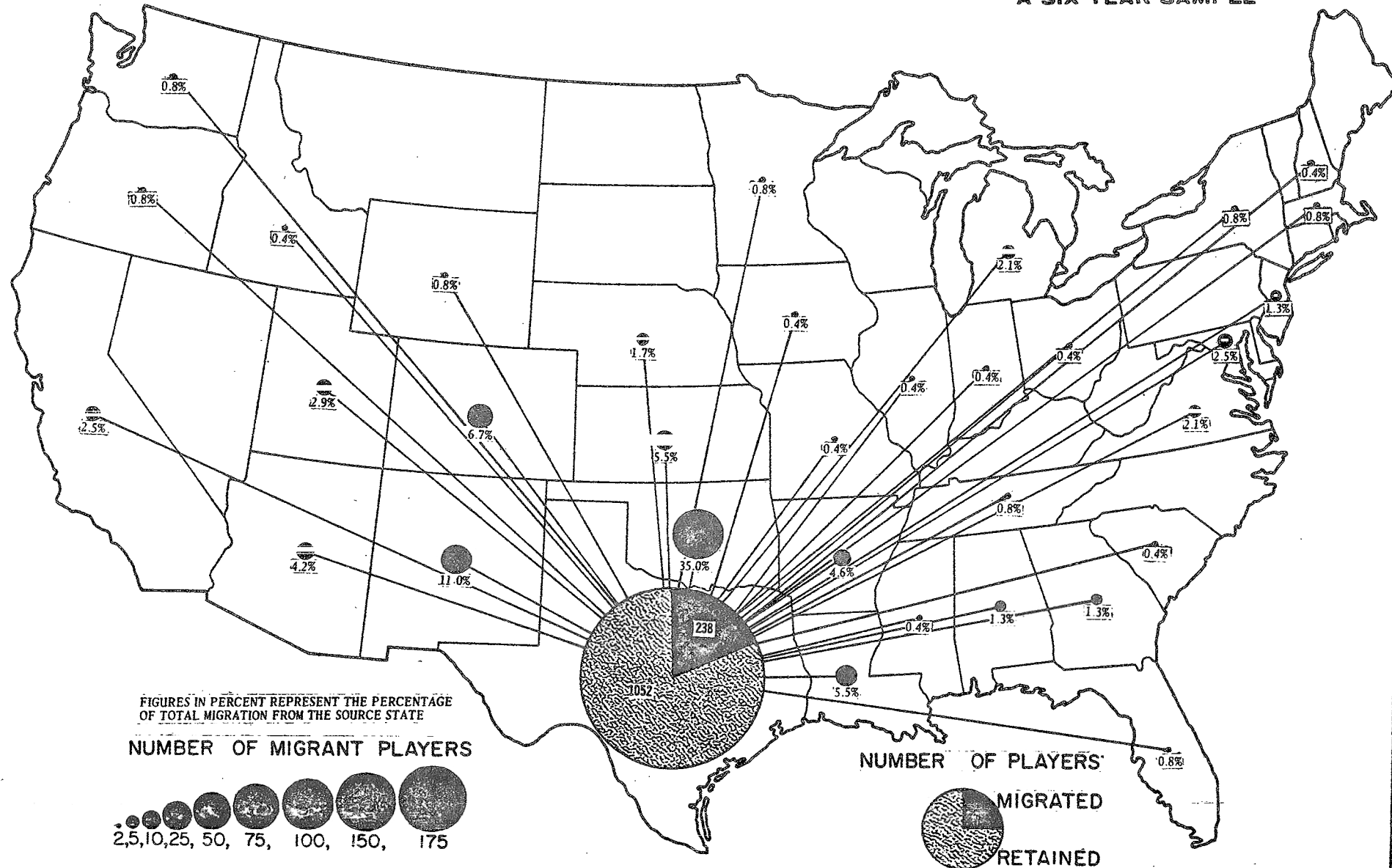

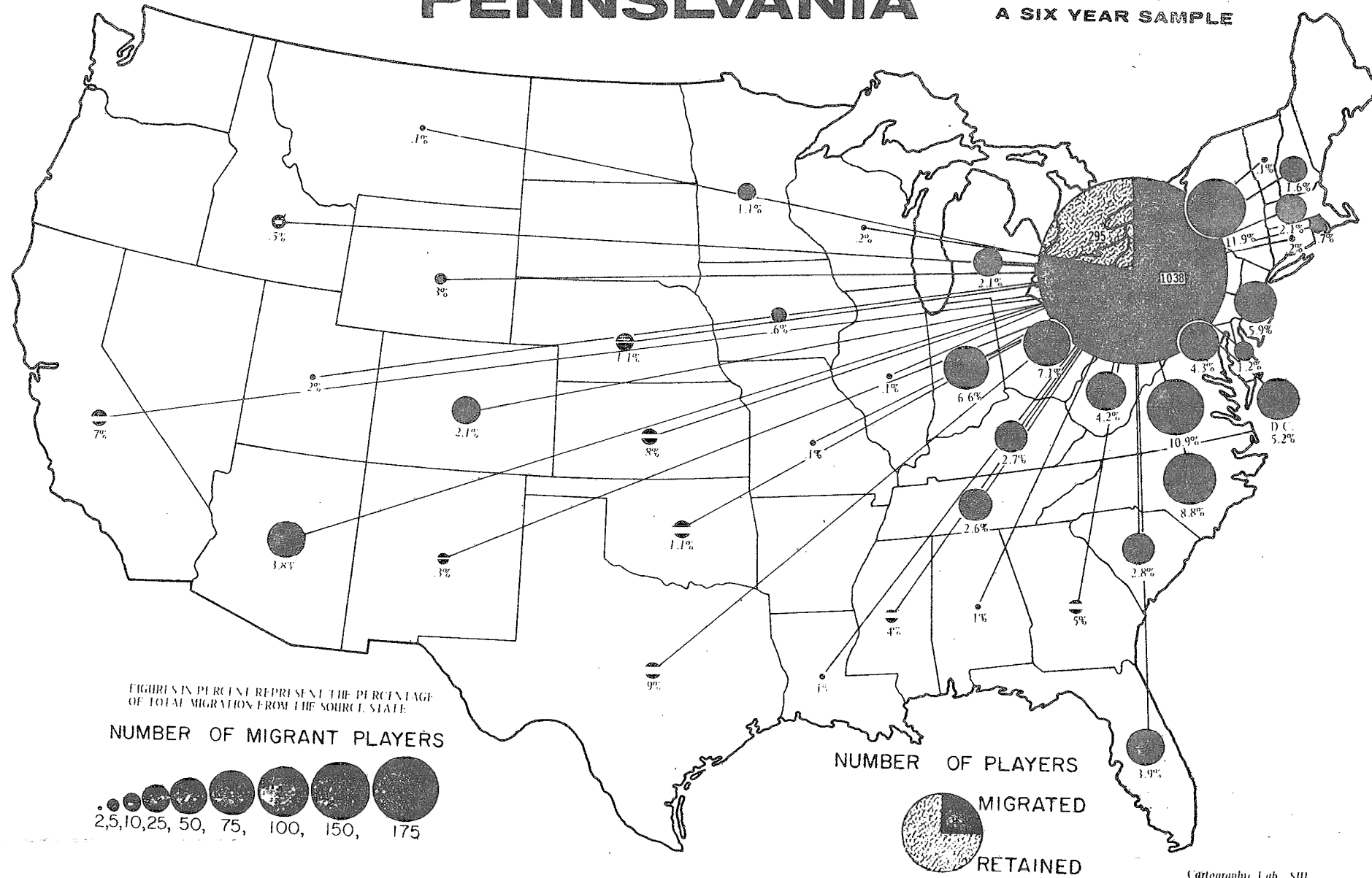
THE MIGRATION OF MAJOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL PLAYERS FROM TEXAS

A SIX YEAR SAMPLE

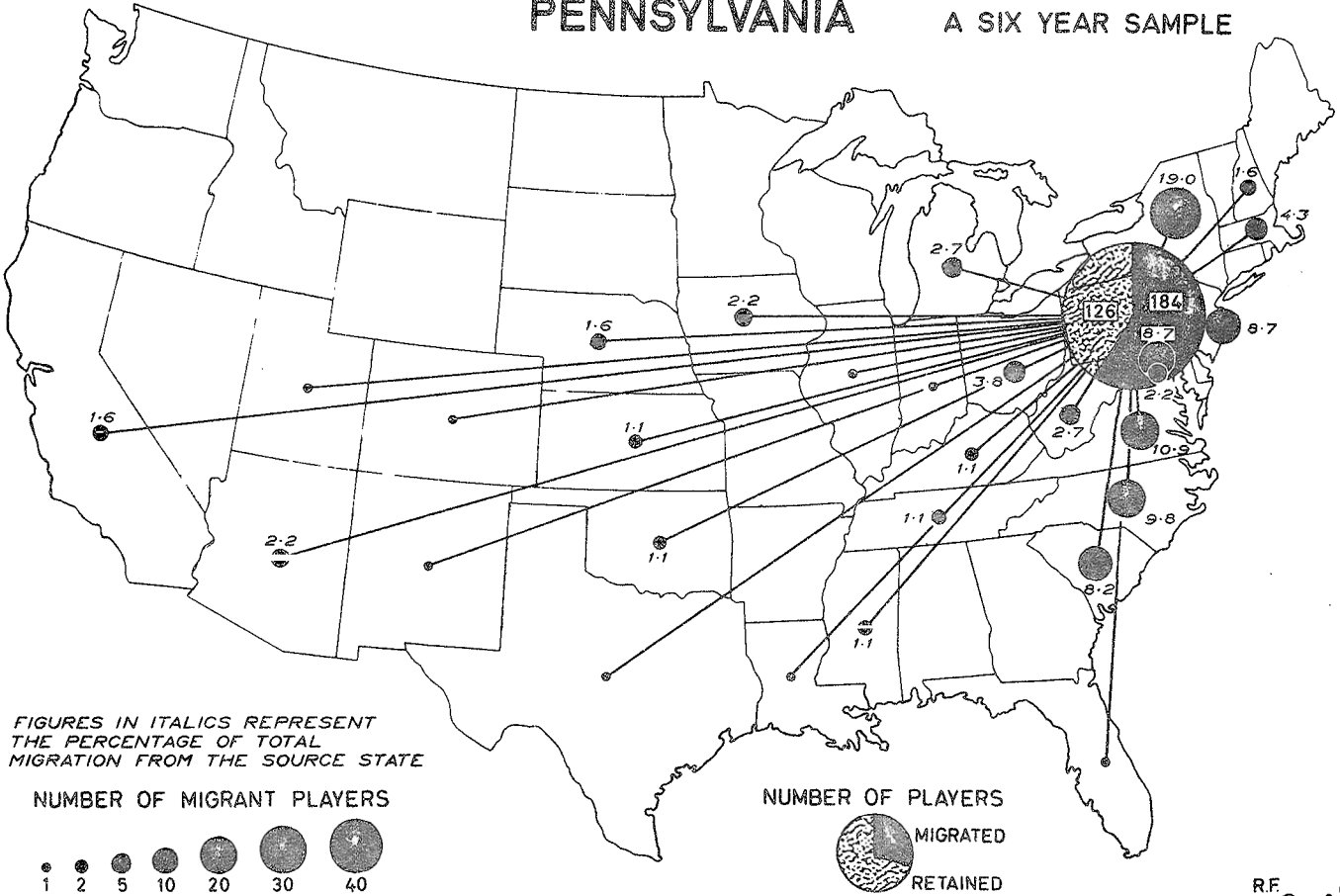


THE MIGRATION OF MAJOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL PLAYERS FROM PENNSYLVANIA

A SIX YEAR SAMPLE

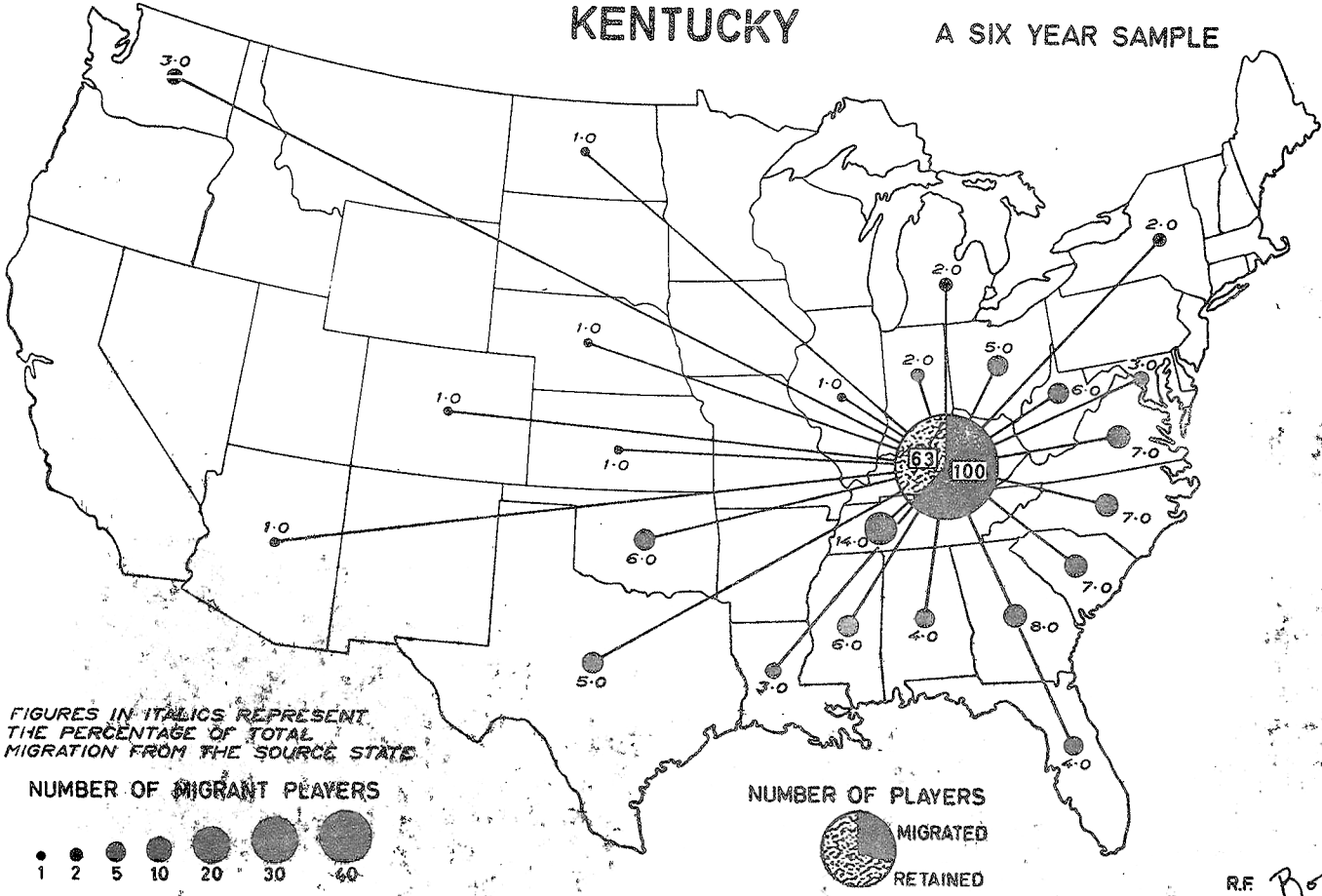

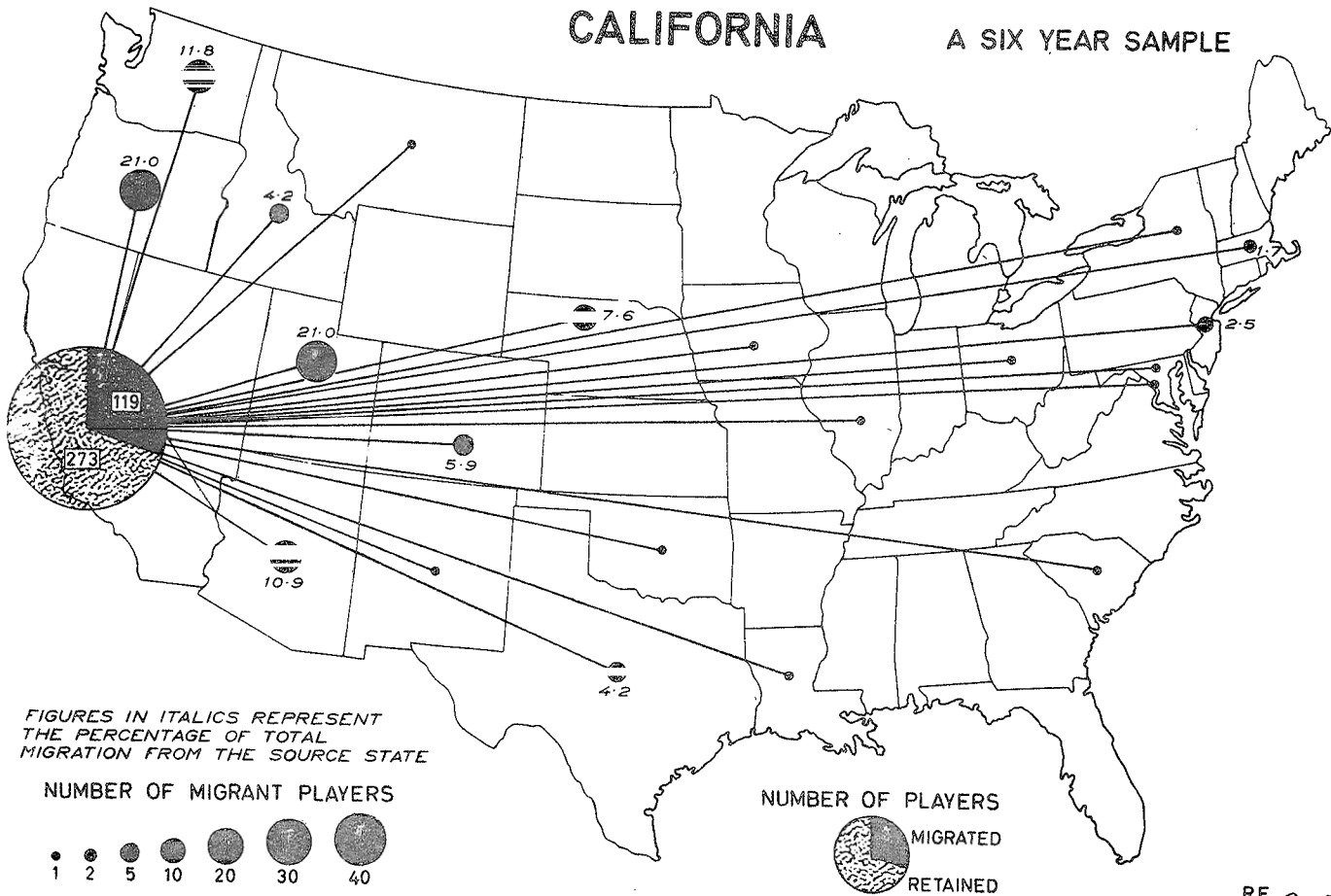

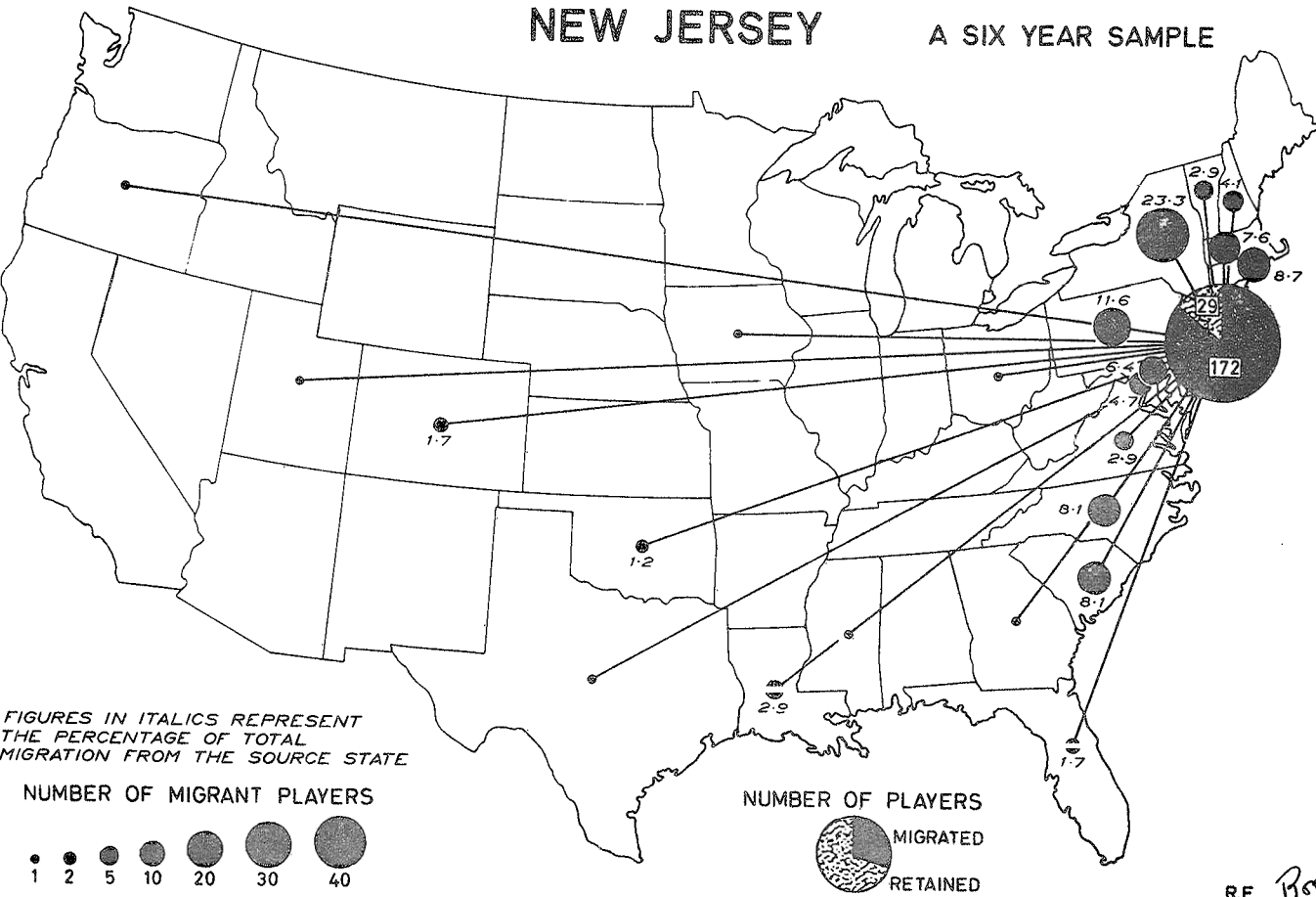

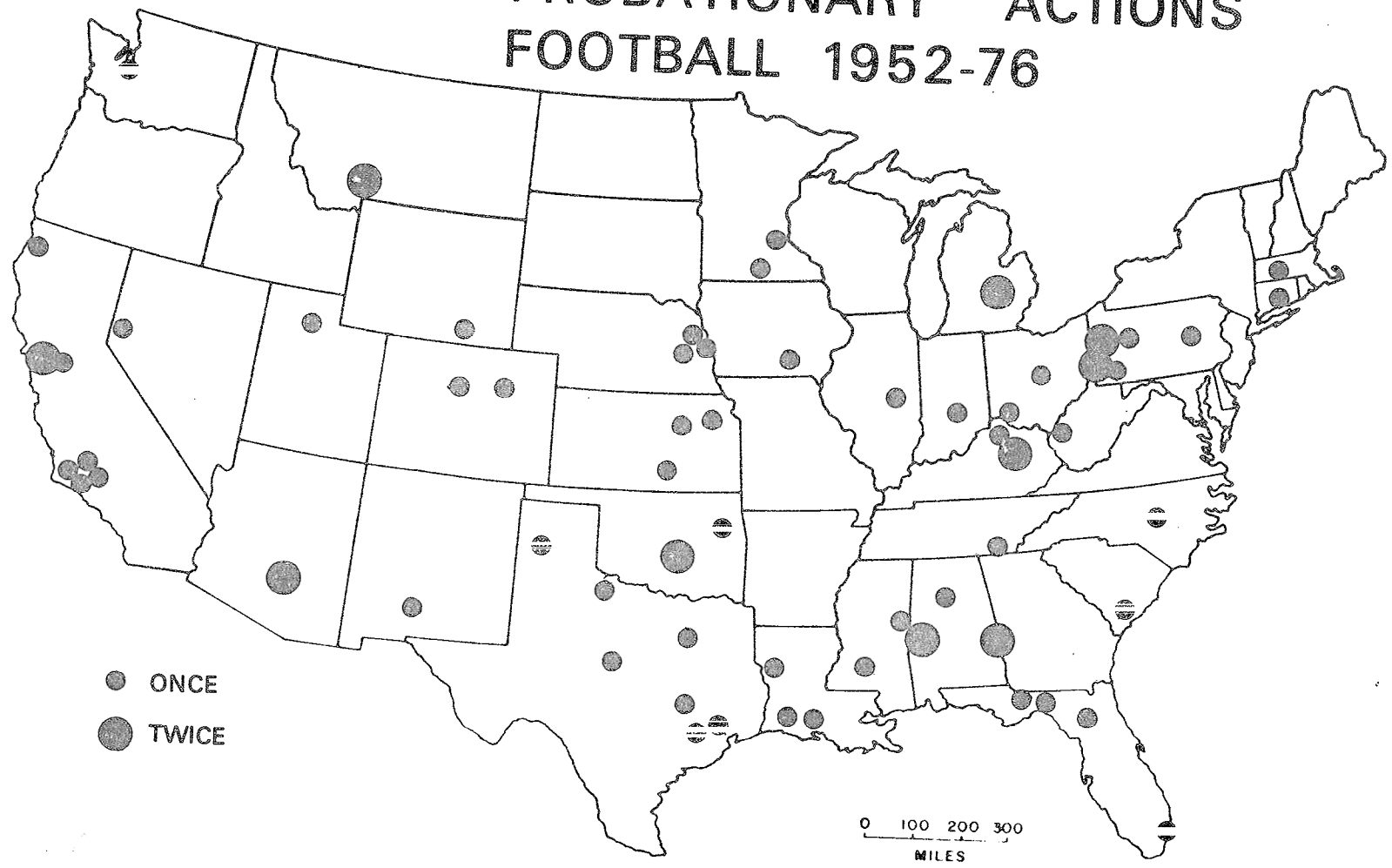

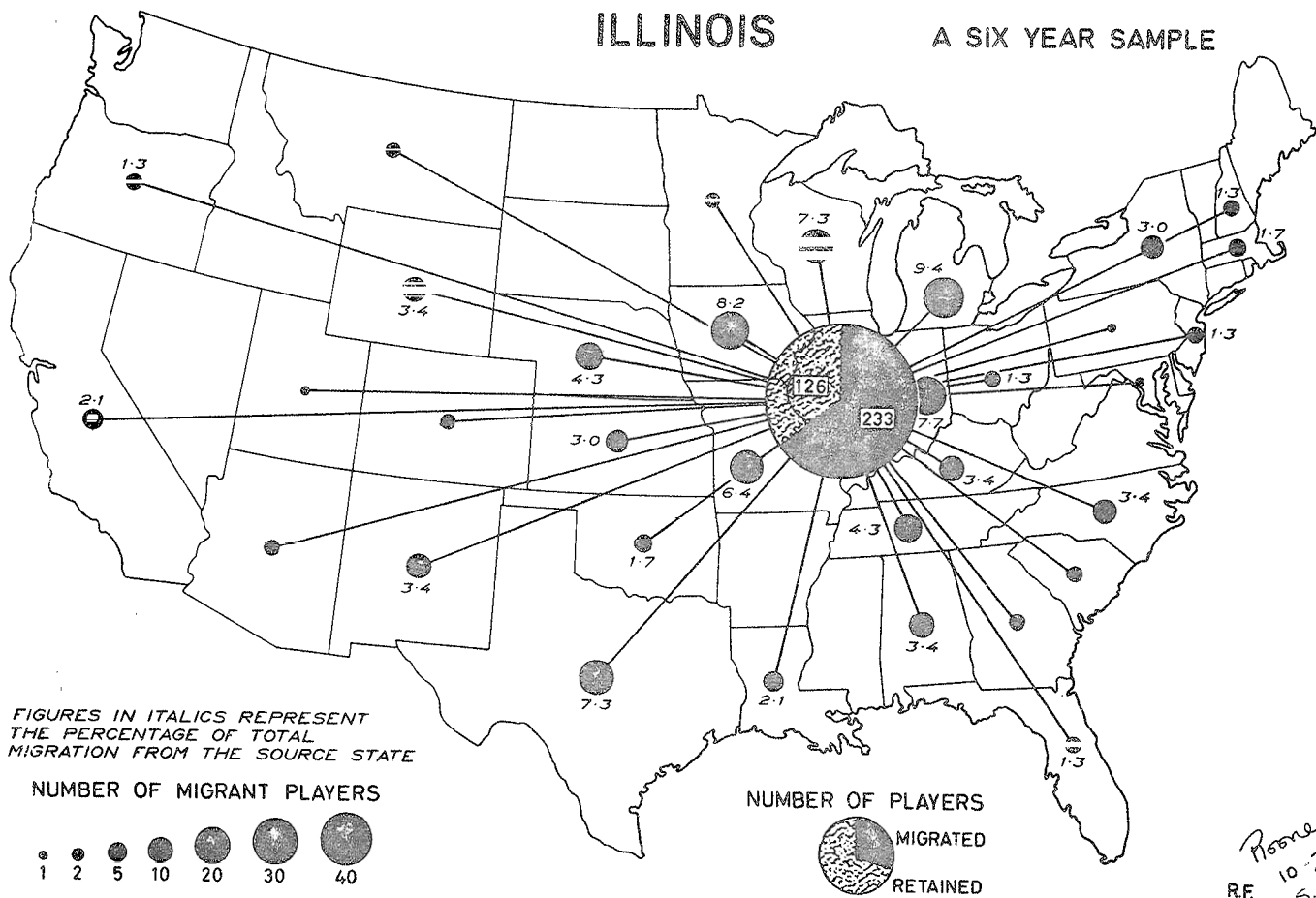

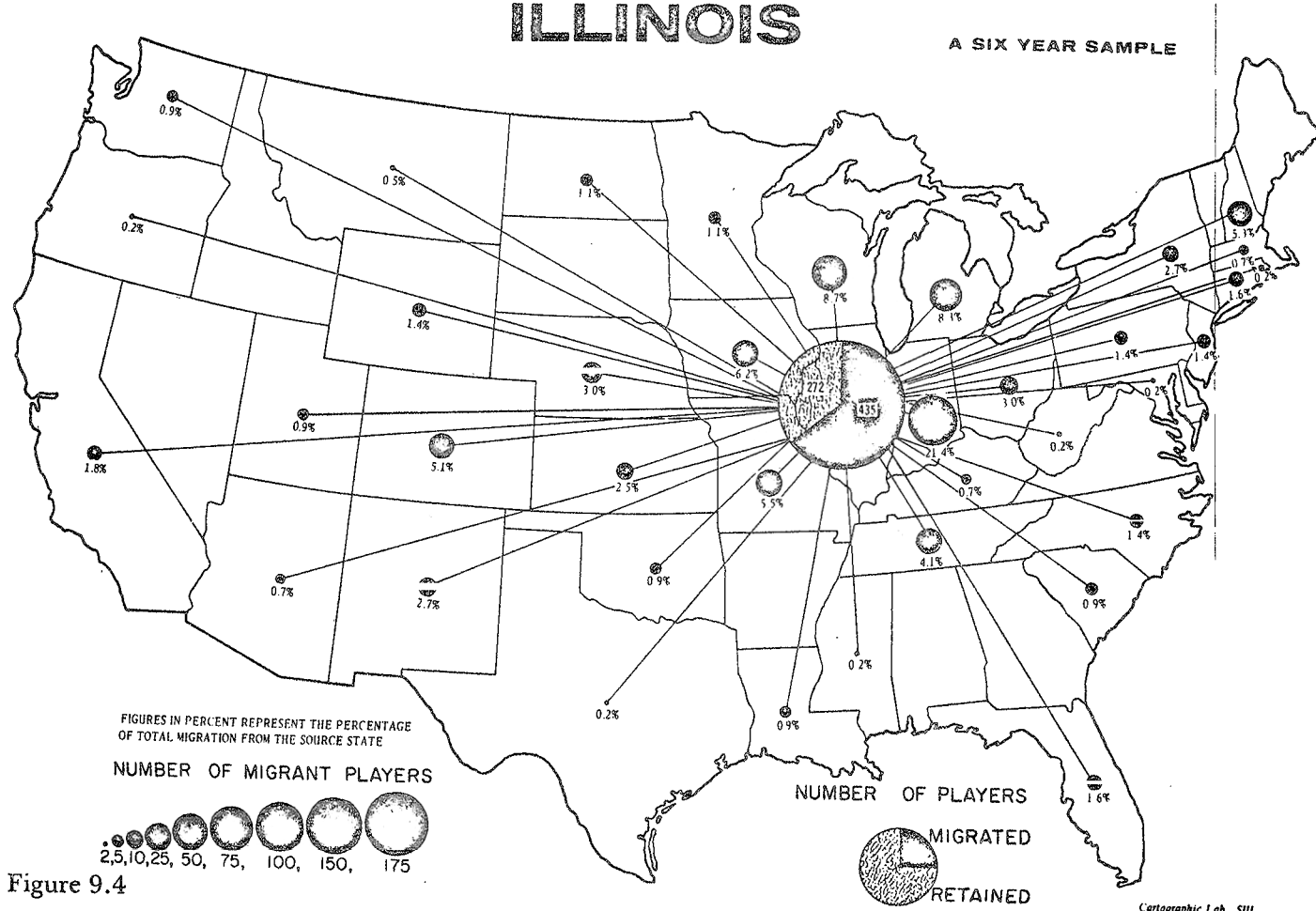
NCAA PROBATIONARY ACTIONS FOOTBALL 1952-76



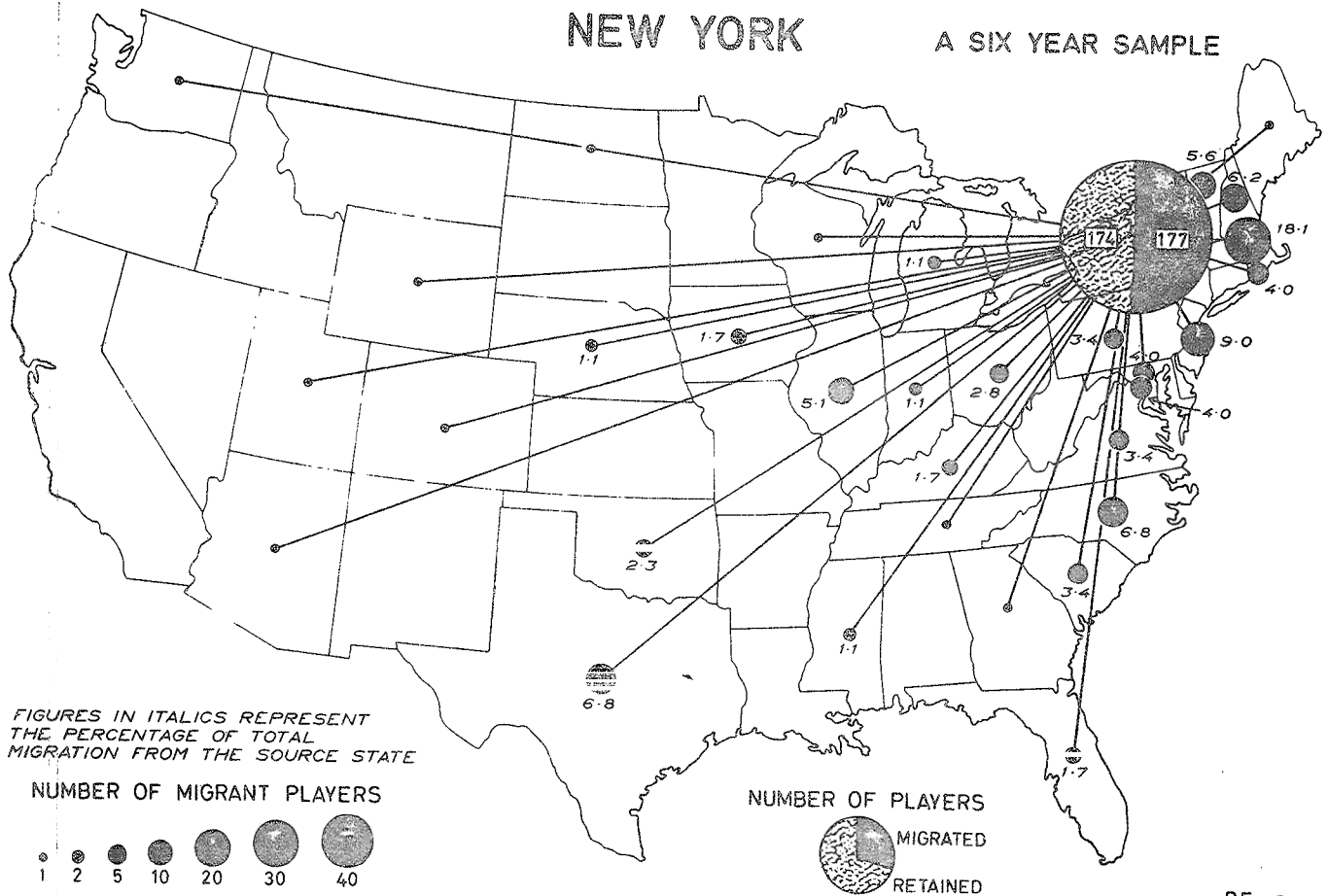

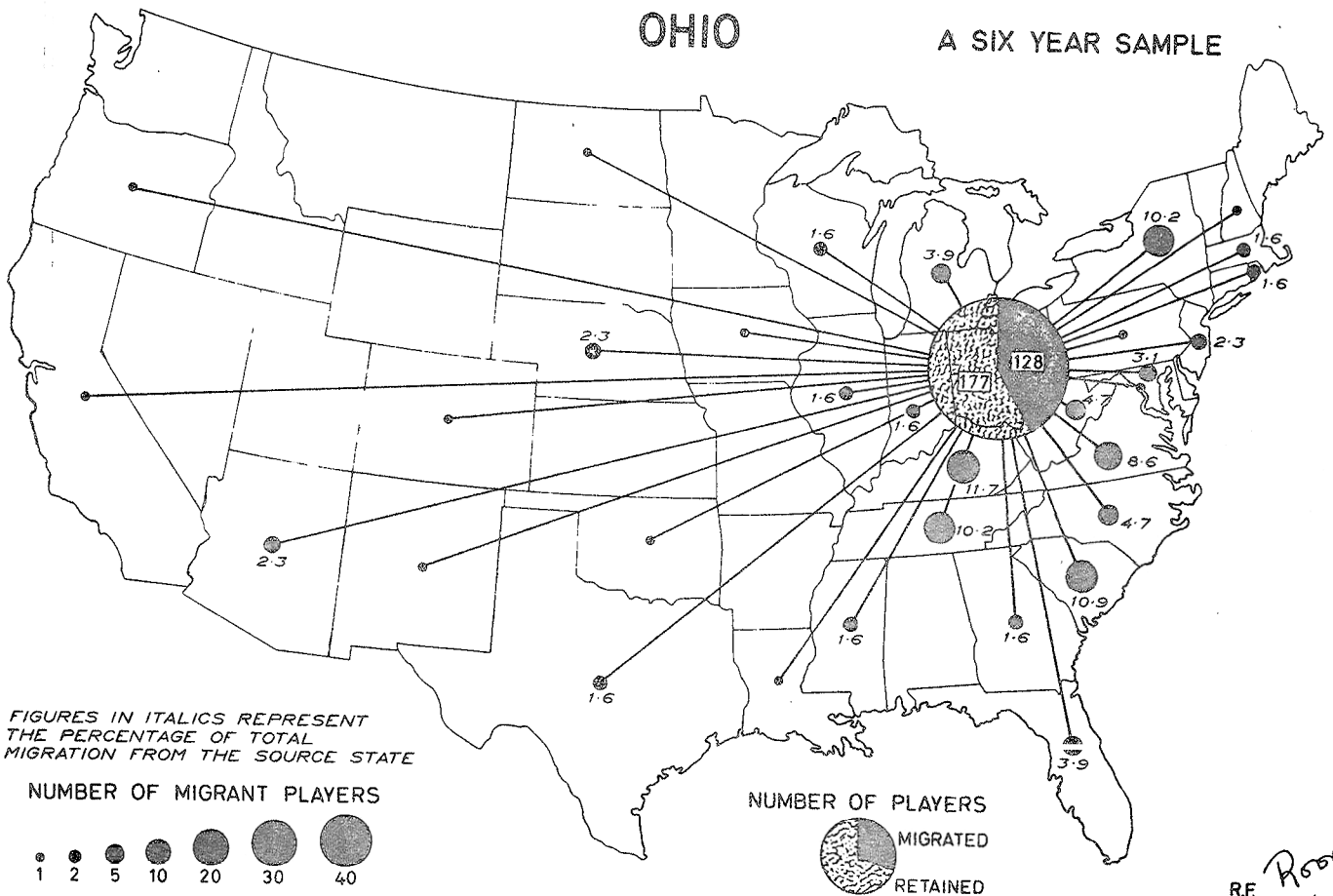

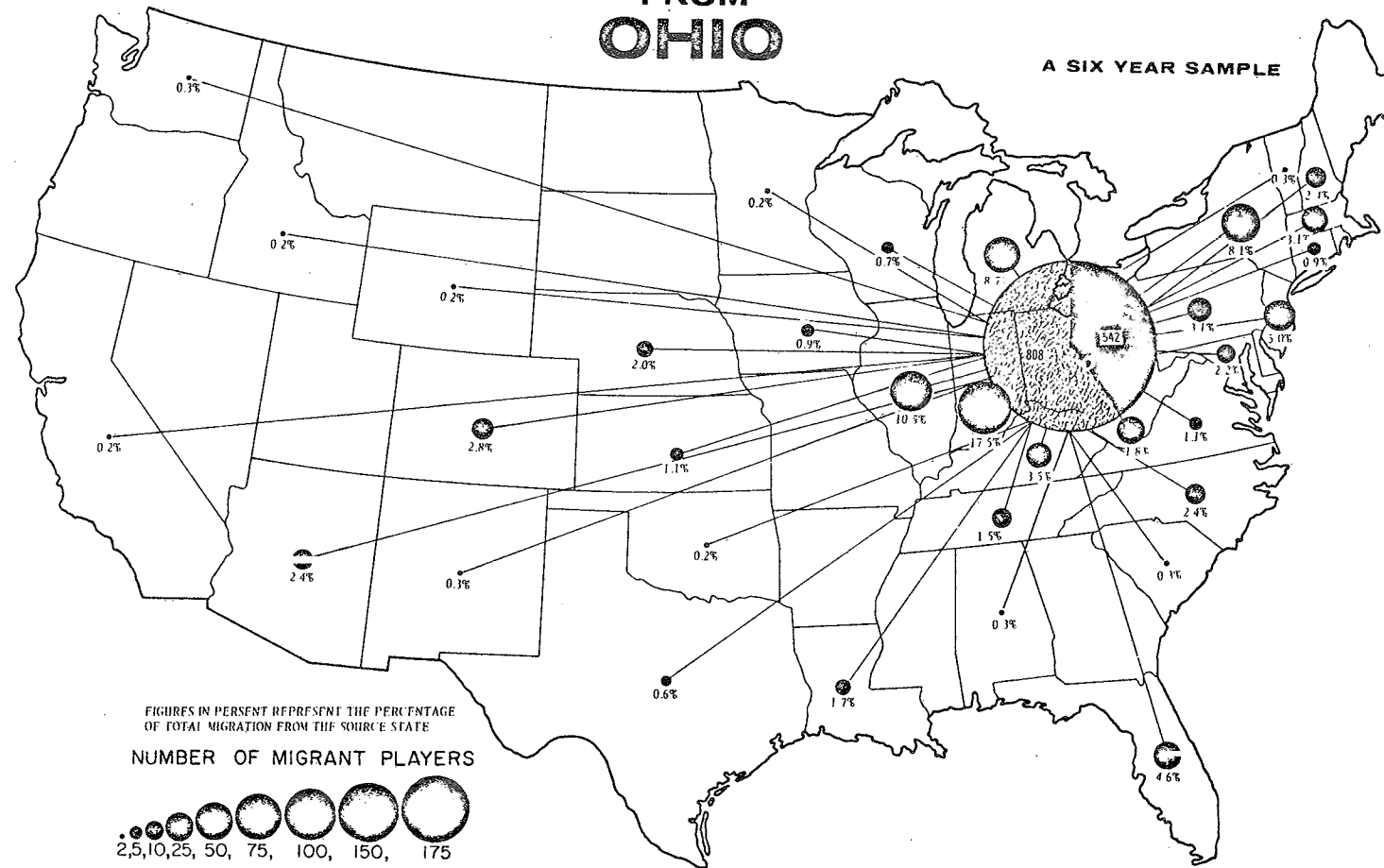

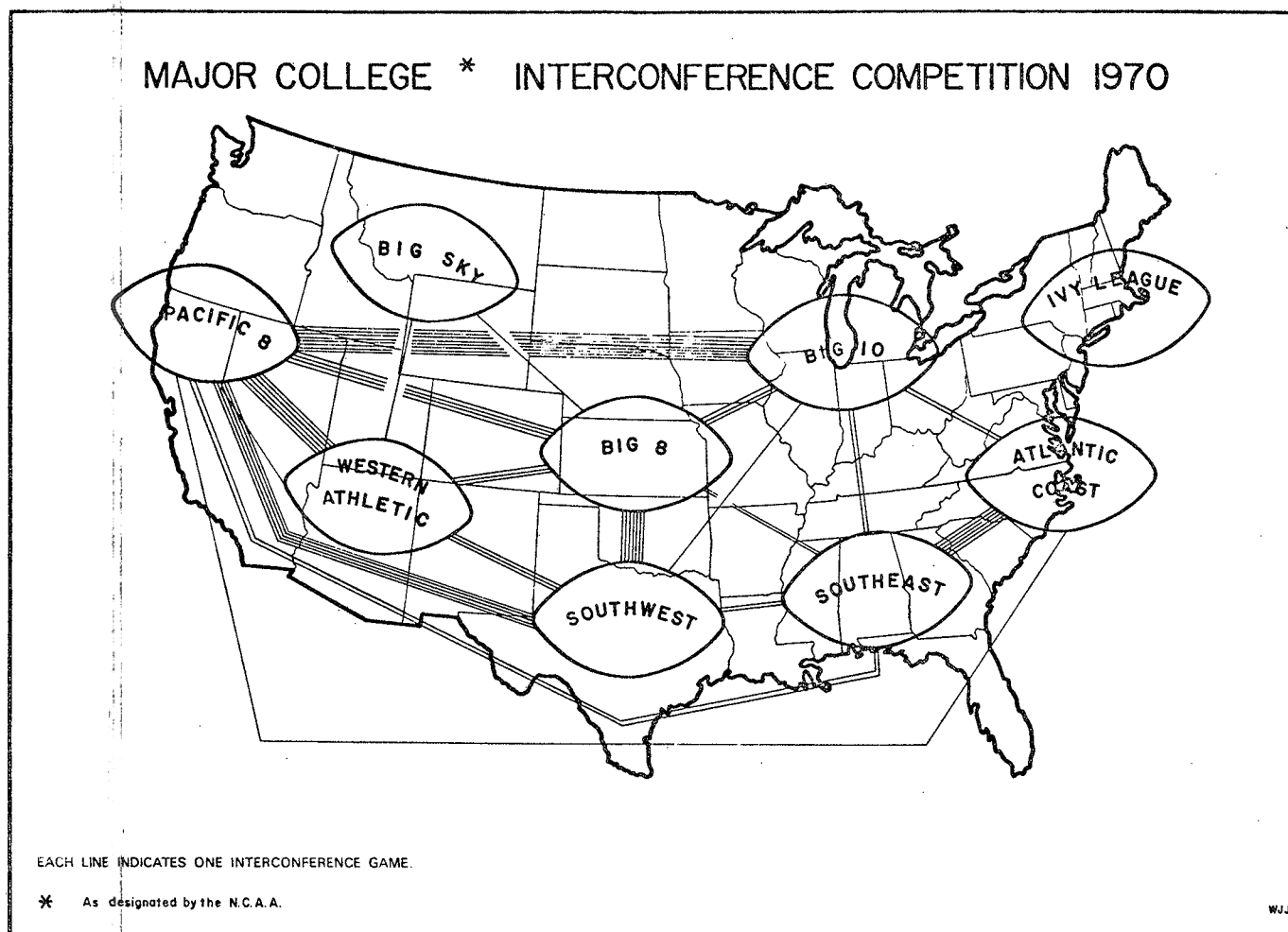


Fig. 4.11 Designed after Charles Mullin and William Jones.

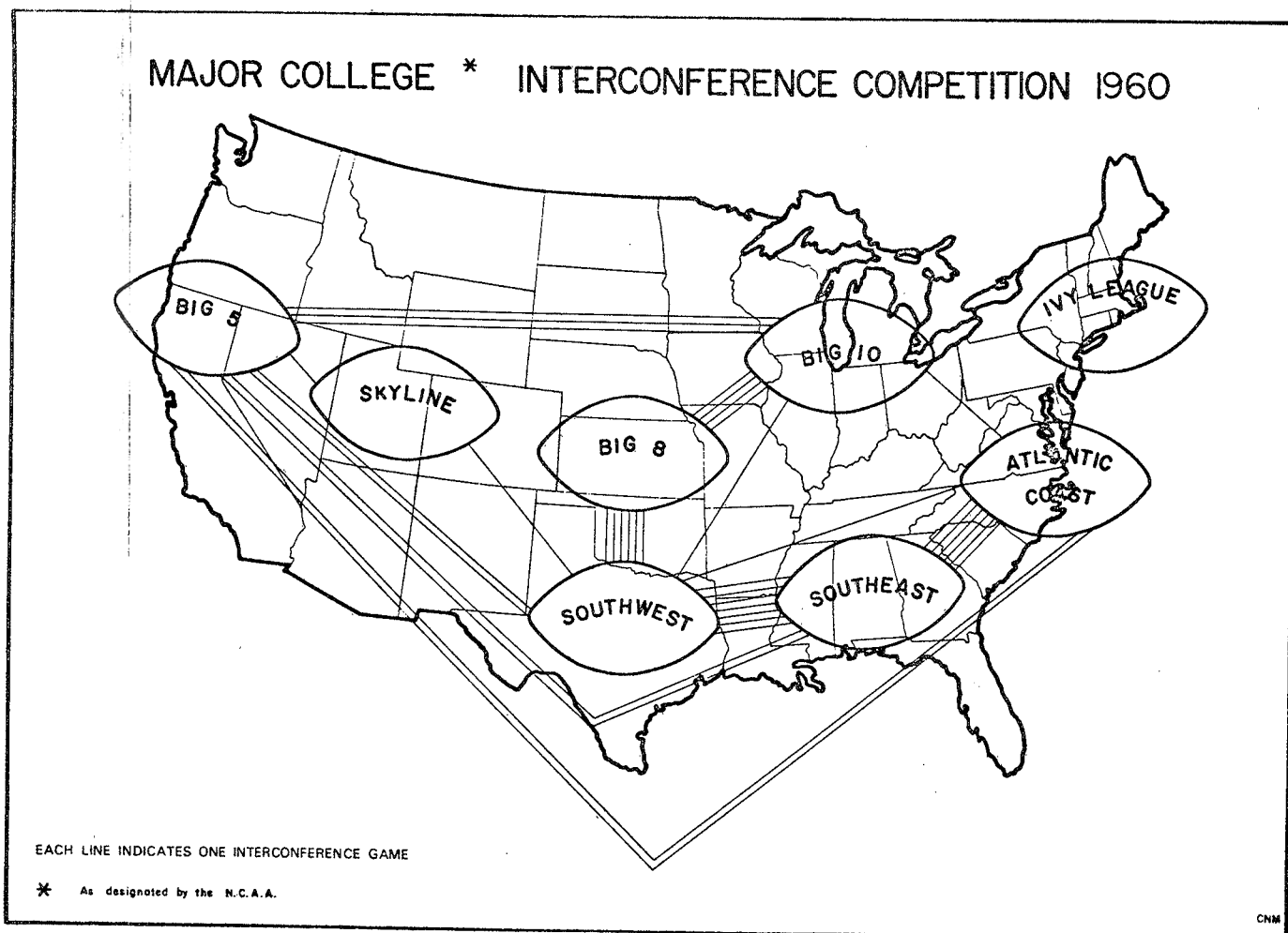
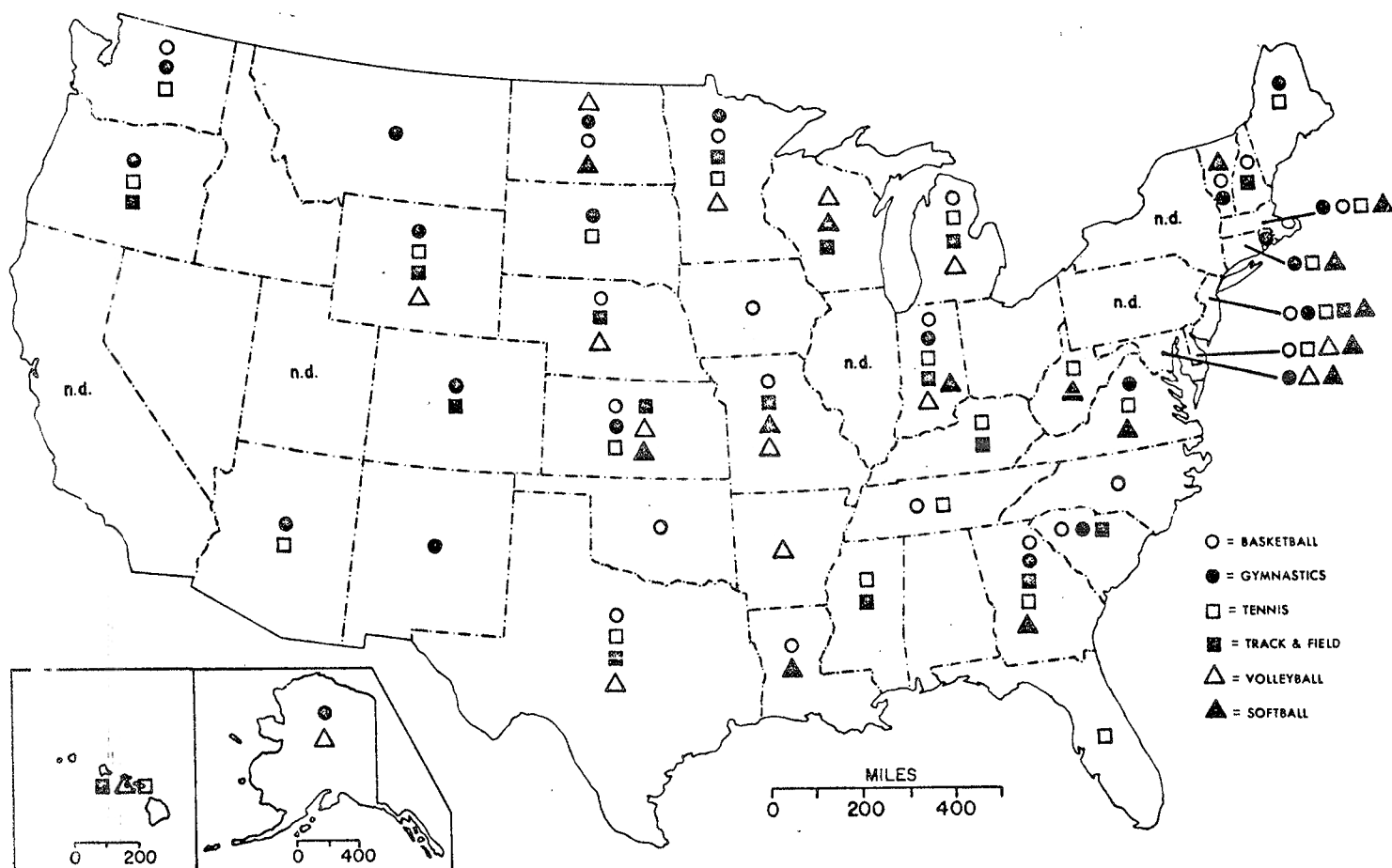


Fig. 4.10 Designed after Charles Mullin and William Jones.

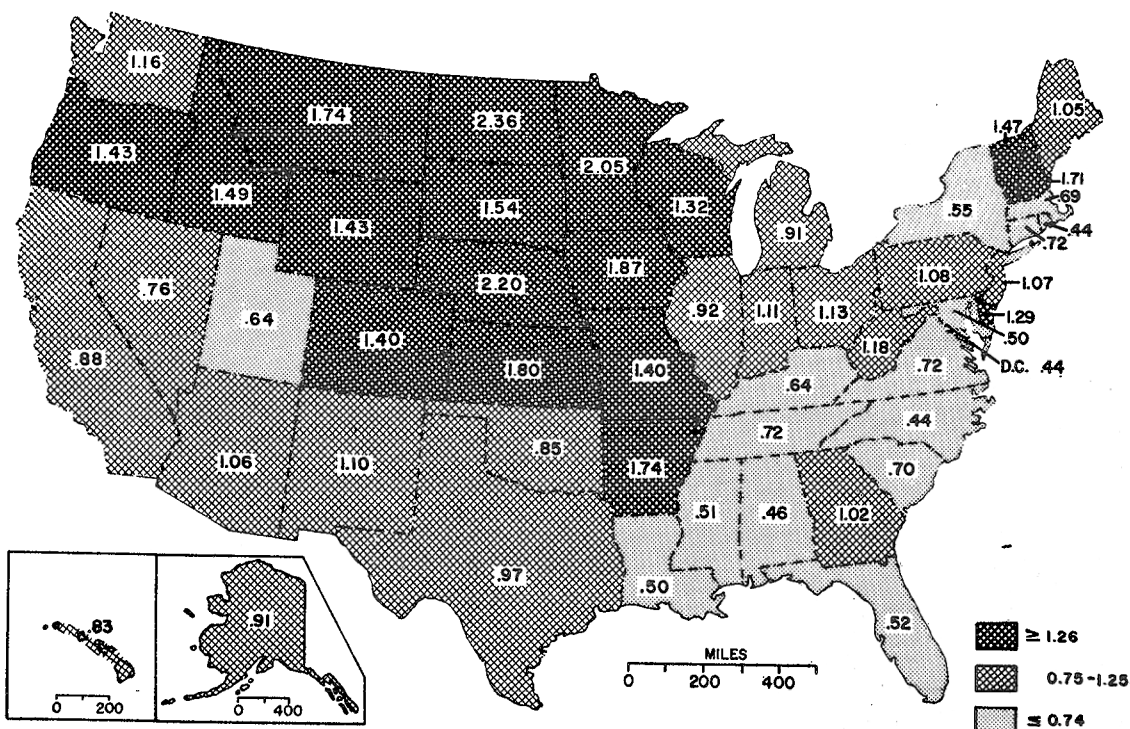
PARTICIPATION IN GIRLS' HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS

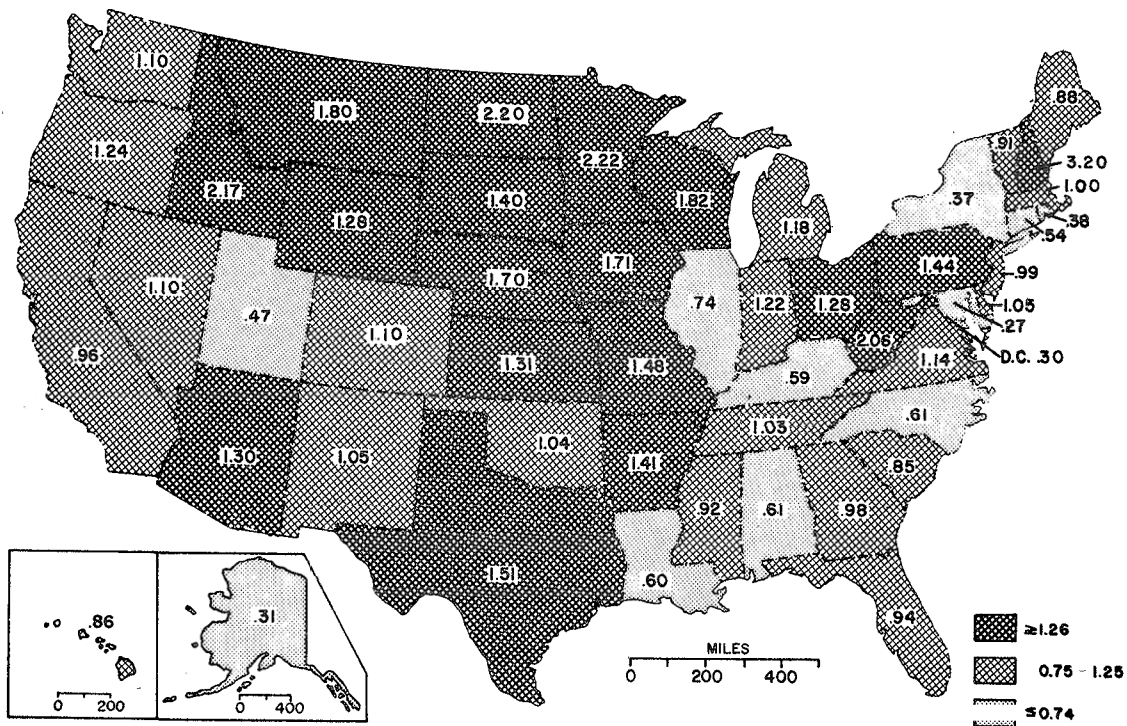

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN ALL HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS - 1971 - 72



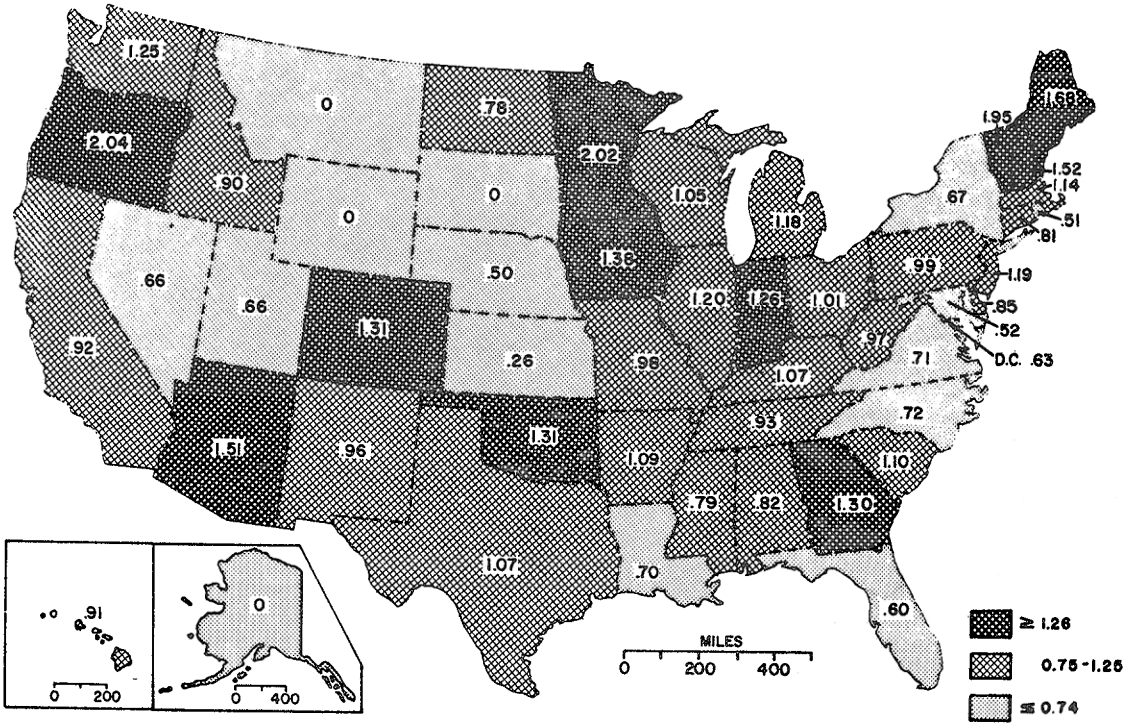

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL - 1971 - 72



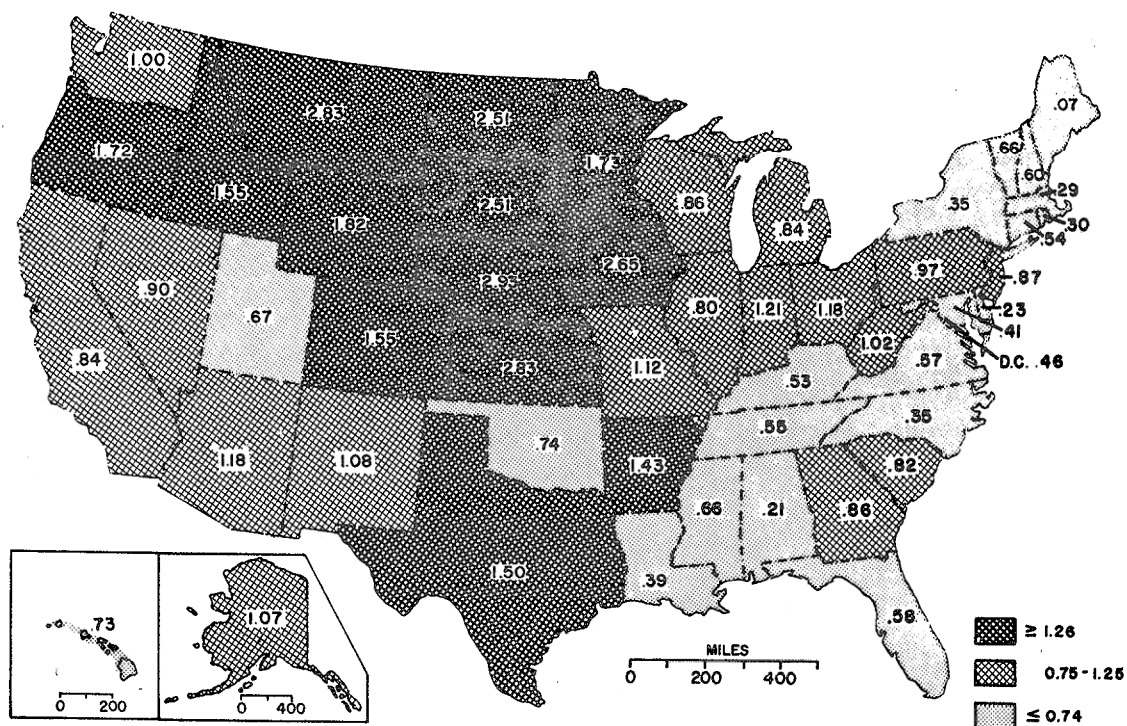

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL - 1971 - 72



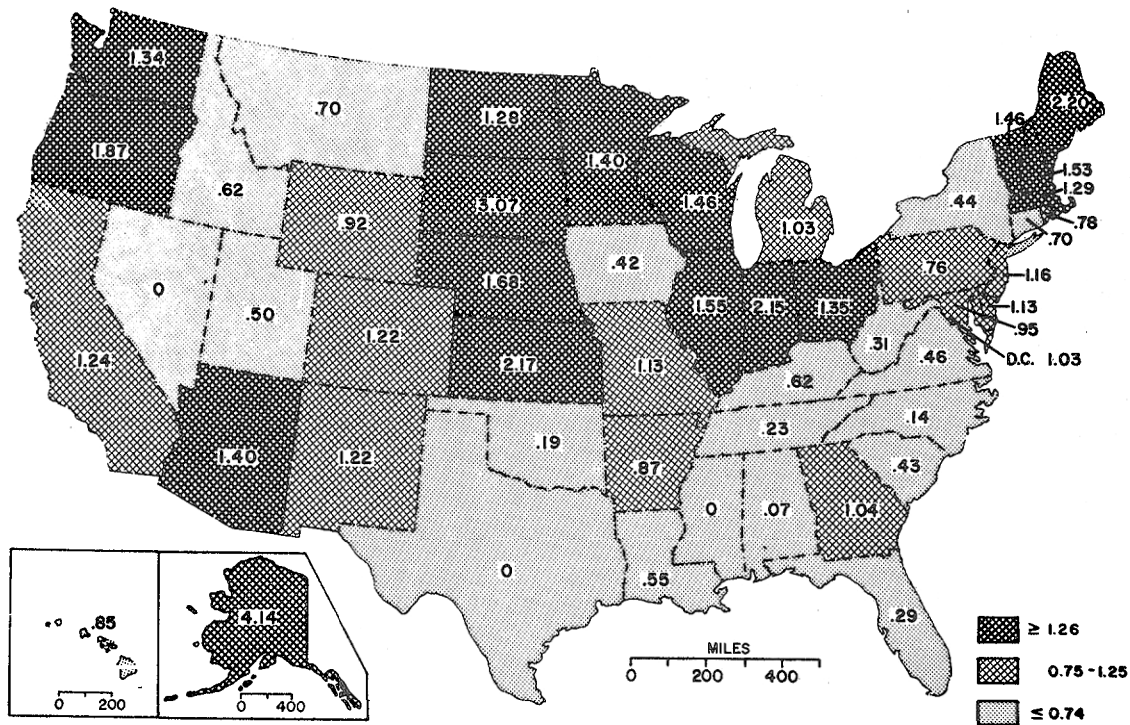

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN HIGH SCHOOL OUTDOOR TRACK - 1971 - 72



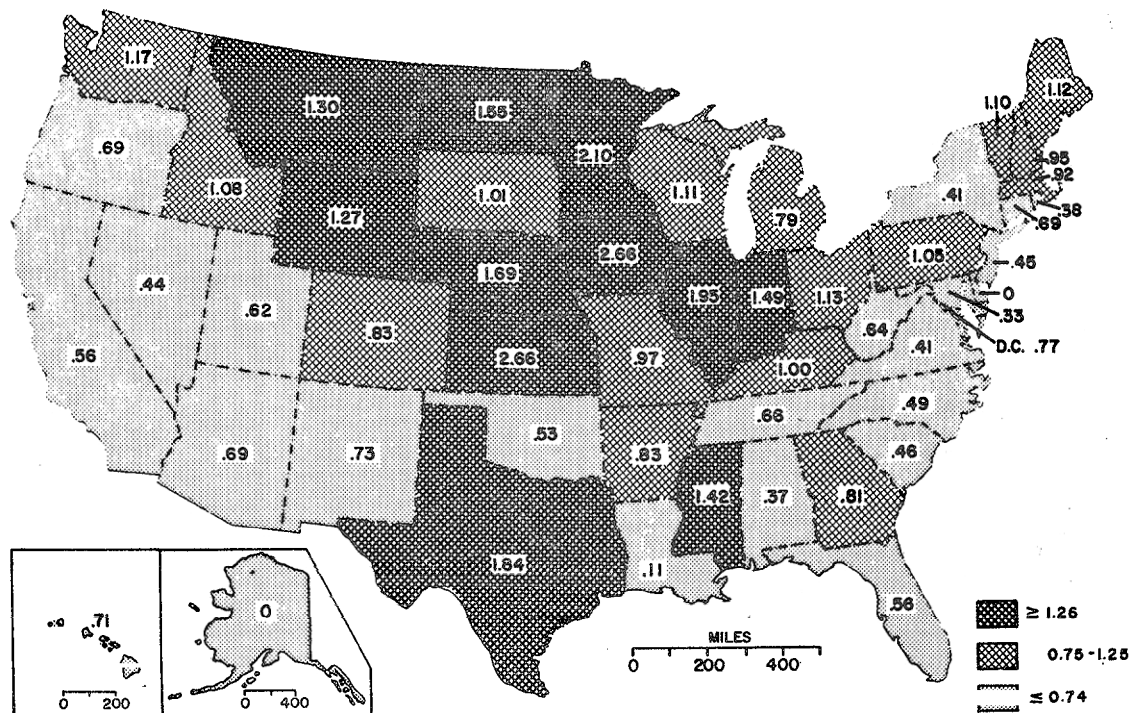

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN HIGH SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY - 1971 - 72



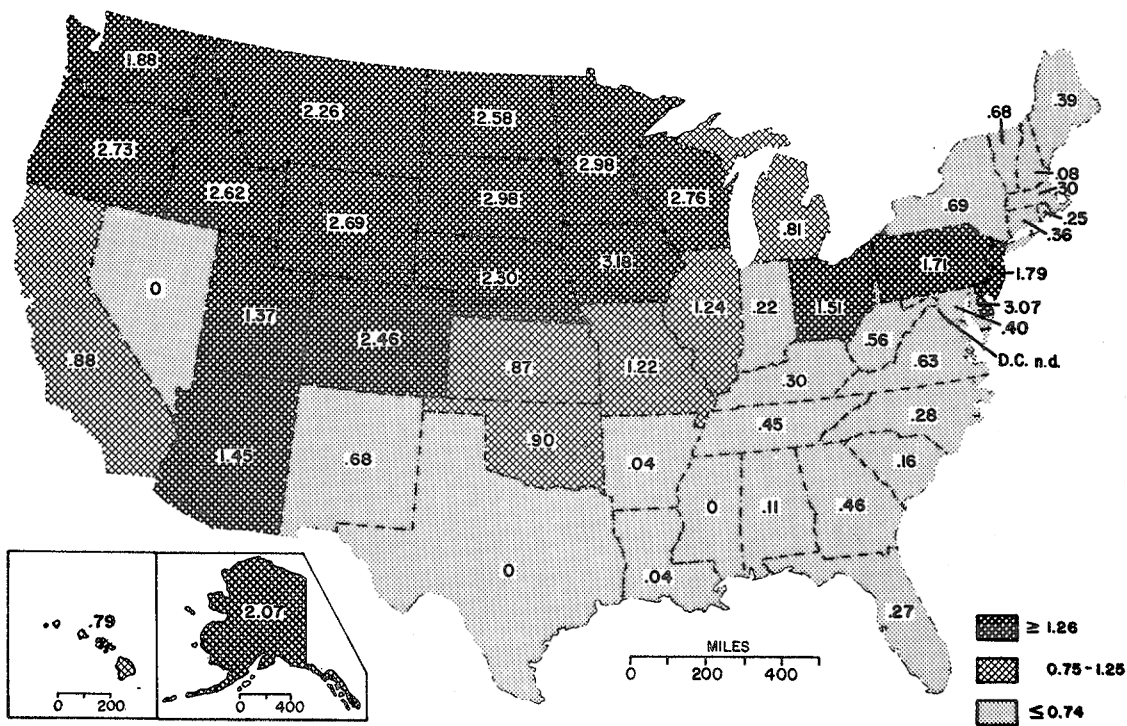

PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION IN HIGH SCHOOL GOLF 1971 - 72



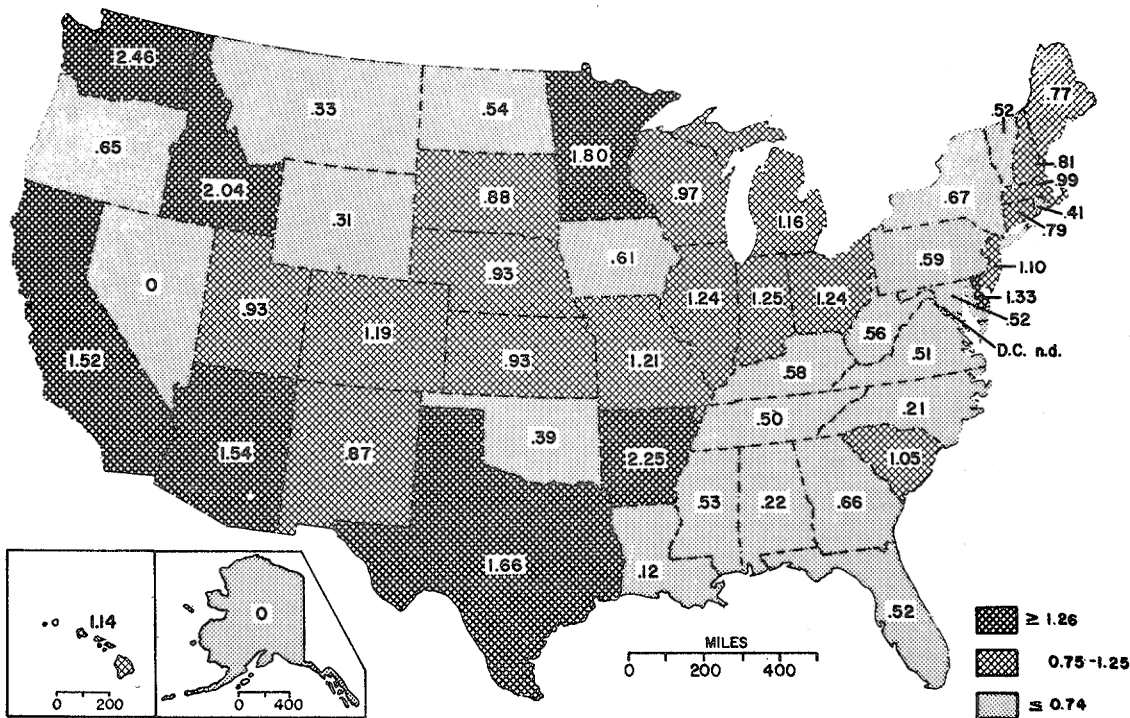

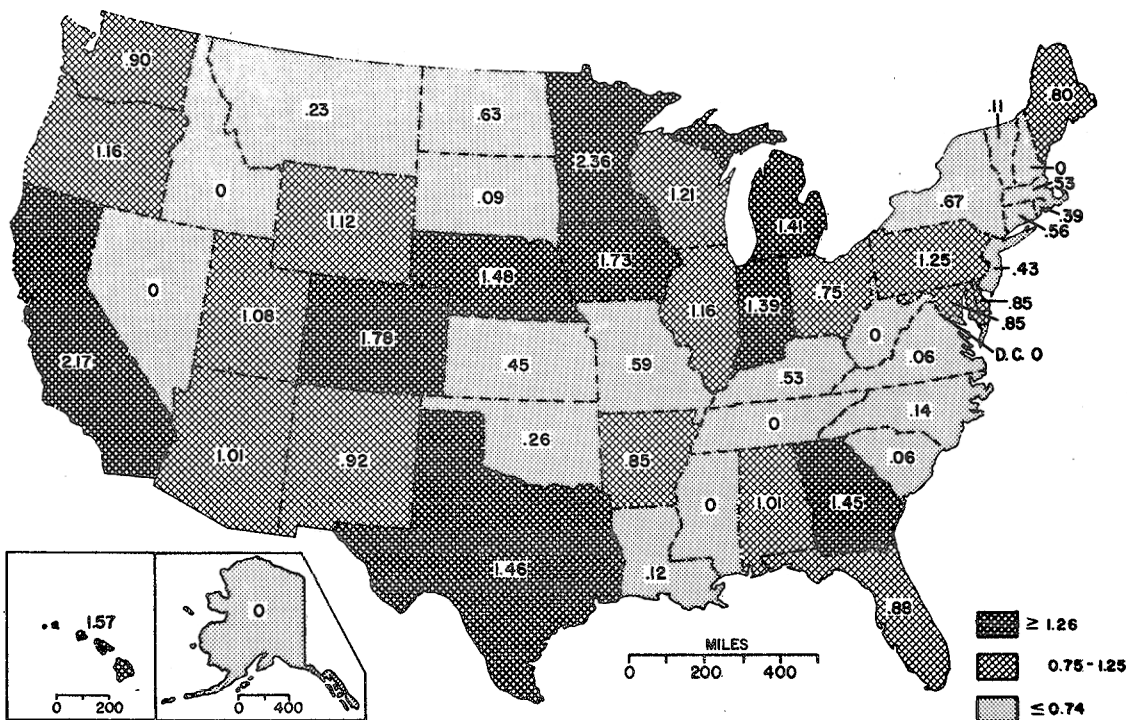

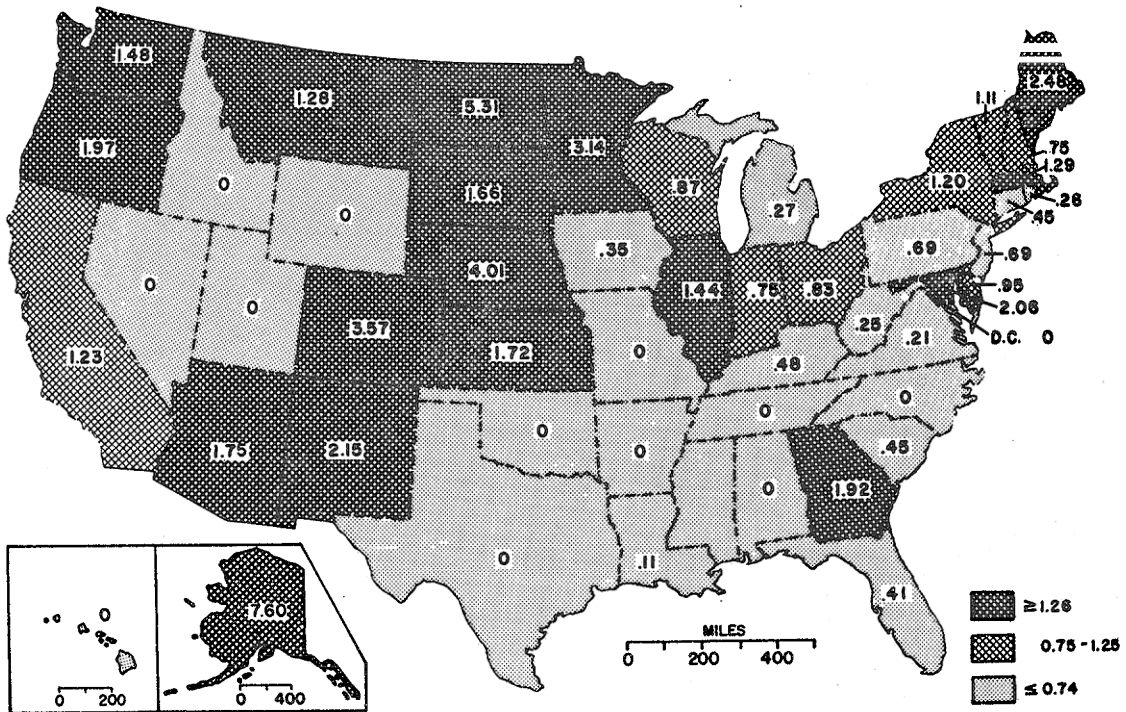

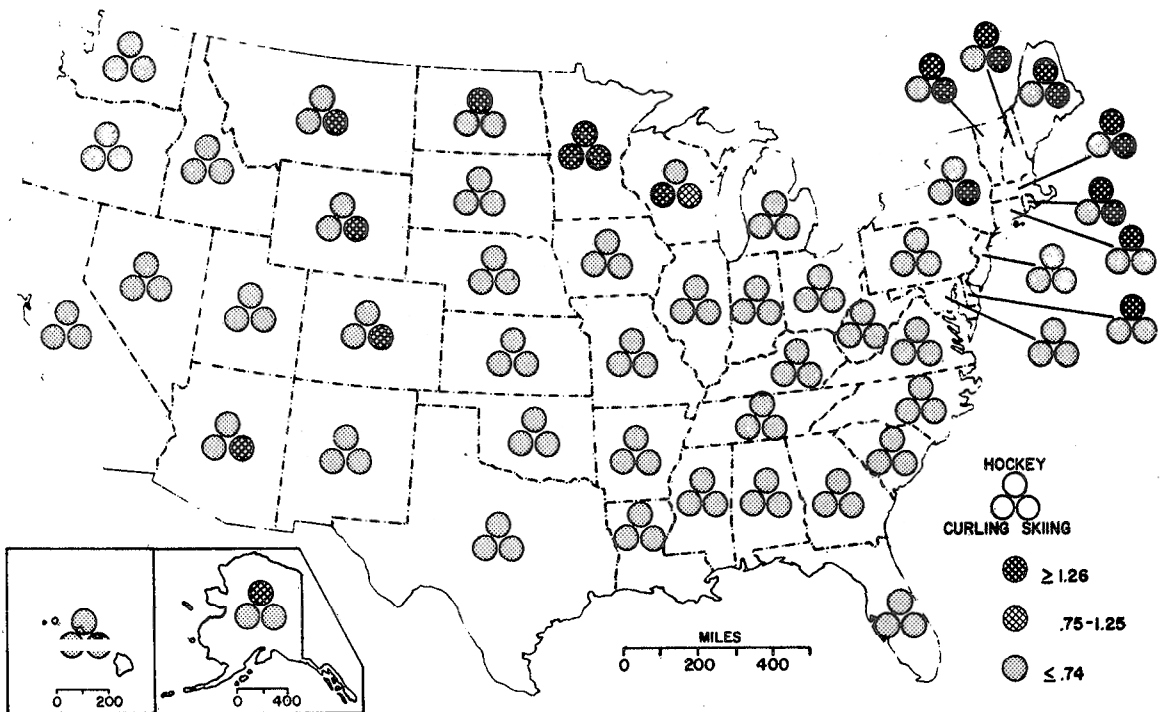

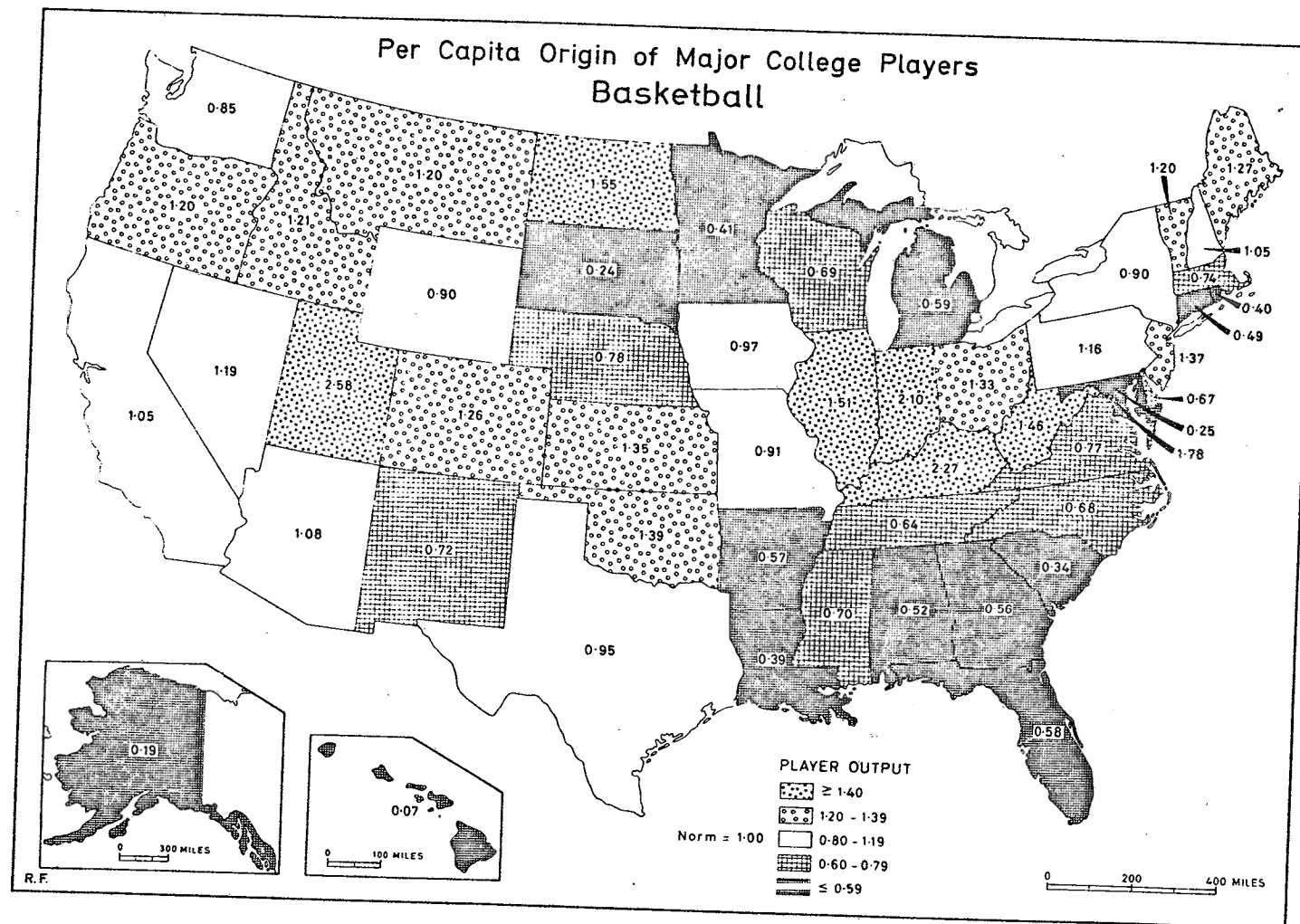

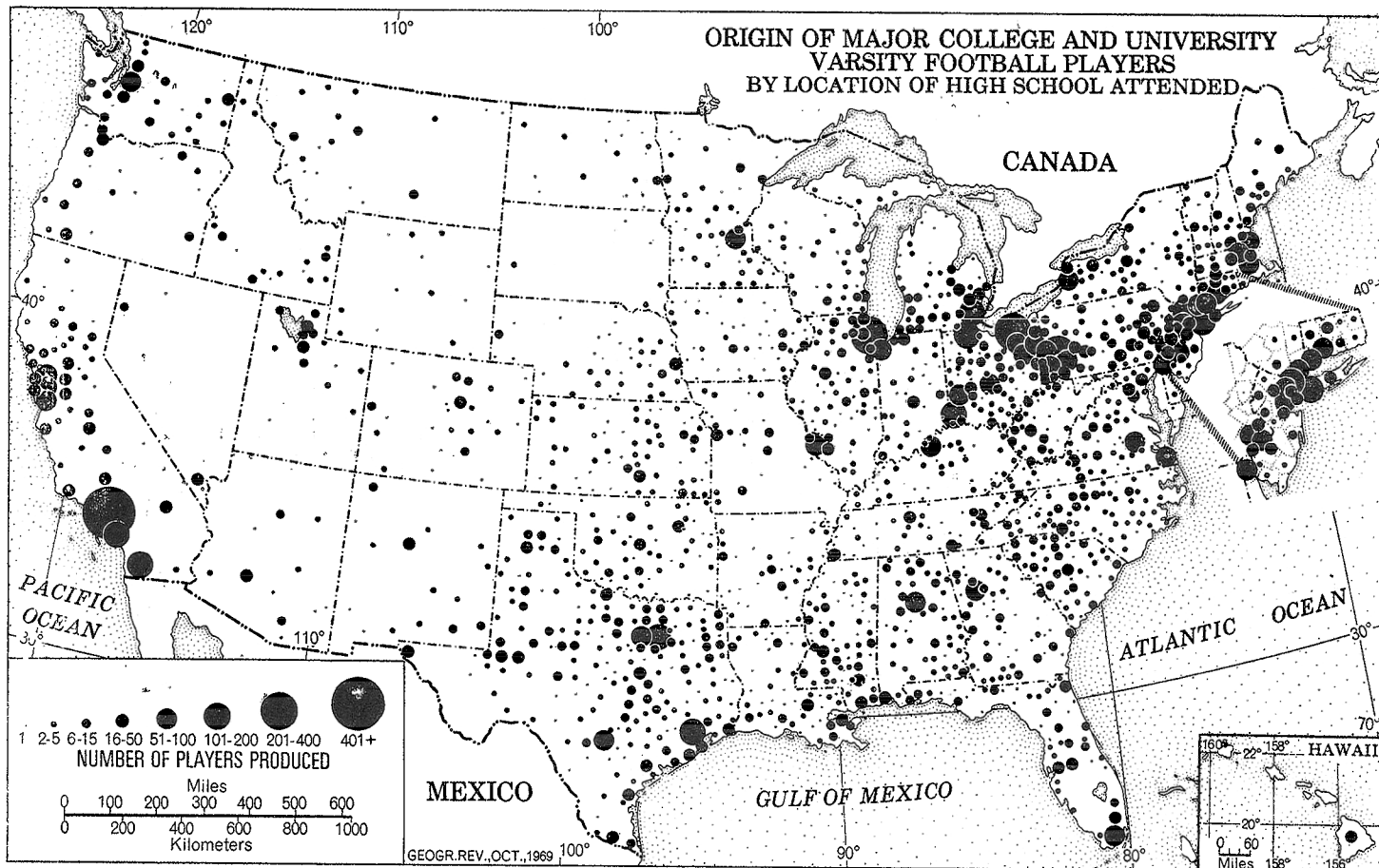

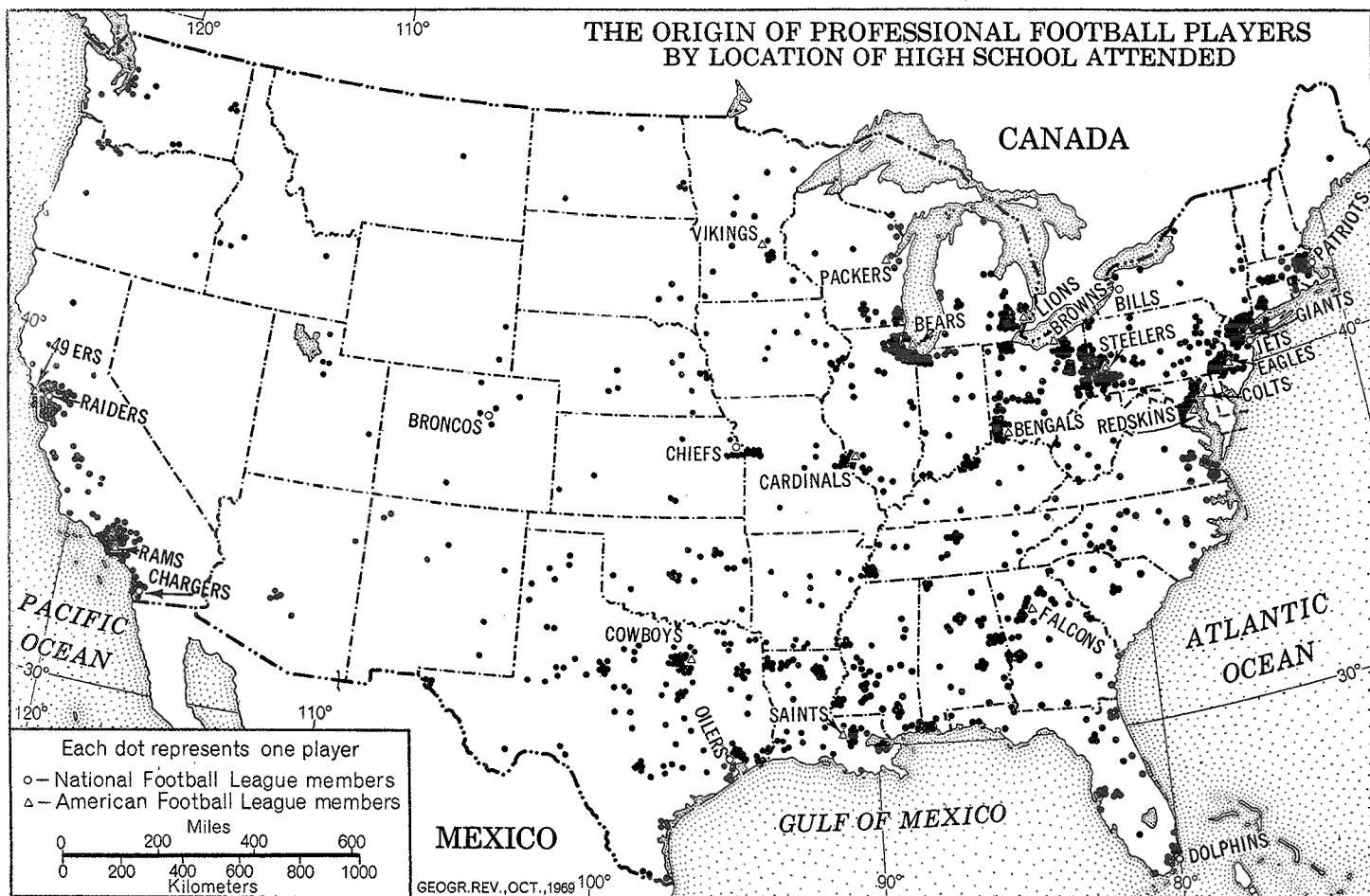

1871 - 1958

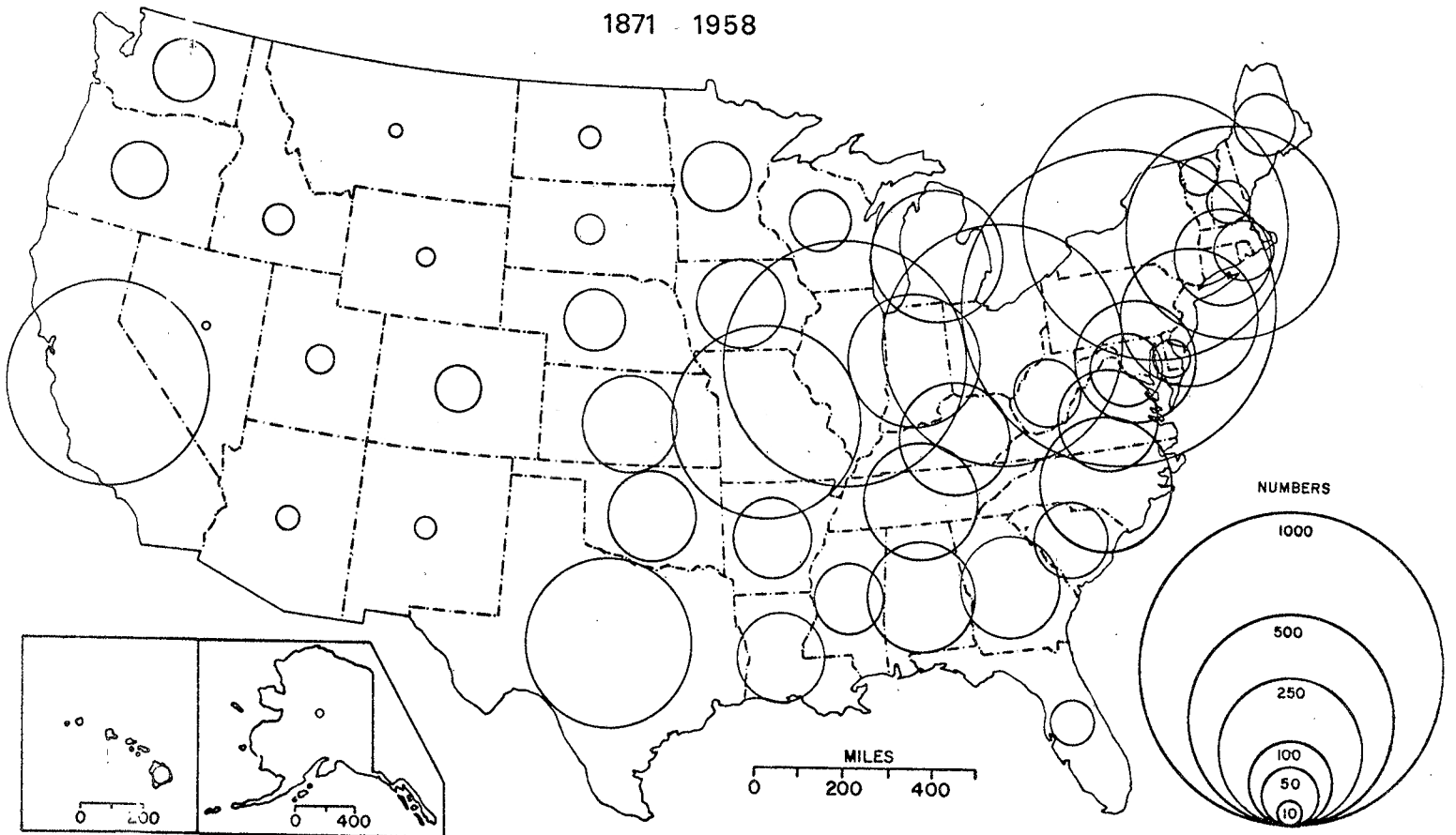


Fig. 8.3 The Northeast and the Midwest have produced the most major leaguers over the long run, but in recent years the climatic advantages of California and the South have come to the fore.

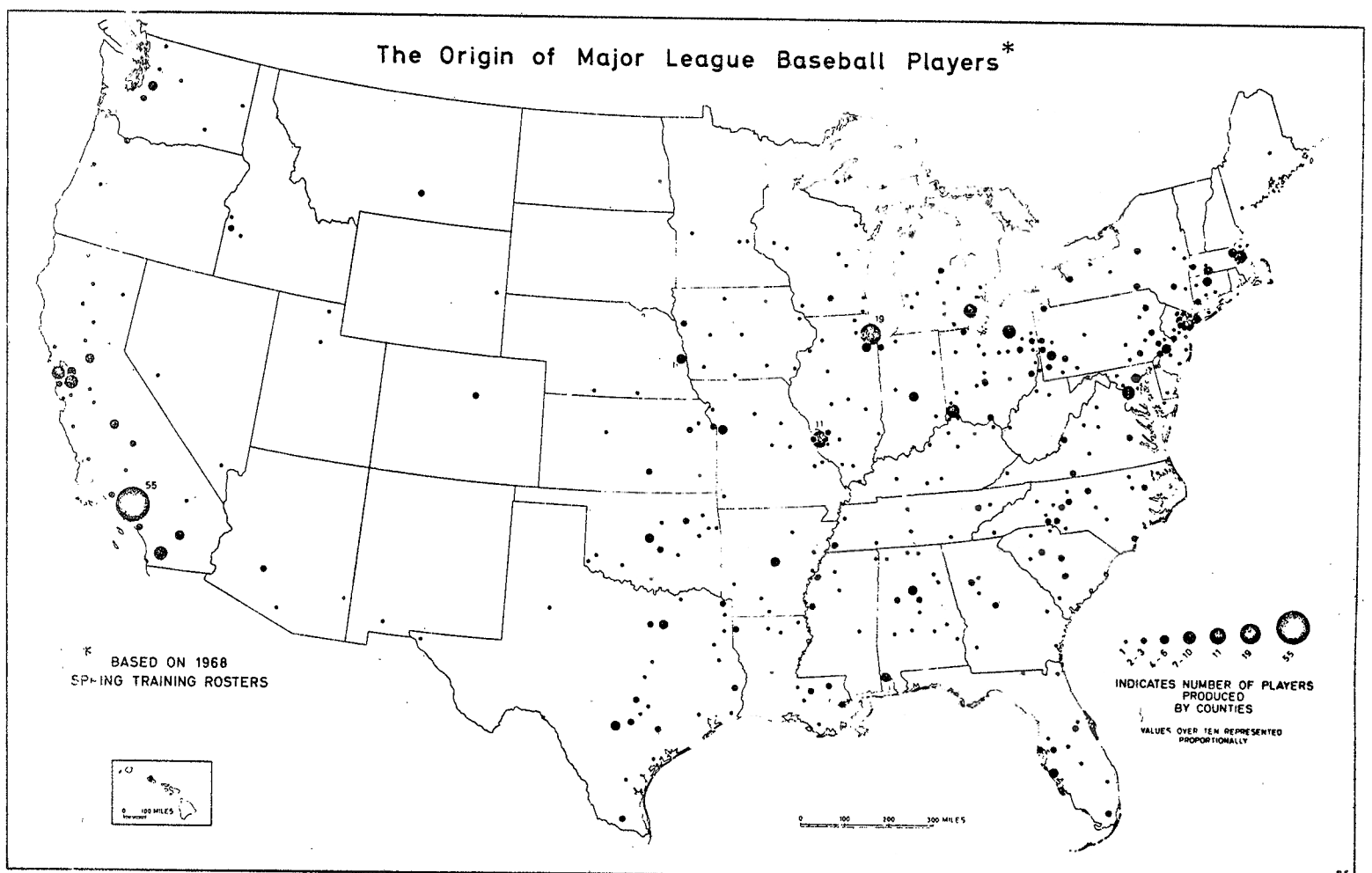

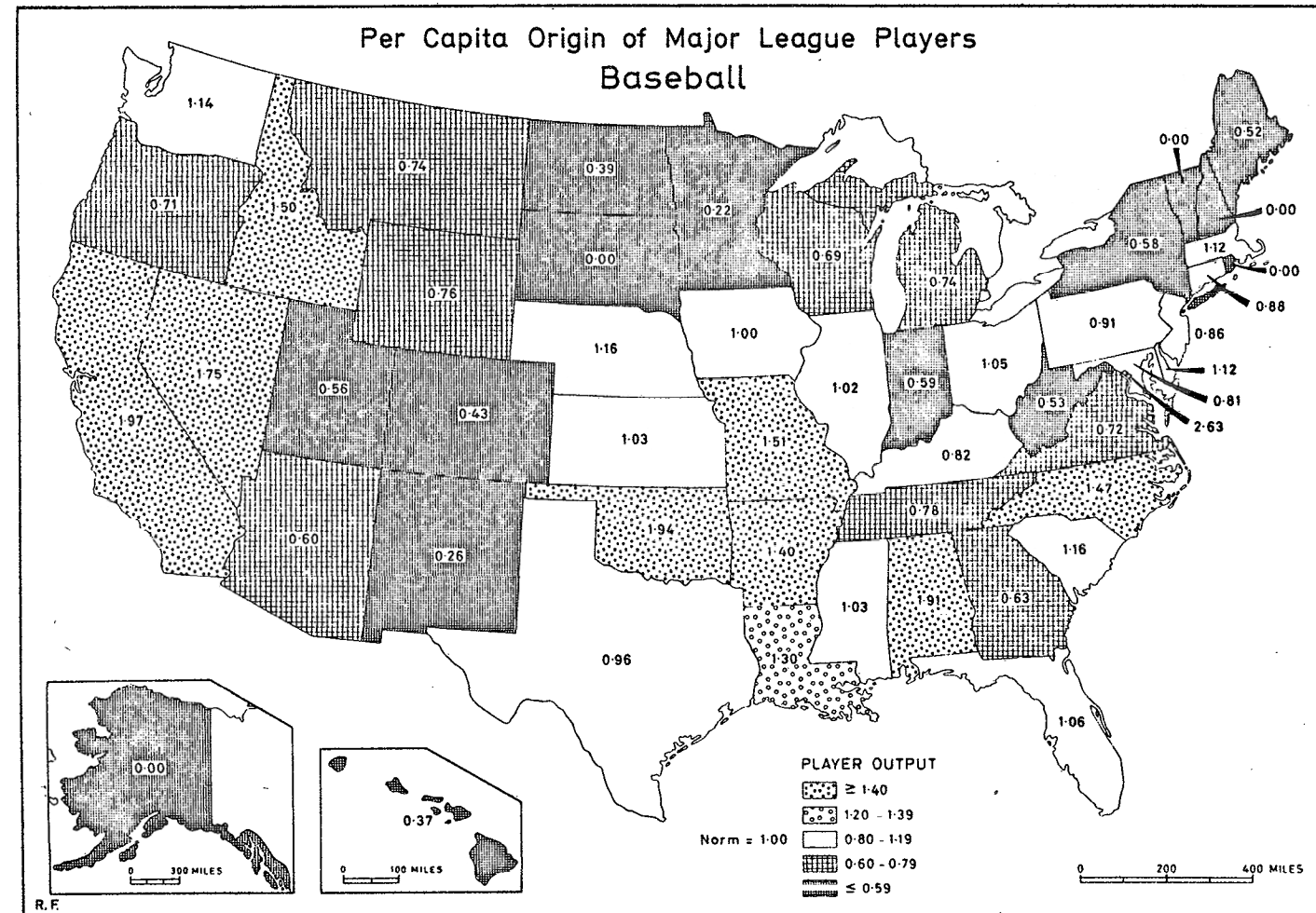
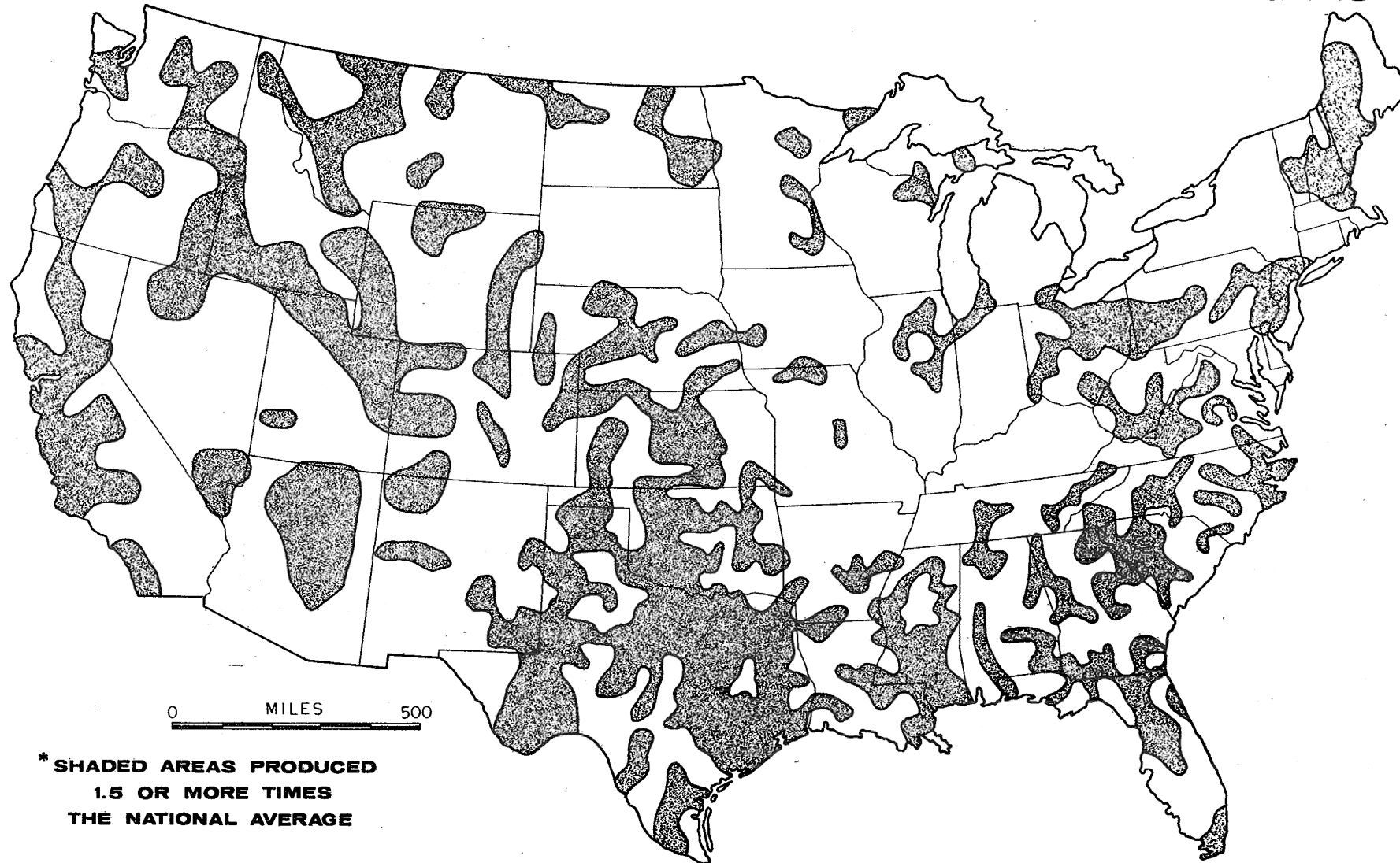

THE LOCATION OF COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL STRENGTH - 1889 - 1930

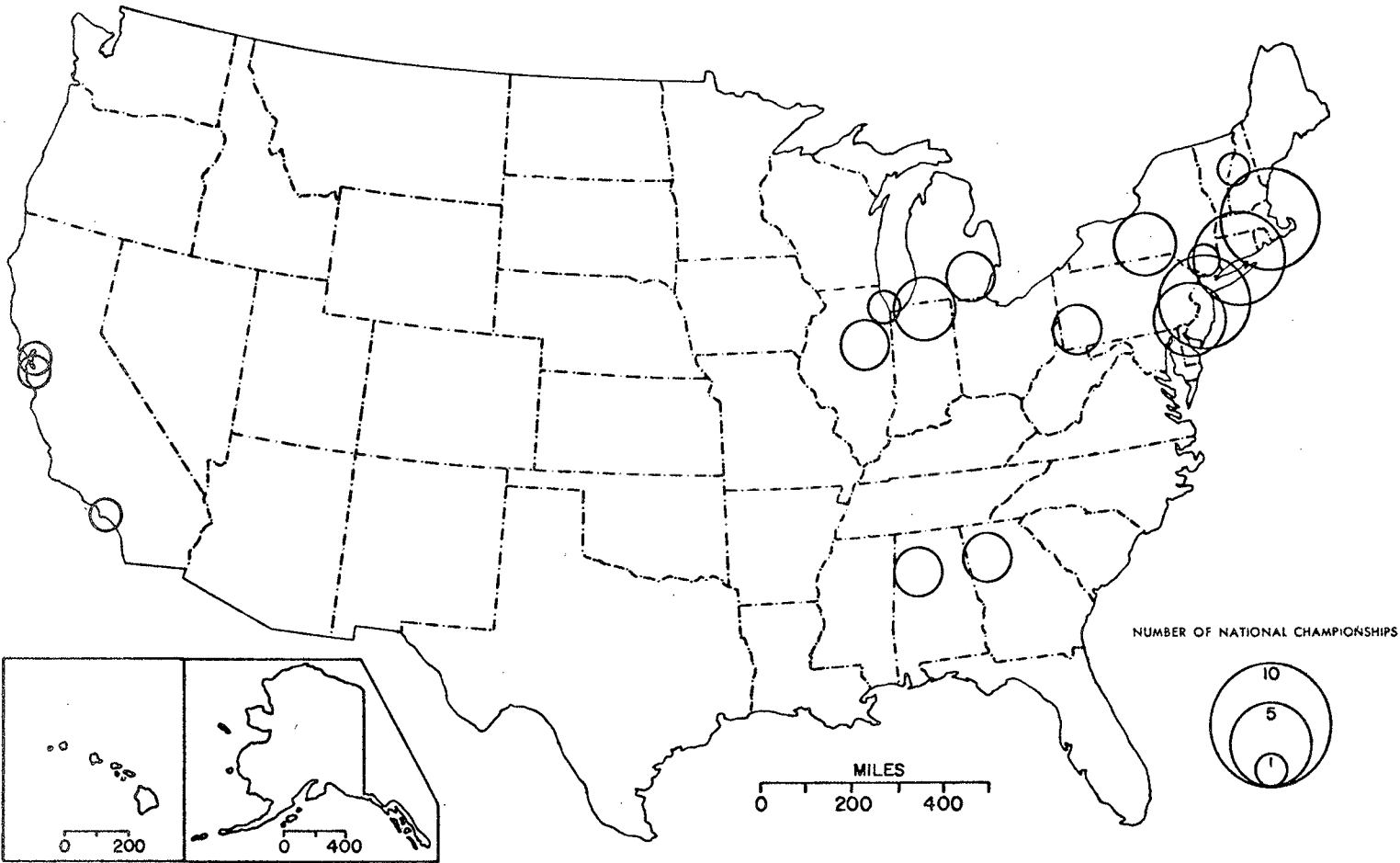

1931 - 45

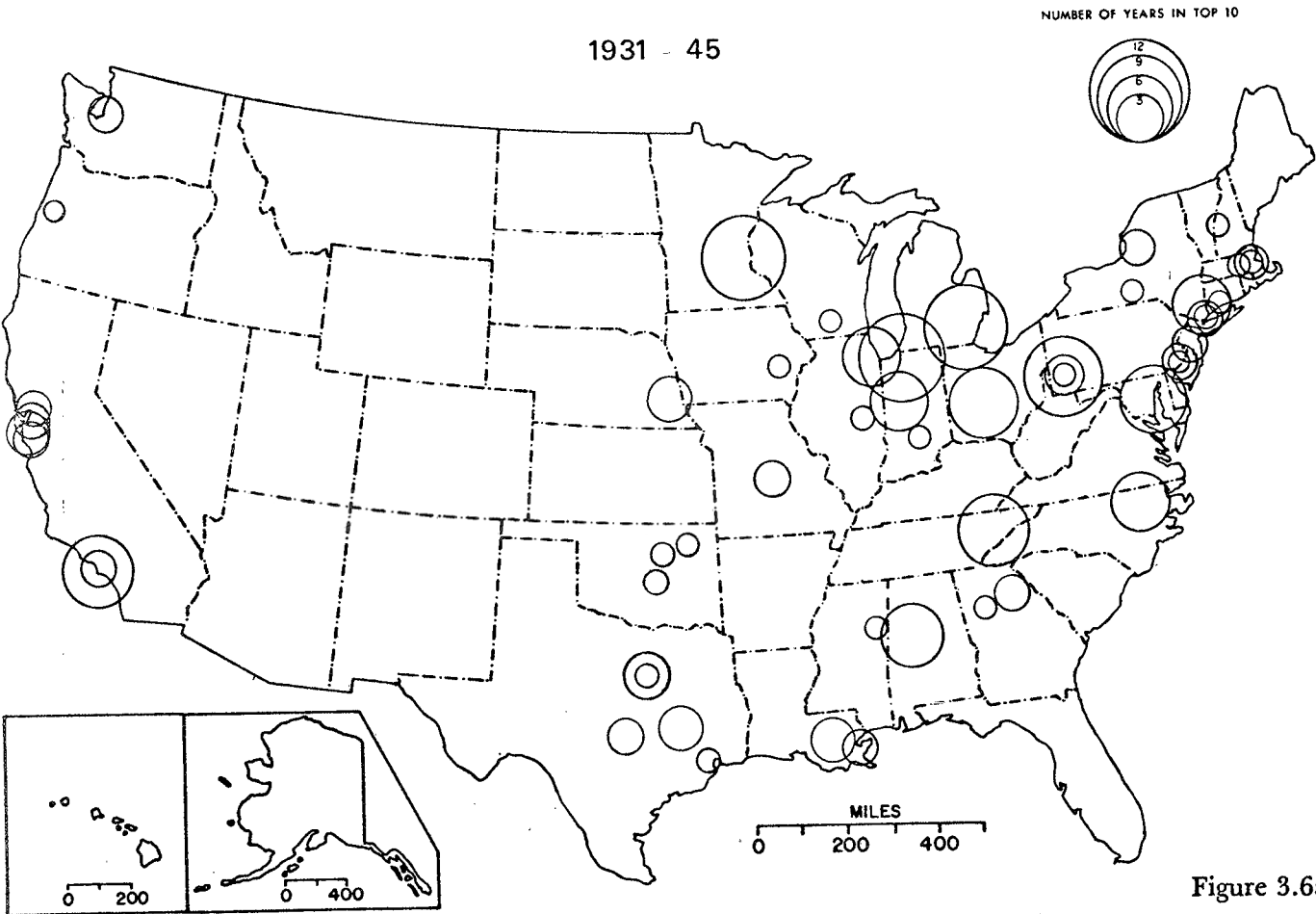
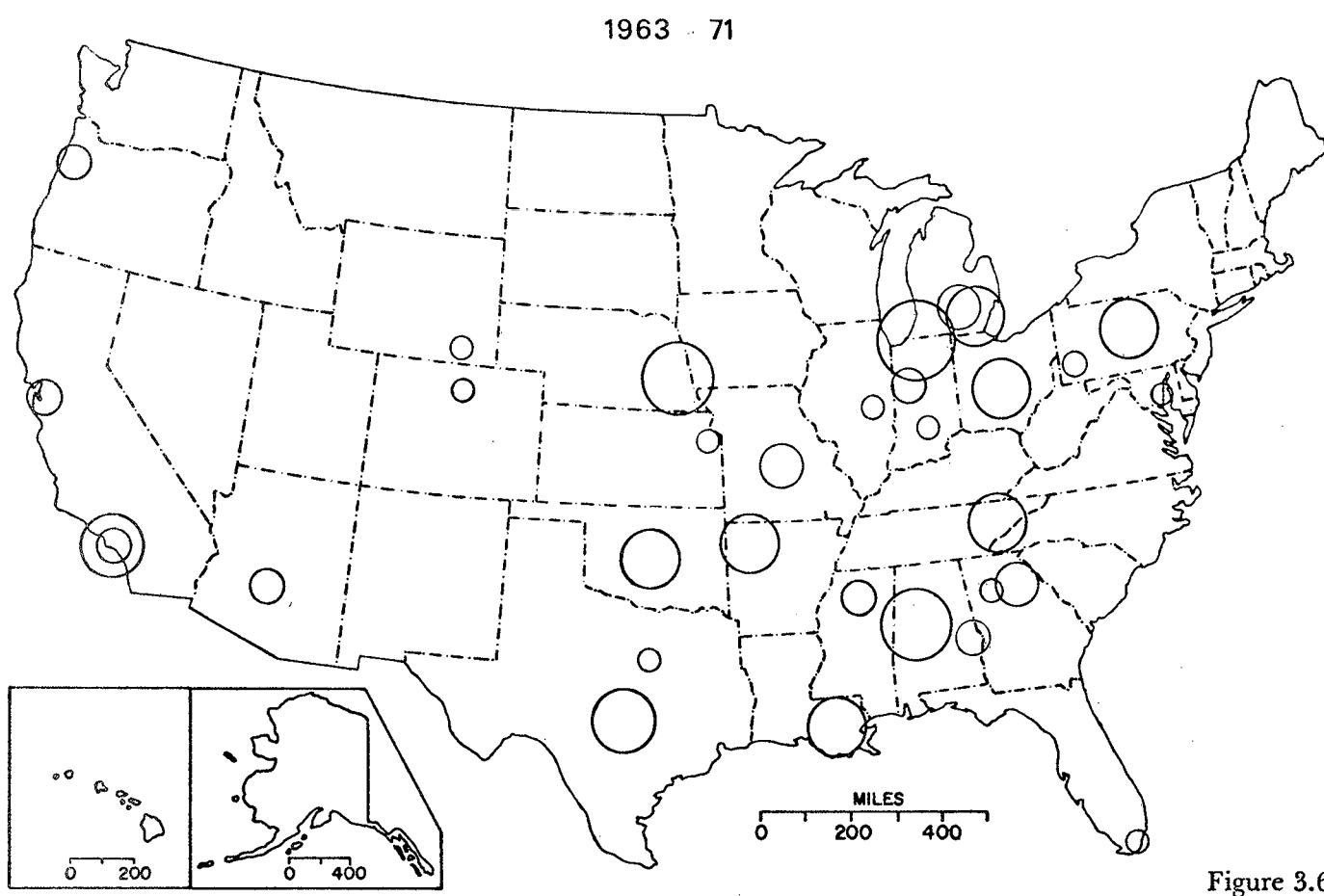
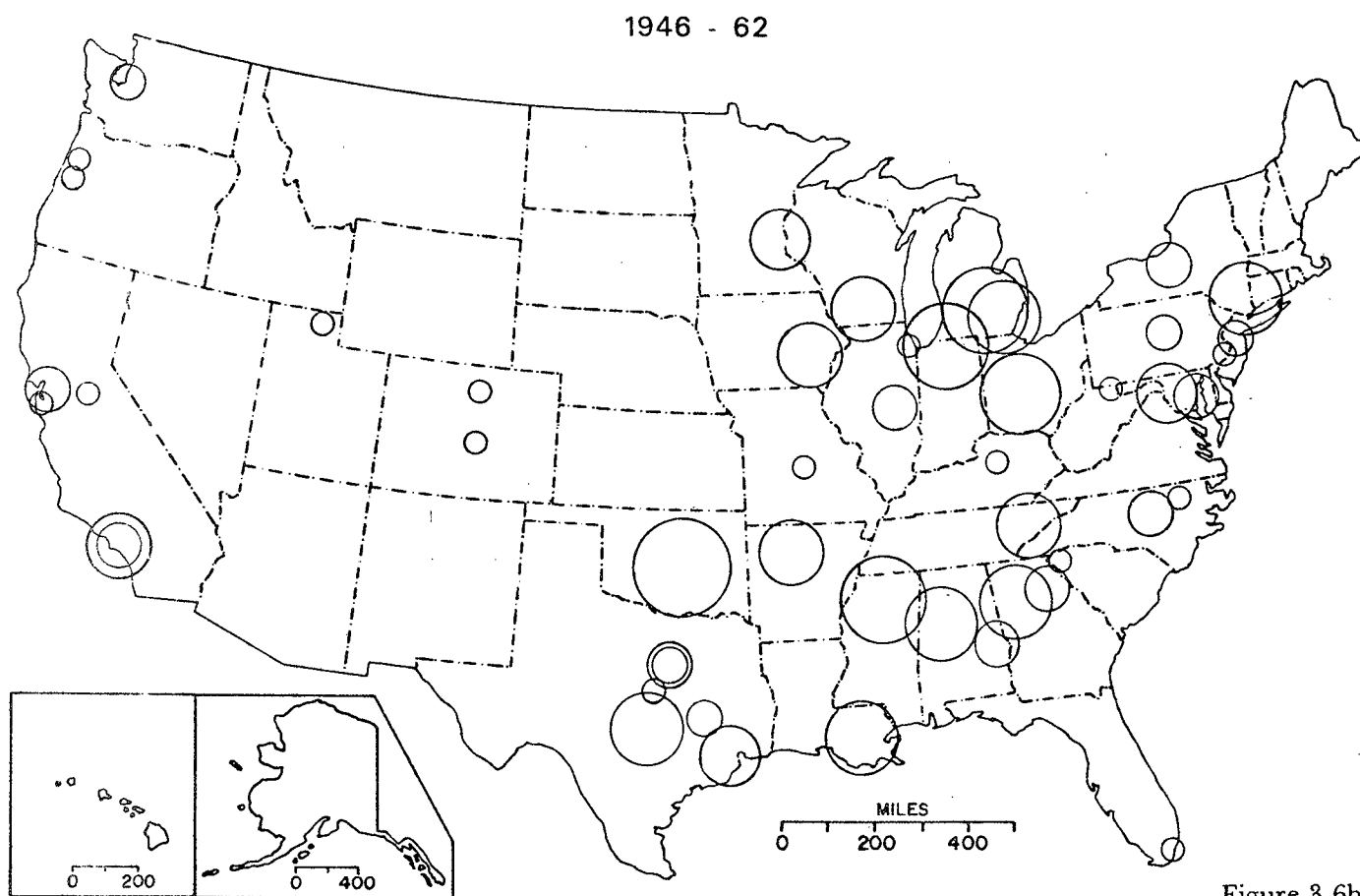

1871 - 1880

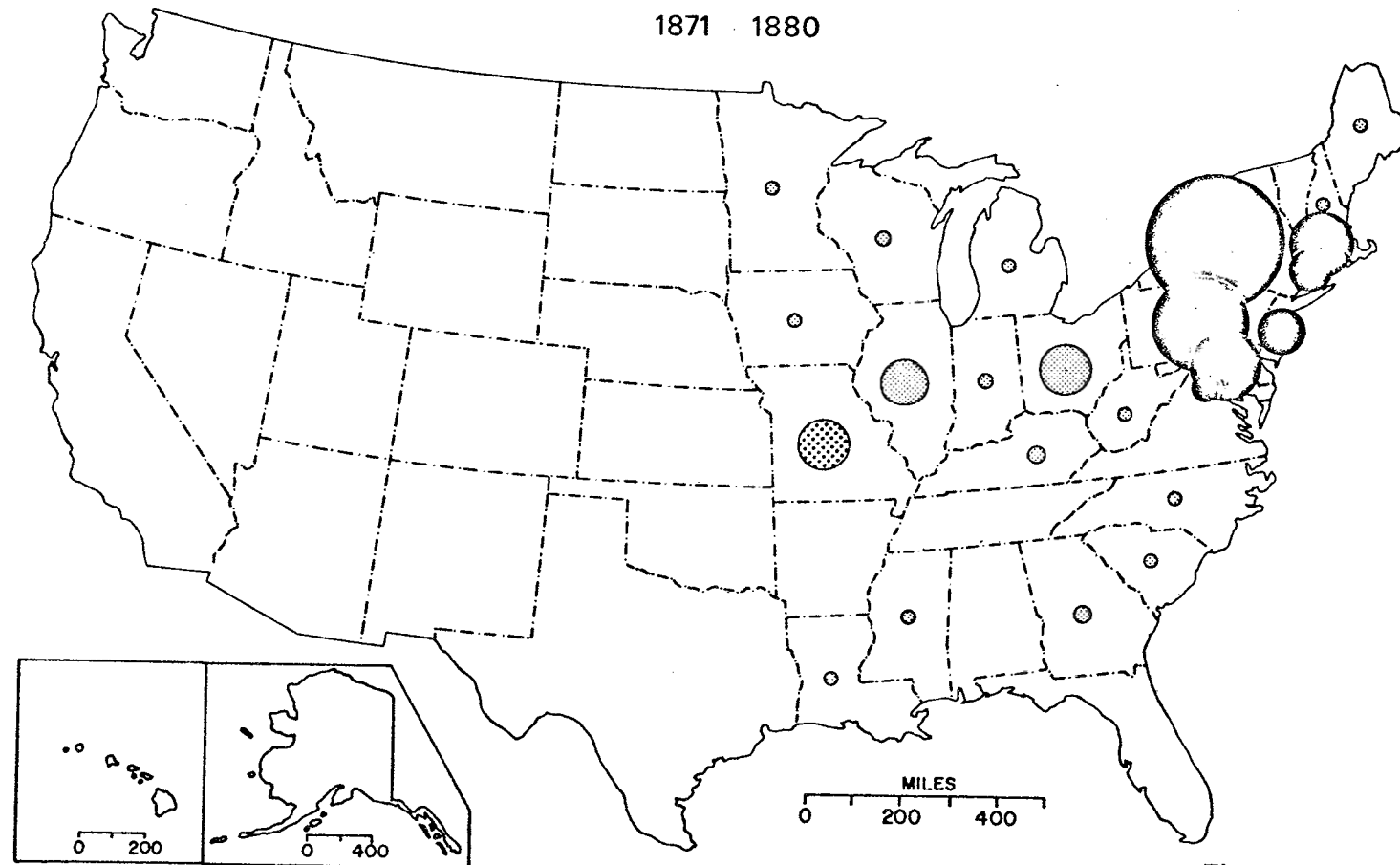

MAJOR LEAGUE CITIES: BASEBALL, BASKETBALL AND FOOTBALL

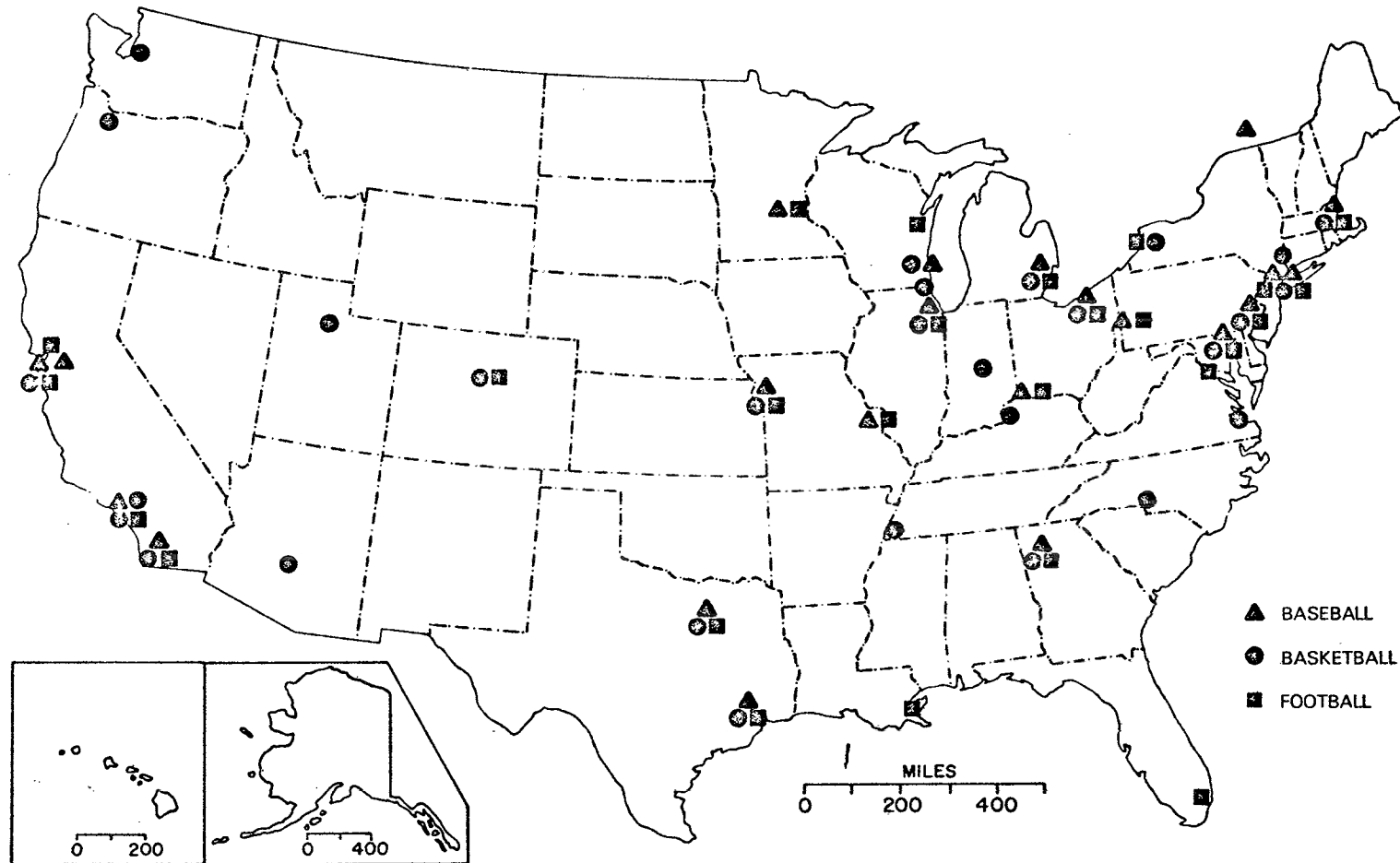


Fig. 4.13 The location of the Big League franchises during the 1973 season.

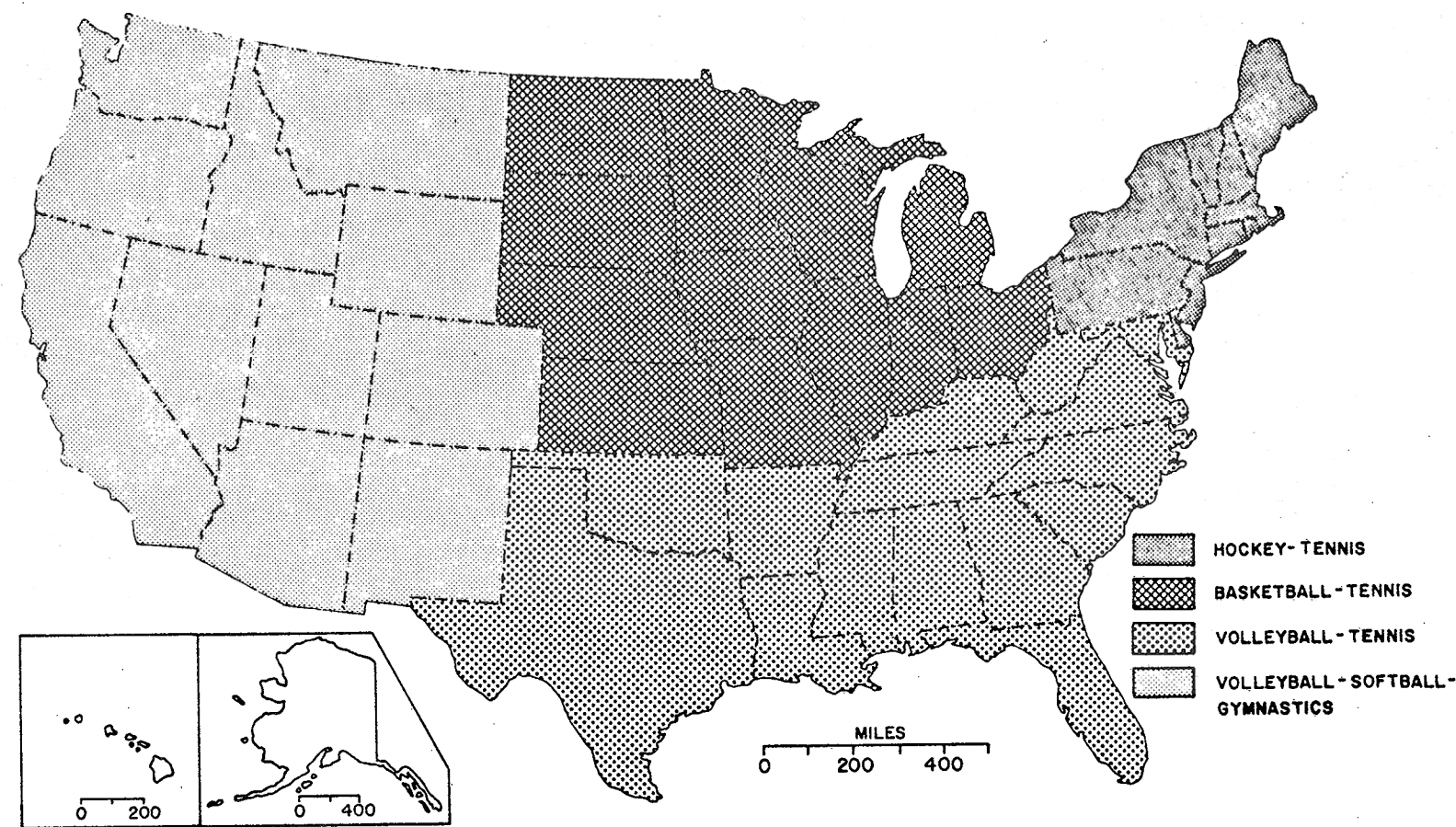
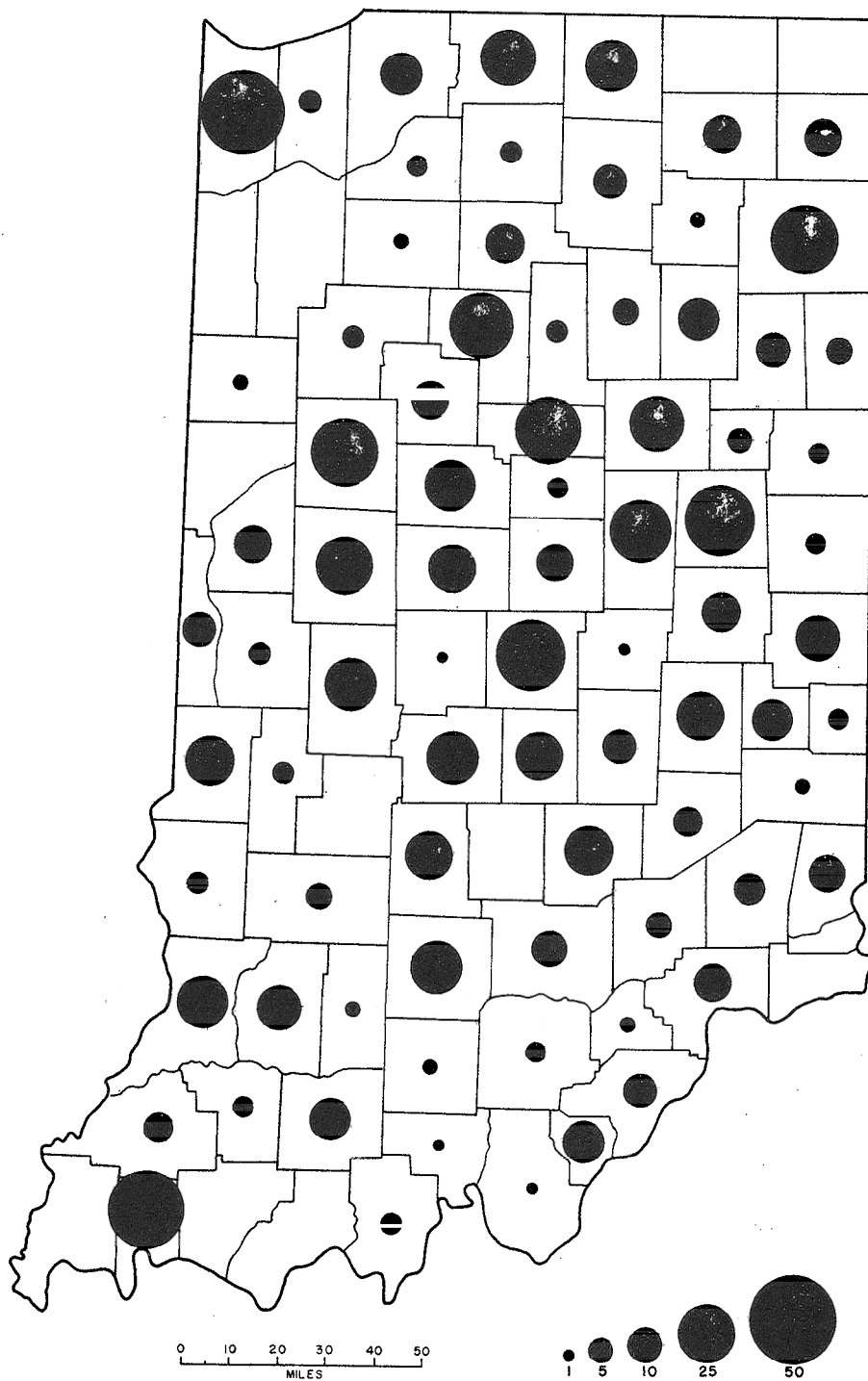

APPEARANCES IN INDIANA SWEET SIXTEEN HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

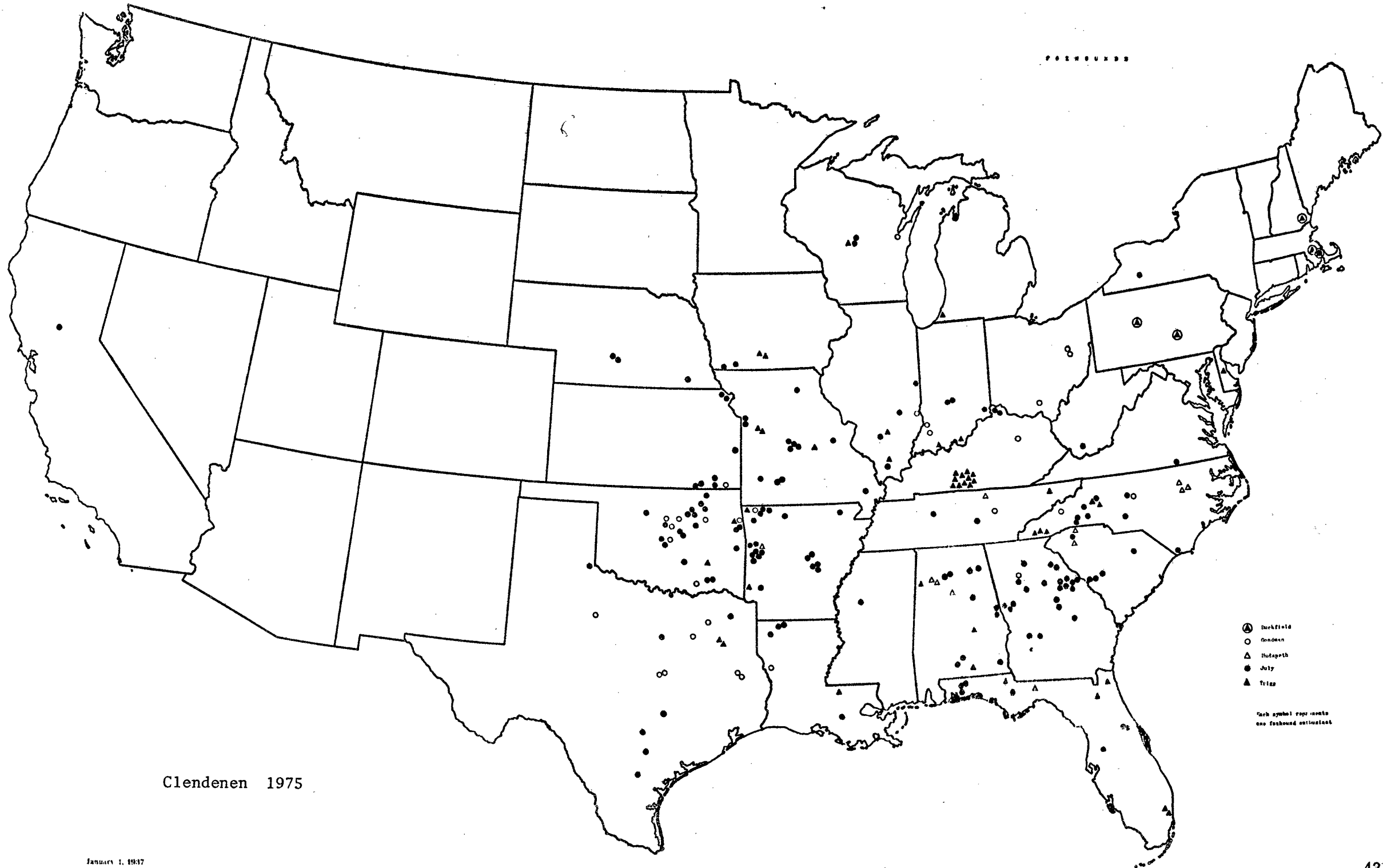

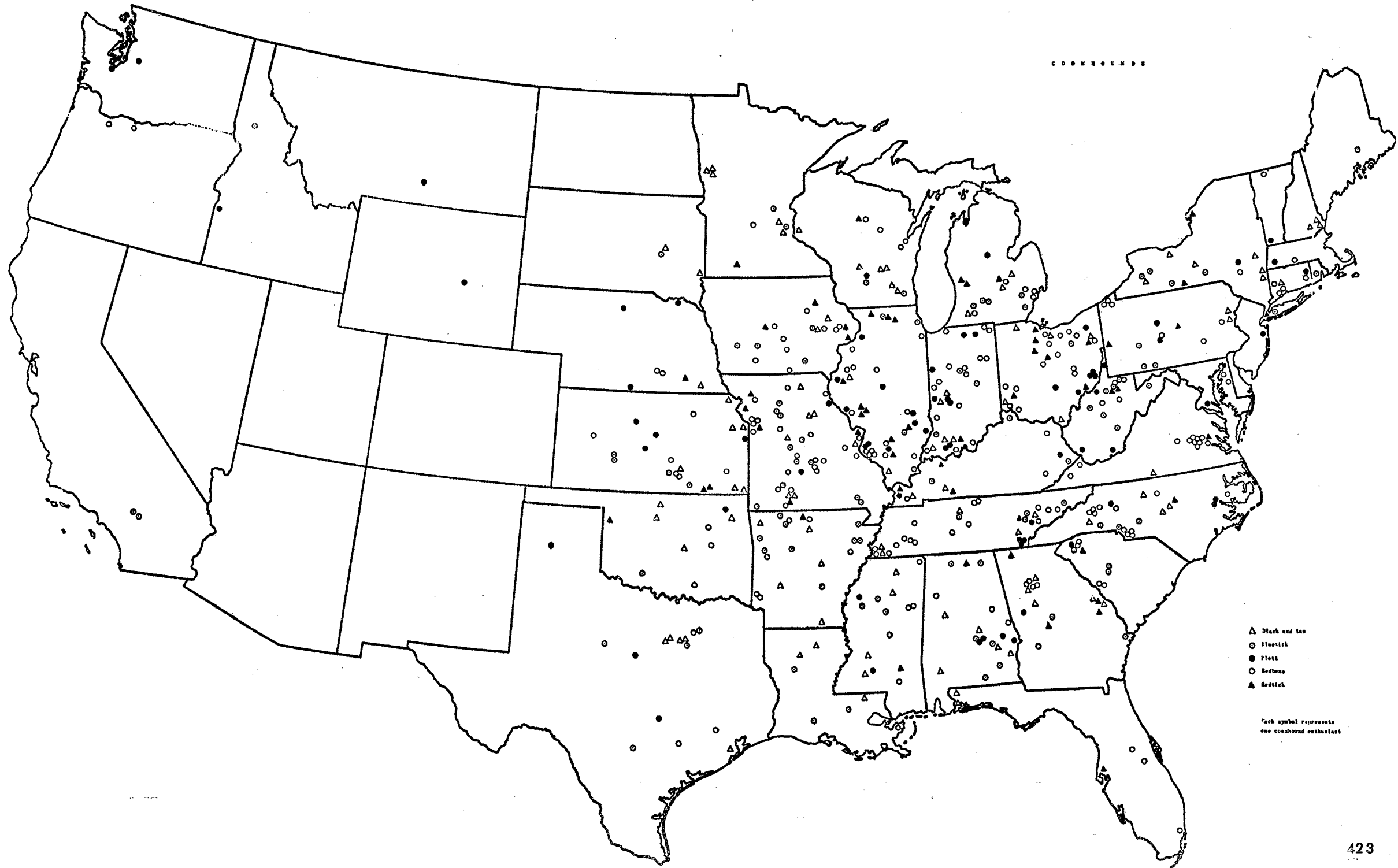

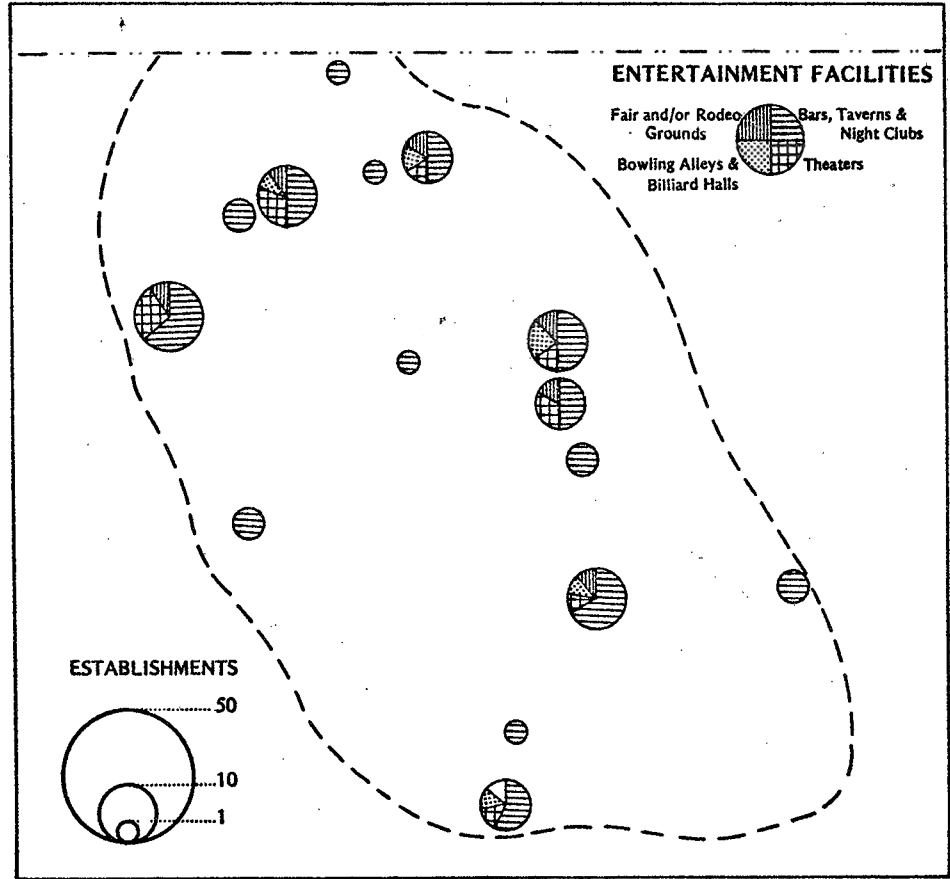
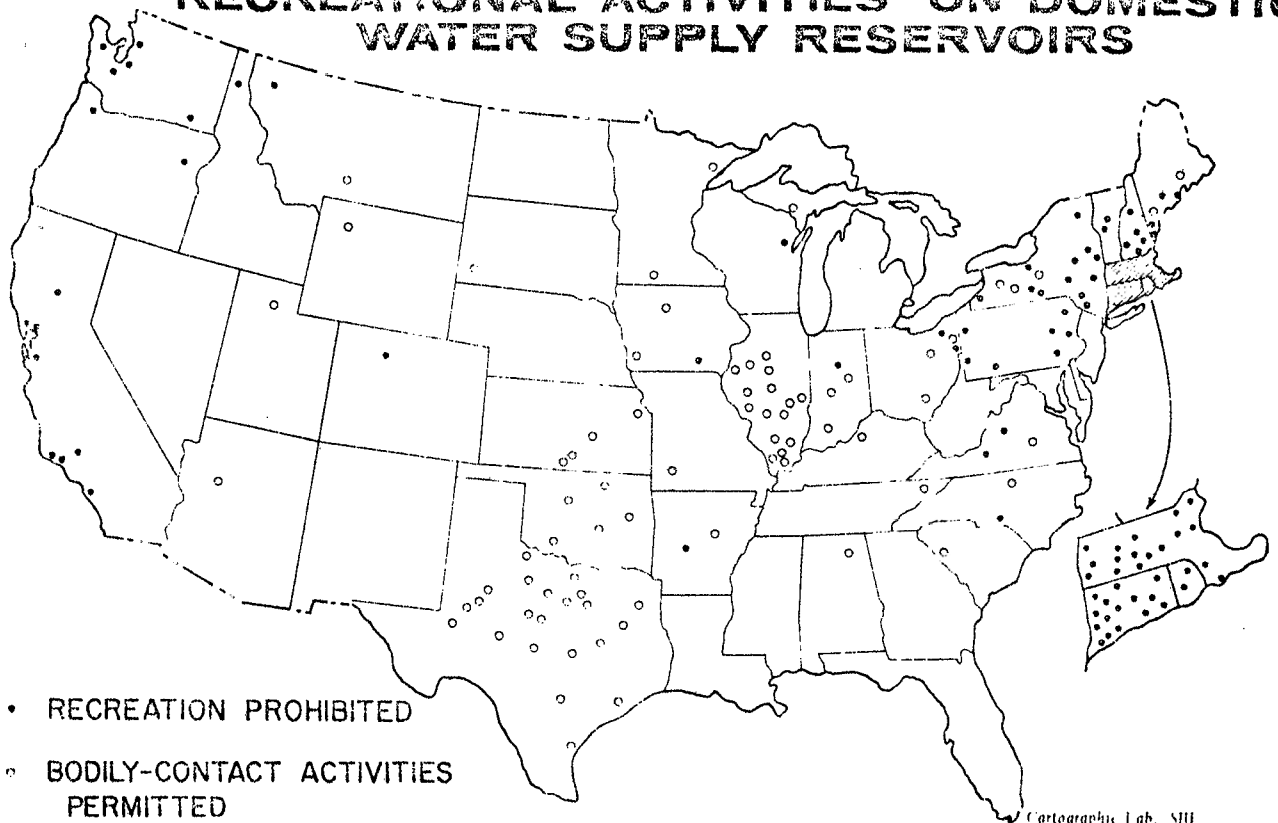


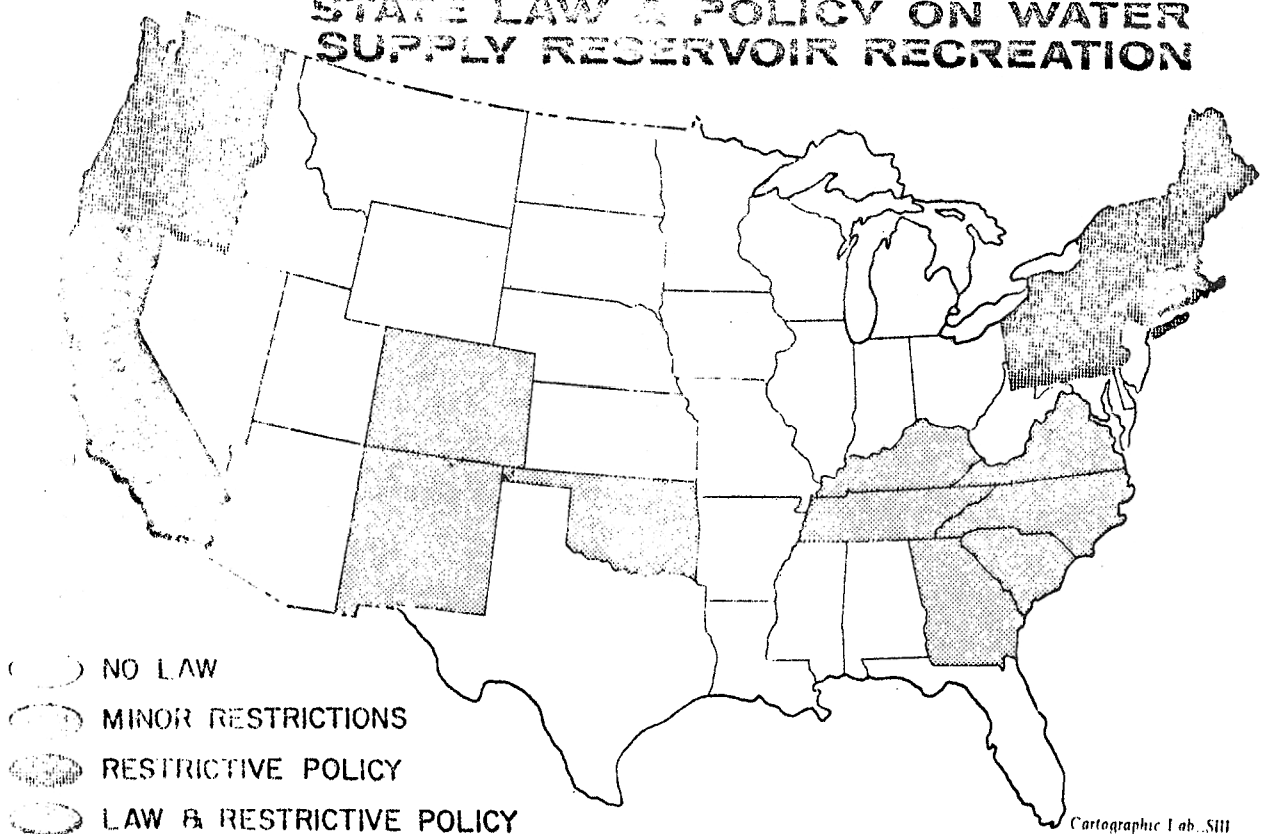
Figure 7. Entertainment Facilities, Big Horn Basin, Wyoming.
